On Dec. 19 his mother received word that he was in the hospital there, but not until he was home did they hear the extent of his wounds, and the horror of the experience which he lived through. Fonville, 20-year old who is married to Paula (Branham) Fonville from Desdemona, joined the service in April of last year. In October he was sent to Vietnam, and he dropped to ground critically injured with an enemy bullet which entered his thigh and surged upward through his chest. 


