Pecan Tree Spraying Time Is Now Upon Us pre E Extensioron Agent Demartand Count Extension Agent DeMarquis Gorand hommeorciarers wecan producers should begin checking tres closely
for the insect egg deposits and nutlet damage by newly emerged larvae and begin a spray program if necessary.
Pecan nut Pecan nut casebearers are the
small worms thet ent small worms that eat into the smal
pecans, destroying entire clusters pecare they get started. If uncontrolled, they can destroy the entire crop.
Adult moths of the casebearers Adult moths of the casebearers
deposit eggs on the tips of the sell deposit eggs on the tips of the smal
pecans. The white eggs are not much pecans. hew wite egss
larger than a pin point, says Gordon. Just before hatching the eggs turn pink or light red. After hatching the small worms feed on buds for two or three days before eating its way into
the pecan. Growers should spray five days
after observing the firrst eggs or when 1 or 2 percent entries are found in the pecans. The agent says that

trol depends on proper timing and trol depends on perper
application of insecticides. The proper timing may vary

time temperatures experienced during the last three weeks have
delayed egg laying by the moths. Early maturing varieties may need
spraying a few days cartier than the spraying a few days earlier than the
latematuring pecans.
