# Local Student Receives Degree From Dallas Baptist University



# EASTLAND COUNTY BURN BAN IN EFFECT AS OF AUG. 9TH

At 10:00 a.m., August 9, 1999, Eastland County Commissioners' Court declares that a state of emergency exists in Eastland County due to the extreme potential for large and destructive wildfires.

Eastland County Commissioners' Court also issued an emergency order effective immediately, which prohibits any open buring in the unincorporated areas of Eastland County except the burning of combustible material in approved enclosures, such as trash barrels and charcoal grills which are designed to contain all flames and embers.

Due to dry conditions, and the lack of significant rainfall, all persons are advised that any open burning is extremely likely to cause very dangerous wildfire, posing risks to lives and property.

Local fire department officials, the National Weather Service and Texas Forest Service personnel advise that there is no present forcast for improving conditions.

The order signed by members of Eastland County Commissioners' Court provides that repeated or flagrant violations of the order shall consitute a misdemeanor, and that any peace officer of the State of Texas may enforce the order in the venue of the Eastland County Court.
