You see we had no free schooling, job learning, no loans to buy land and homes.

Today there are 400,000 War I Vets alive. About 45,000 dying each year. Too late to help so many that needed it so bad in their later years.

War I Vets in their prime earning year, wages were low. So their S. S. payment are smaller than one retiring now.

I missed writing news some. As I was indisposed to do same. My old aching joints need some spouts put in where I can oil them. I believe it would help.

I notice where Reagan has asked to cut 2 1/2 billion dollars from Carter Foreign Aid Bill. Carter does not think it should be cut. That is one thing that has really hurt the U.S. Cut out giving to every little Communist Country in the world.

We have wasted our oil resources feed and clothing the people that do not try to handle birth control. We feed them so they can be able to fight us if necessary. We have given billions to India so that they can feed their cattle. They will not eat them and let them roam where they wish.

They will not kill those rats, as they believe when they die, they will come back as a rat. They get it in their head that some rat they see is their grandparents as are some other departed loved one. These statements are true.

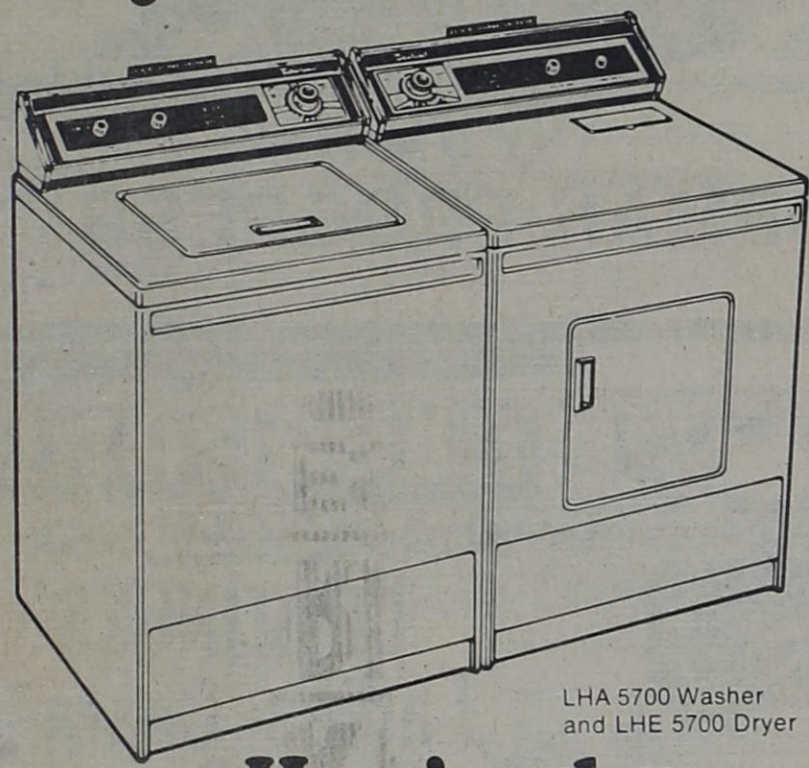

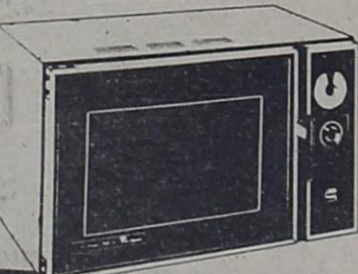

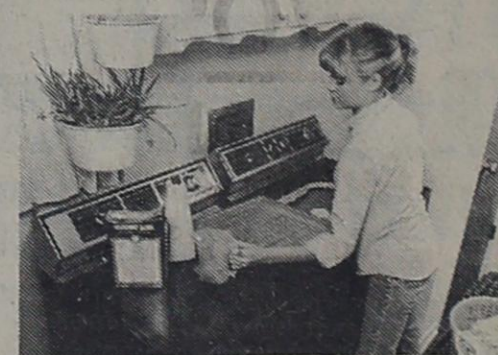
