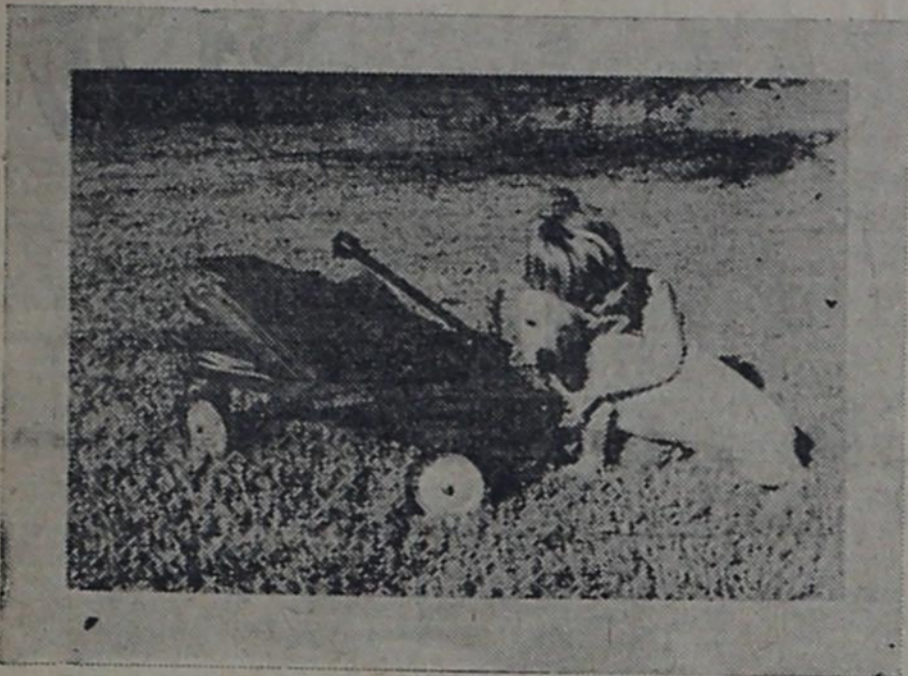

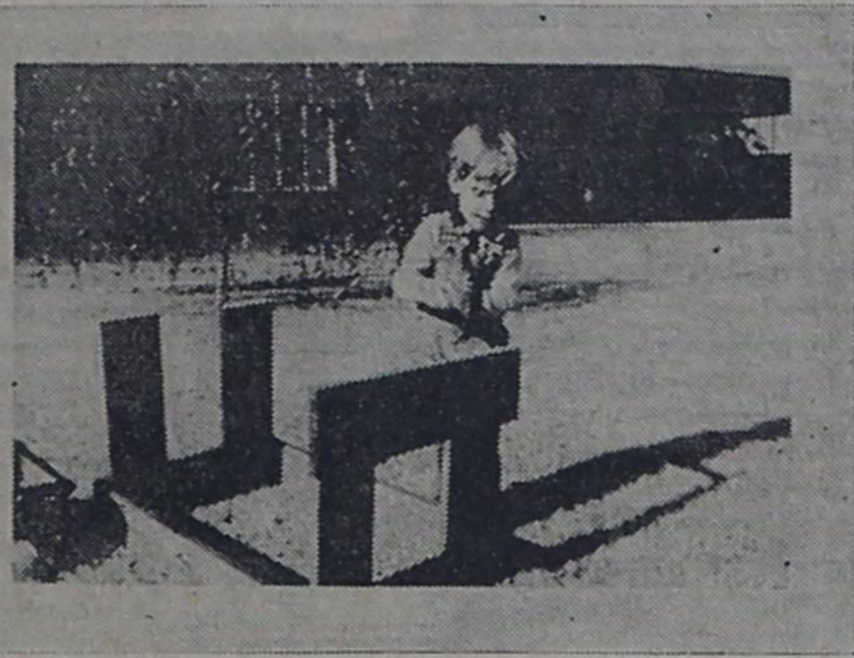


BART AND HIS PUPPY with wagon of lumber for a dog house.

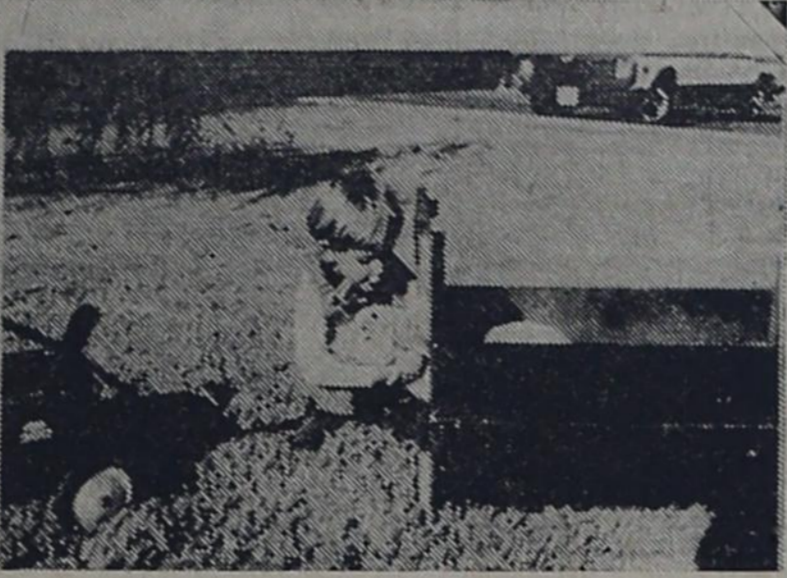


BART BEGINS his project of building by nailing two boards together.

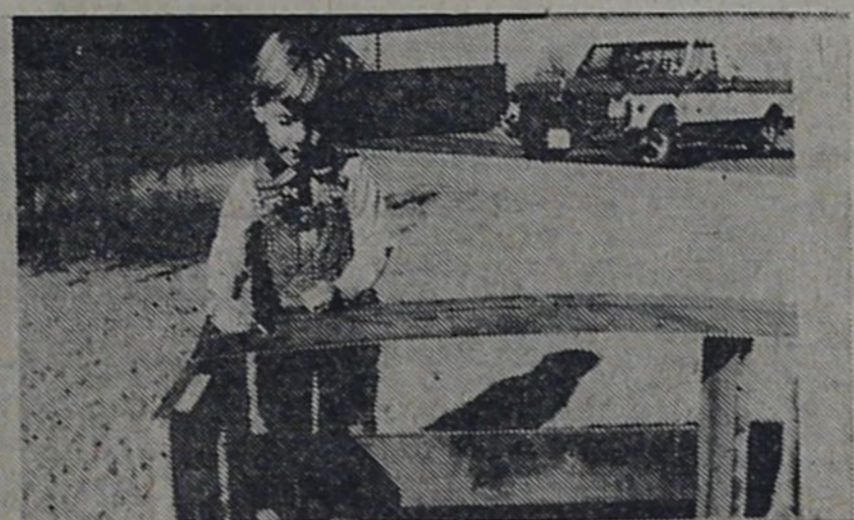

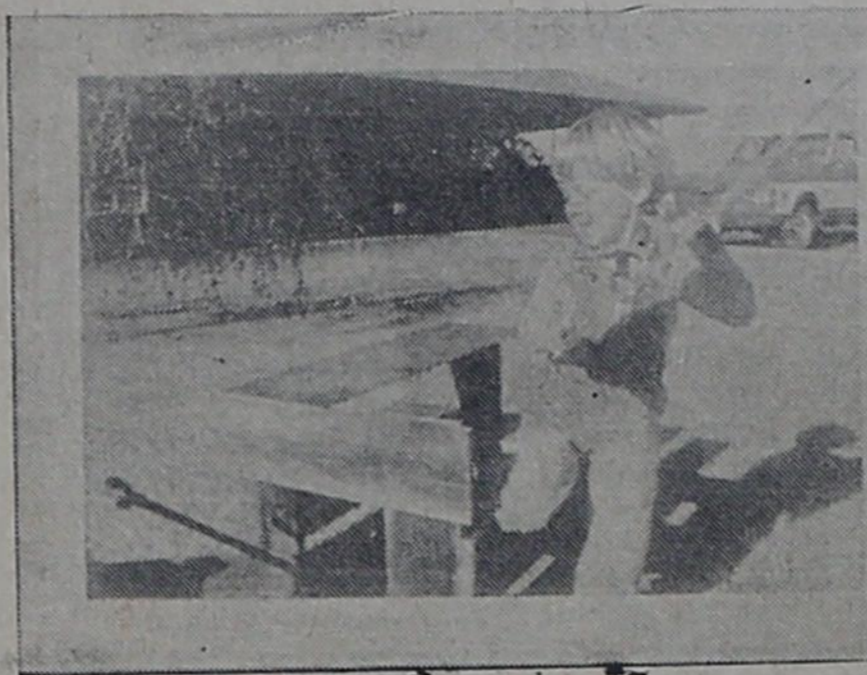

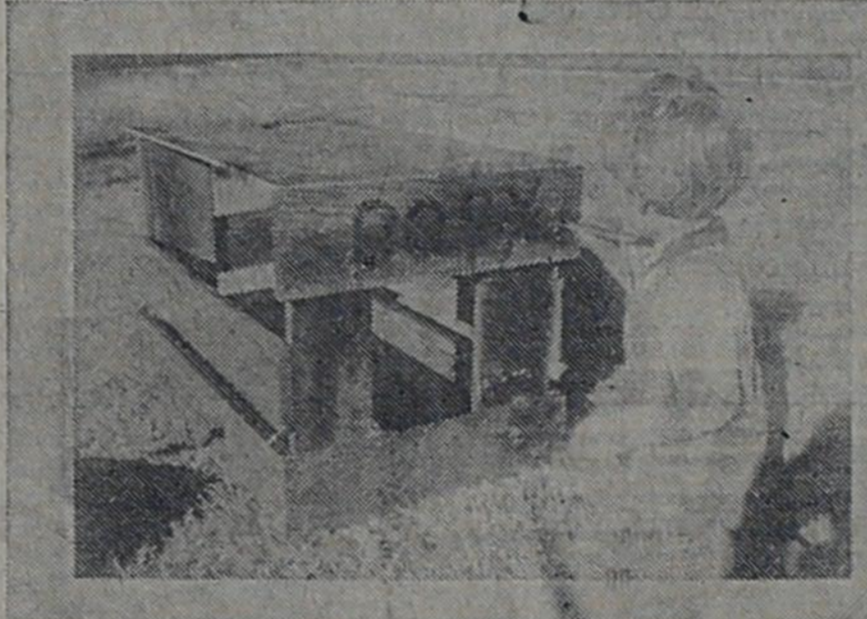
