MINES OF CANANEA CO.,

WILL BE CLOSED DEC. 15

Bisbee, Ariz., Nov. 28—The mines and smelters of the Cananea Consolidated Copper company at Cananea, Sonora, Mexico, forty miles south of here, will be closed down December 15, according to notice posted at the company's office in Cananea today. The Cananea Consolidated is the largest American owned copper company at poperating in Sonora and employs at present approximately 1000 men, the majority of them Mexicans.

Demands made by labor which the empany has decided cannot be met without heavy loss; heavy tax imposed by the Mexican government and the present dullness of the copper market wr rported tonight as diret causes of the closing down of operations.

Mexican employes, according to reports from Cananea, are preparing to protest to Adolfe de la Hureta, provisional president of Mexico, in an effort to have the company resume operations.

A notification was issued to the effect that the trustees realized that \$1,500 a year "would no longer meet all expenses, and that even with economy, scholars must be prepard to supplement the scholarship allowances from private sources, pos-sibly to the extent of \$250 a year." The scholarship allowance of \$4,500

is not an eleemosynary grant but is in-tended as a reward fo rmerit, and is participated in by wealthy students as well as by those of limited means. The average number of Rhodes scholars in residence at Oxford at any time is 186. Any substantial increase in the amount of the annual grants would involve a severe drain on the finances at the disposal of the trustees.
