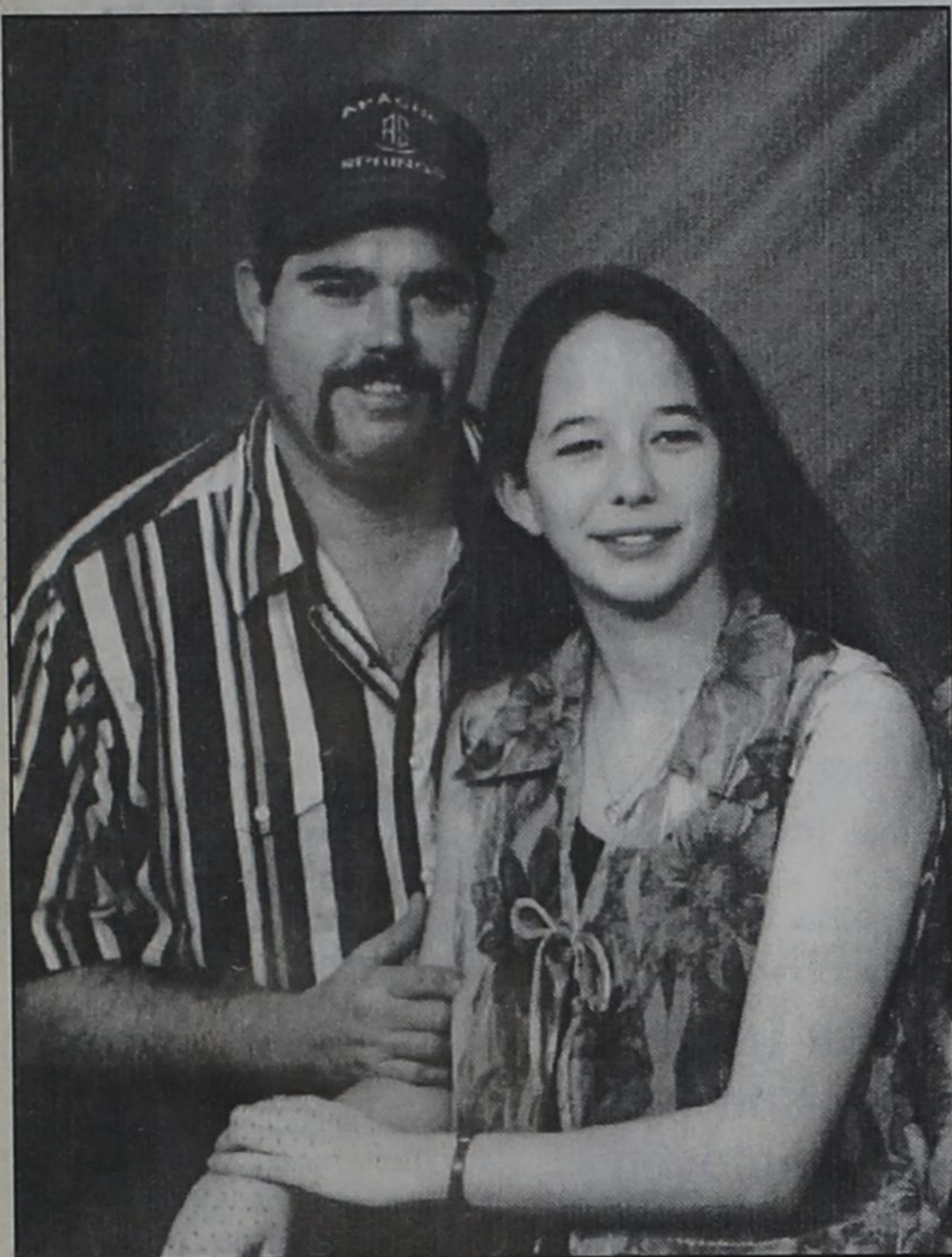

The Gorman City Commission met in regular session on the above date. Those present were: Mayor Jack Simpson, Commissioners John Rice, Robert Ervin, Kenneth Good and Johnny Smith. Others present were Judy Morris, Jonathan Van Deusen and Gaylord Battenfield.

The meeting was called to order at 5:05 p.m. Kenneth made a motion to approve the minutes as read with a second from Robert. The motion carried 4-0.

John made a motion to approve the bills for payment with a second from Johnny. The motion carried 4-0.

Robert made a motion to order the general election and to appoint Kathi Williams as the election judge. Johnny made a second to the motion, and the motion carried 4-0. The general election will be held May 2, 1998 at the Gorman Community Center from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Robert made a motion to treat the wastewater plant with the Cutrine Plus and go ahead and order the Totupia fish sometime during the month of May. Johnny made a second and the motion carried 4-0.

Kenneth made a motion to use a 10% raise for employees that have been evaluated after a ninety (90) day probation period. If at the end of the probation period the Commission seeks to retain this employee full time and at the time of hire had informed this employee that a raise would be considered the 10% raise would be added to the present pay or to pay that was determined at time of hire. Robert seconded the motion and the motion carried 4-0.

Tom Broom was not present for the meeting.

No action was necessary on the swimming pool issue.

John made a second and the motion carried 4-0.

There being no further business John made a motion to adjourn with a second from Robert. The motion carried 4-0.

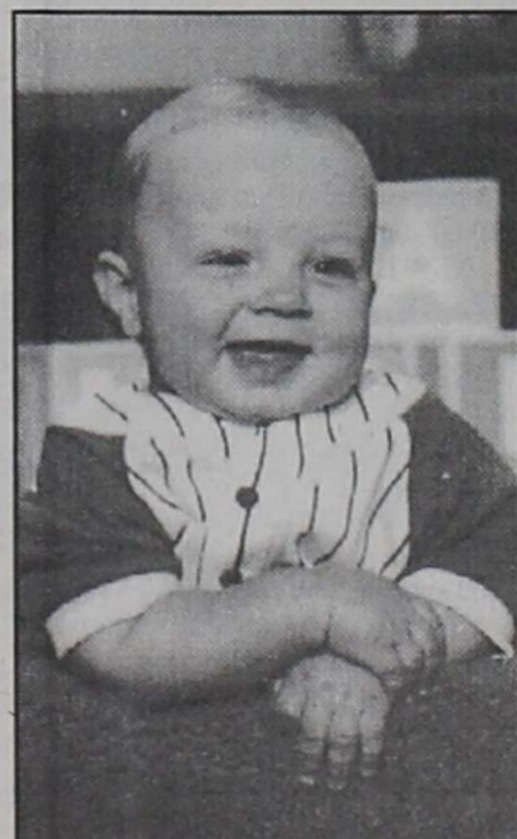
