WITH FRIENDS KEEPING UP

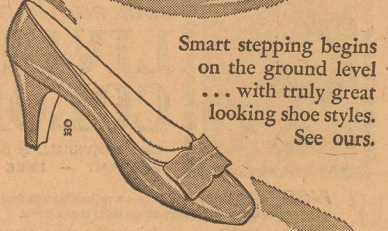
Mr. and Mrs. Charles Brown of Tulsa were weekend visitors with her mother, Mrs. Dorothy Hatcher.


