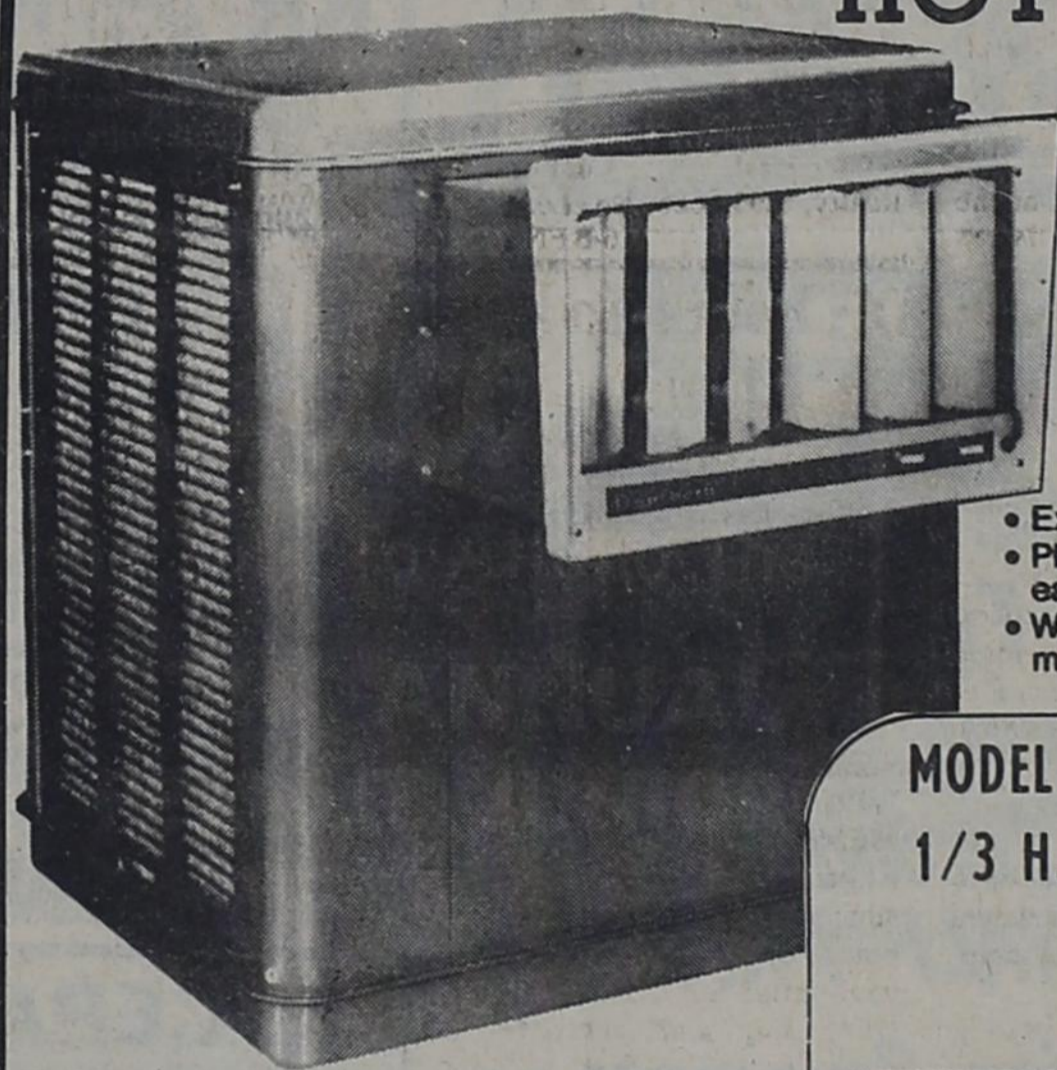

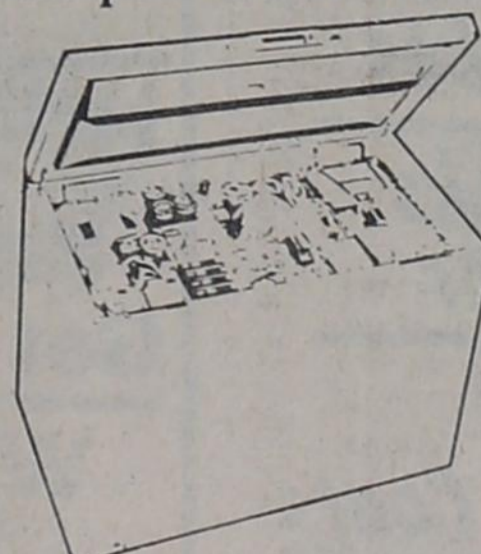

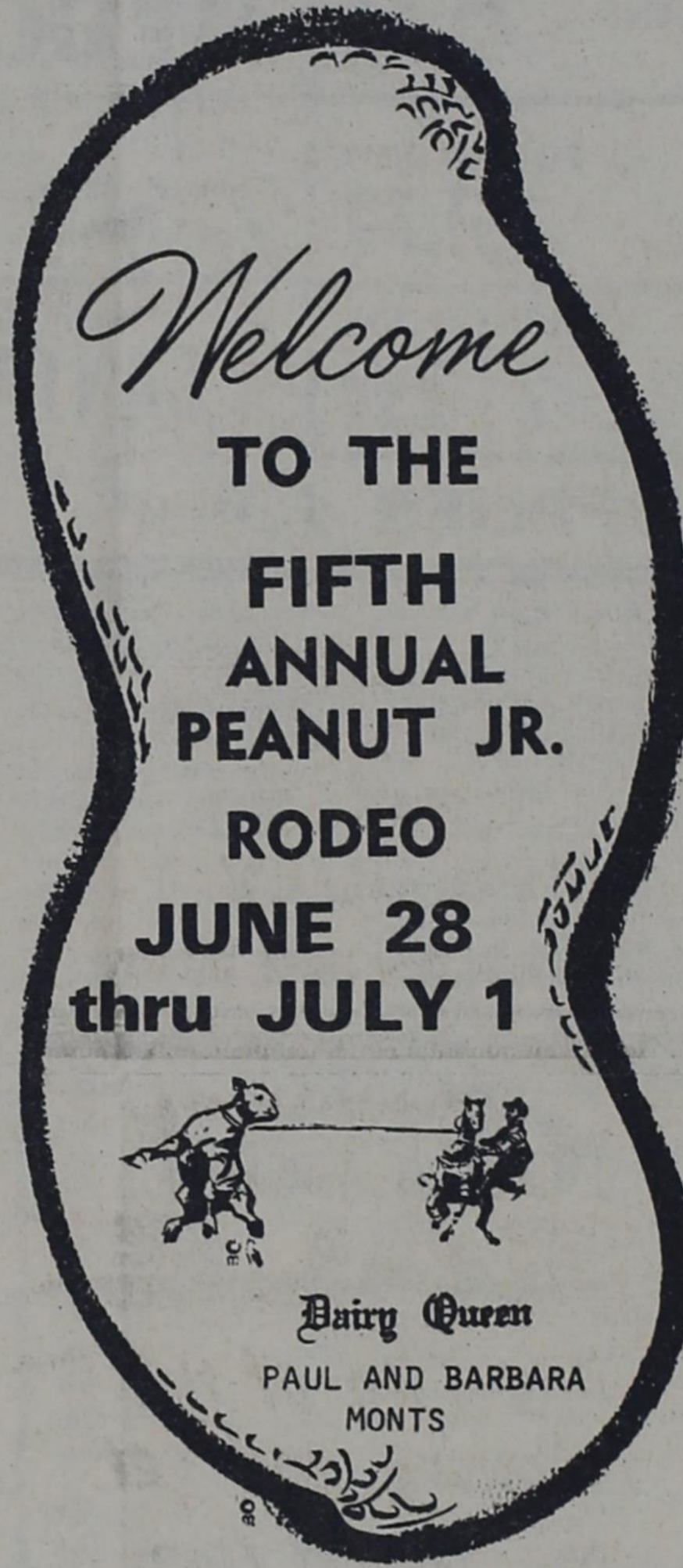

helping all the young athletes of Gorman in any way that he could. He cheered and laughed when you athletes won in any contest. He shed tears when you lost any contest. Mr. Monroe did more for the young athletes than any parent in Gorman. You will miss him in your future contests. Tho just remember his love to win at all times. Our sympathy goes out to his wife and all his relatives. May God ease your thought during these trying times. In my rambling writing I said many things about Oda. Tho it was all through fun and to help him keep up his spirits. As he had been sick for so many years. Our old 84 gang is still on the puny list. Just getting too old to play any more. They are

busy with their gardens and orchards now. Our office gang is going strong today. A lot of arguing and cheating if you can get by with it.
