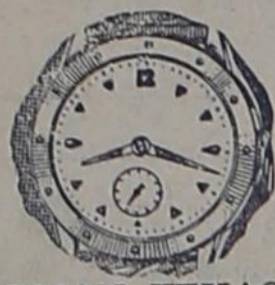

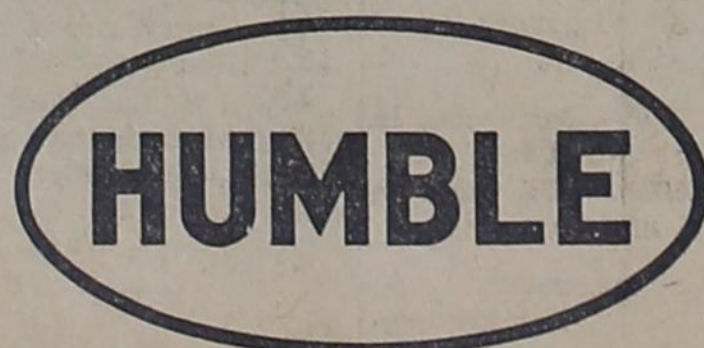

Order For City Officers Election

THE STATE OF TEXAS

I, T. L. Jay, in my capacity as Mayor of the City of Gorman, Texas, do hereby order that an

That said election shall be held in accordance with the Election Code of this state and only resi-

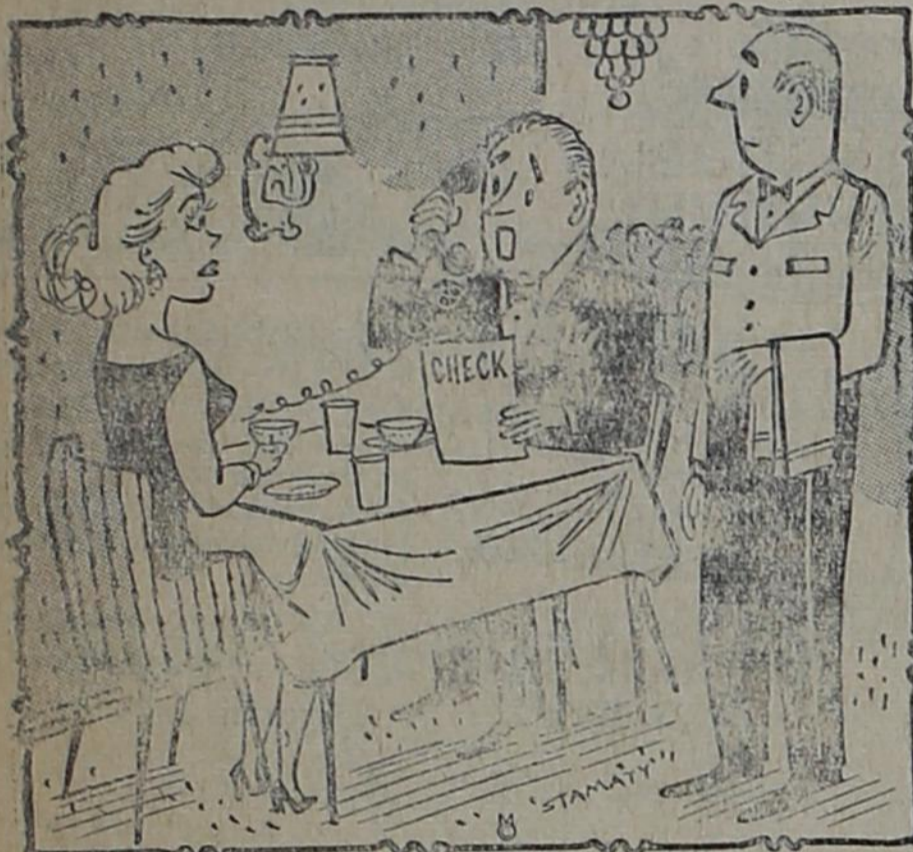
dent qualified voters of said city shall be eligible to vote at said election.

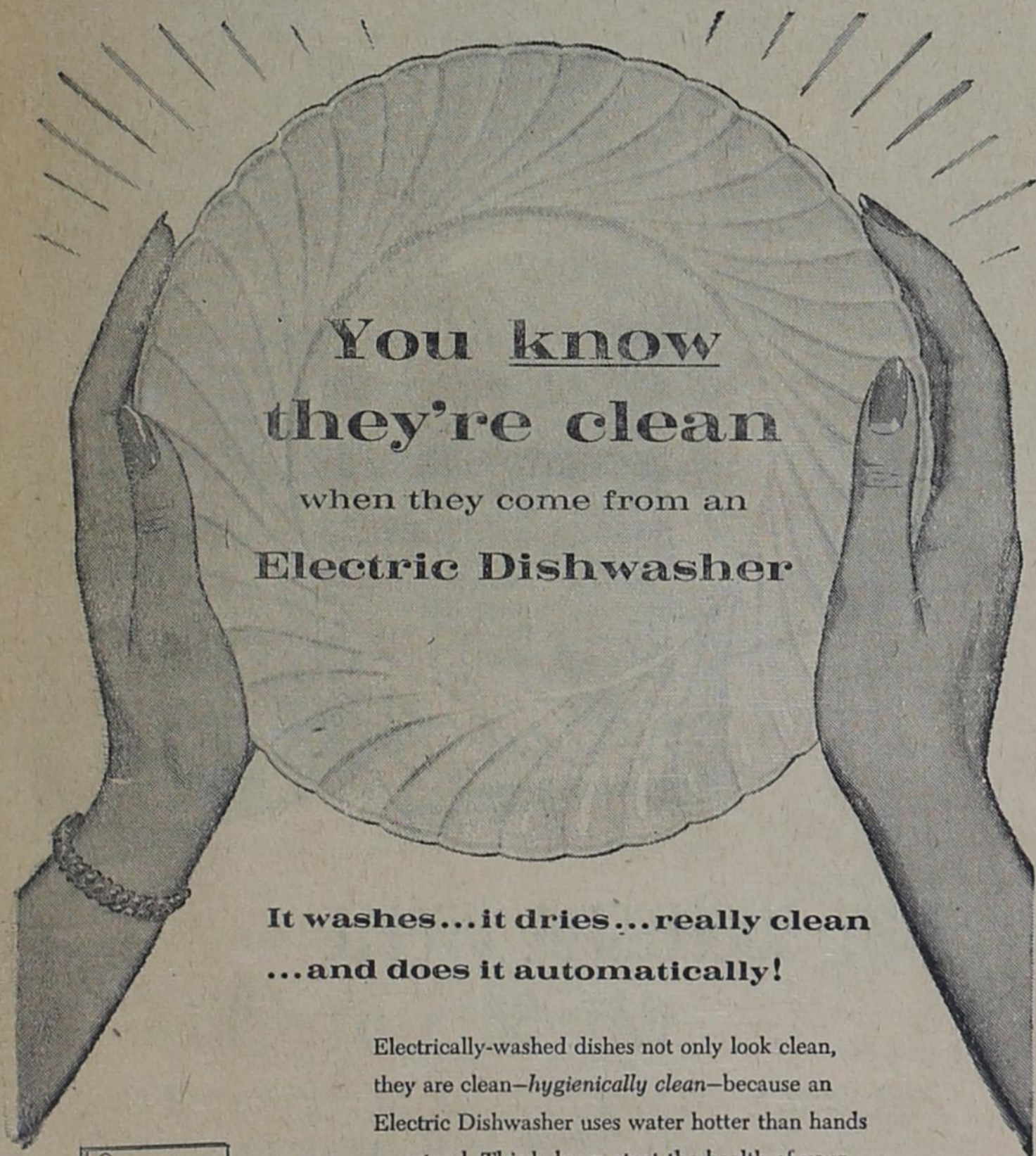

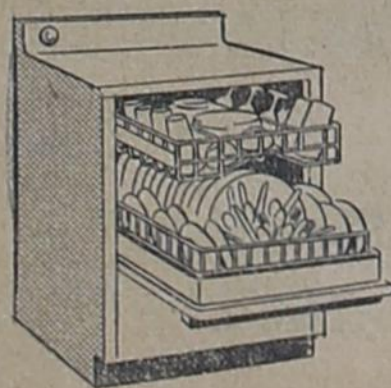
