(wheel move) irrigation systems. The overhead sprinkler irrigation system must contain safety valves or other devices to prevent back-siphoning of product into water. not to exceed eight (8) fluid ounces per acre per application. It may be applied no more than two time during the growing season.
Botran may be applied to control sclerotinia blight in peanuts. Applications will be made at the rate of 2 to 4 lbs . of product per acre. A maximum of 2 applications are
authorized. Applications may not be made within 30 days of harvest. made within 30 days of harve
