Austin — Texas vehicle owners will have a long wait to get their cars and trucks inspected if they don't hurry up, Homer Garrison, Jr., director of the Department of Public Safety, said Saturday.

Garrison said that while 60 per cent of the allotted inspection period has elapsed, only 20 per cent of the vehicles have been inspected.

The deadline is April 15. "Some 5,000 official inspection stations over the state are waiting to inspect 4 million vehicles," Garrison said.
