THE PROHIBITION AGAINST
THE INDIVIDUAL to do with
his property what he wishes, so
long as he does not infringe upon
his neighbor, is the denial of the
third element of fundamental
rights guaranteed under the Constitution.

WHEN GOVERNMENT AT-TEMPTS TO CONFER PRIVI-LEGE by legislation upon some, and by so doing takes away the rights of others, it does grave violence to the Constitution.


