 Lyndell Coan, long time Comanche County peanut farmer and member of more than 25 years, was recently honmore than 25 years, was recently hon-
ored by the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station, Texas A\&M University System, by its naming the world's frist root-knot nematode resistant peanut
variety after Mr. Coan. The COAN variety after Mr. Coan. The COAN
runner peanut variety was developed runner peanut variety was developed
by Drs. Charles Simpson and James Starr, by transferring genes for rootknot nematode resistance from a wild peanut species into cultivated peanut. Lyndell grew up in Comanche County and started farming peanuts in
the mid-1940's. He was in contionous the mid-1940's. He was in continuous farming of peanuts from 1958 to 1994.
He and his wife, Arlie, raised two chilHe and his wife, Arlie, raised two chil-
dren on their Comanche County farm near De Leon. They now live in De Leon. When he was actively farming, Lyndell had an experimental nature about him, often trying new things to grow better crops and to raise quality livestock.
