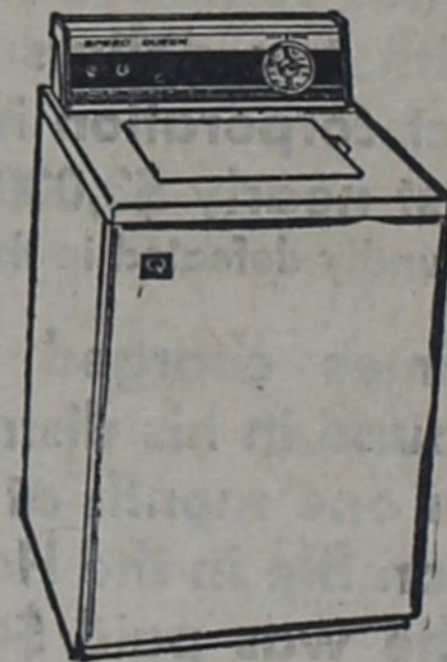

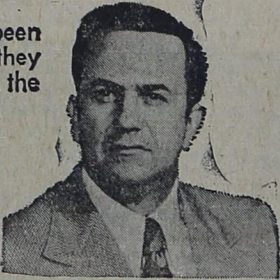
What it really is all about is something of much greater significance than postage stamps and Sen. Creighton's lavish mis-use of public monies.
