**PUBLIC NOTICE** Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER SIX ON THE BALLOT


Section 1. That Section 33, Article XVI, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 33. The Accounting Officers of this State shall neither draw nor pay a warrant upon the Treasury in favor of any person for salary or compensation as agent, officer or appointee, who holds at the same time any other office or appointer, who holds at the same time any other officer or position of honor, trust, or profit, under this State, except as prescribed in this Constitution. 
