Four Desdemona Men Injured In Well Mishap

Four Desdemona men were hospitalized here after learning late Thursday that the days of gas and oil production around Desdemona - once one of the wilder oil boom areas of the nation - are not over.

The four were testing what was supposed to be a 100-foot irrigation water well when accumulated gas exploded, burning all four on the faces and hands.

R. M. Pack, one of the four injured men, said he lighted a cigarette near the well head when the gas ignited.

Also hospitalized were Tommy Carr, L. E. Singleton and Joe Ben Koonce.

Gorman Volunteer Fire Department

ment extinguished the blaze after the blast occurred about 6:30 p. m. on the L. E. Singleton farm two miles north of Desdemona. The pump was badly damaged by the blast and fire.

Koonce and Singleton were released from the hospital Friday, while Pack and Carr remain as patients in Blackwell Hospital.

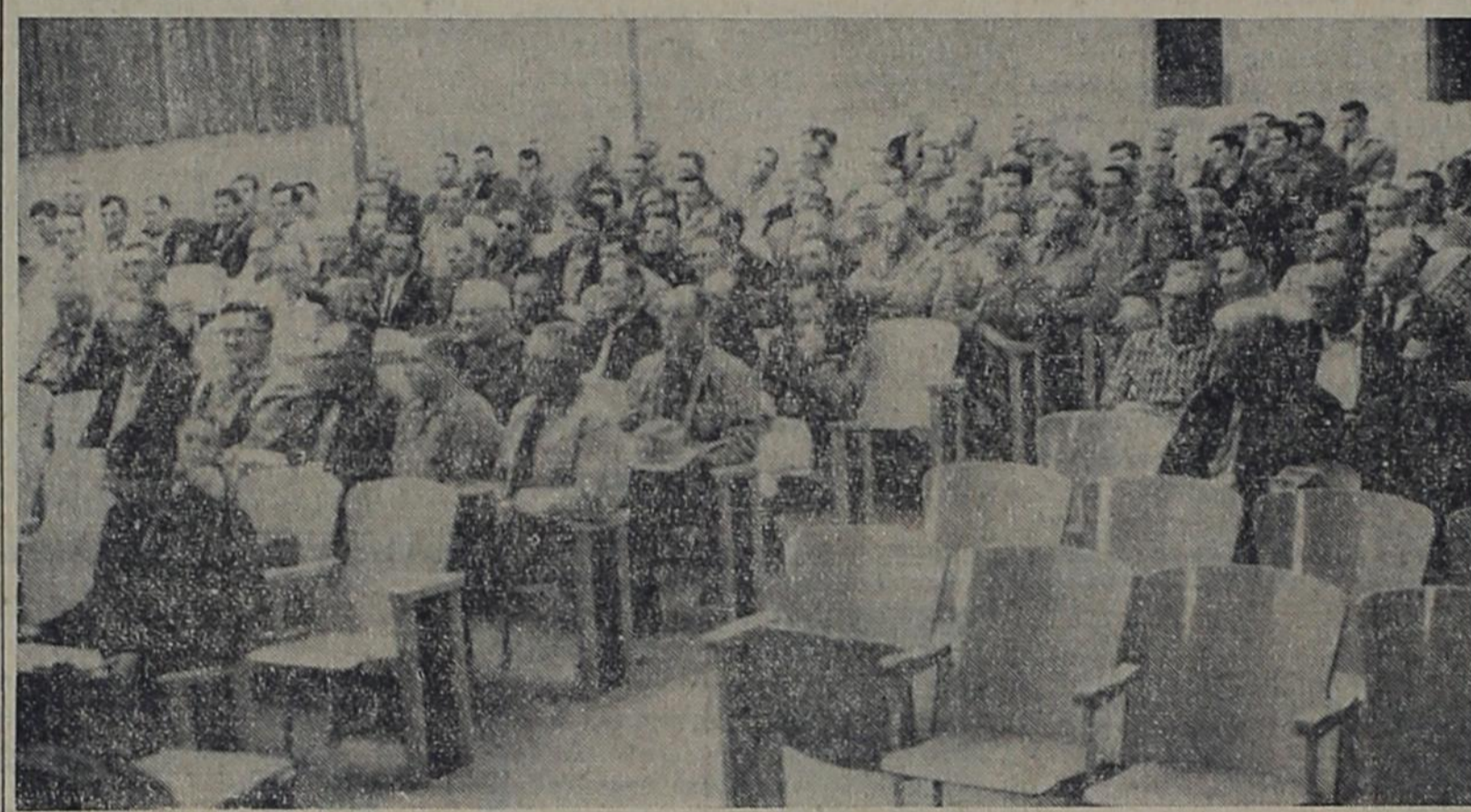
