Use Zip Code - Seal Christmas Cards

Lines at the service window will be shorter if Christmas gifts and cards have the proper Zip Code in the mailing address.

Postmaster Baze reminded mailers that postage for a package is determined by the Zip Code number.

If the Code is not in the address, the window clerk must look it up. This obviously slows movement in the parcel post line. Zip Codes on parcels mean far less chance of damage because of more direct routing and fewer handlings, but the success of the program hinges on public use of the Codes, he said. Mail your Christmas cards first class this year since there is no longer any price difference between first class mail and third class mail, except with regard to the weight. The penny difference has been eliminated.

First class mail is 6 cents per ounce, while third class mail is 6 cents for the first two ounces.

"Since most Christmas cards weigh under an ounce, it will usually cost 6 cents whether you send a Christmas card first class or third class unsealed.
