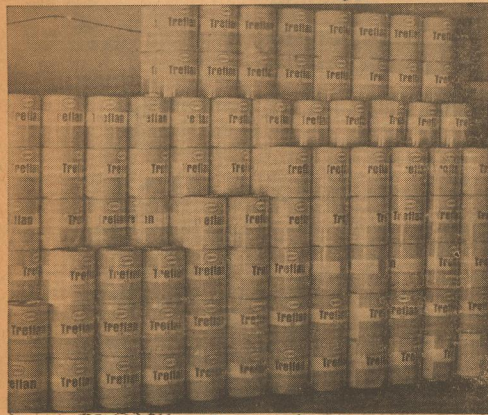
Mrs. Roddy Miles Pink And Blue Shower Honors

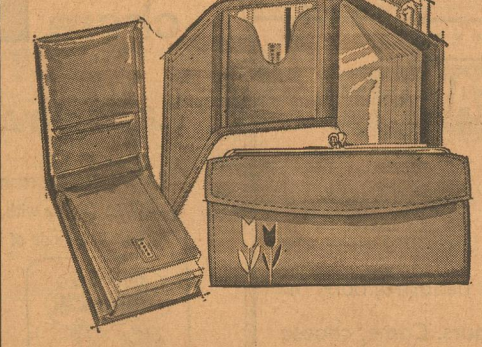
