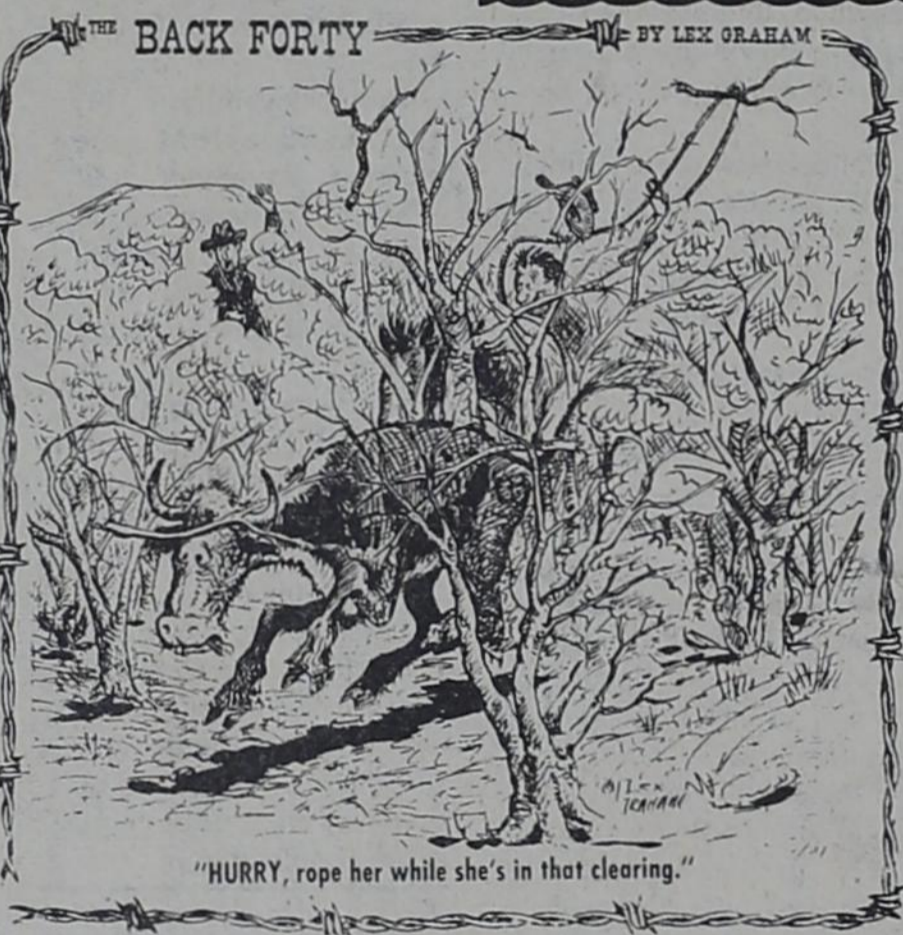

He said that we would take for three hours. He saw the scar on my stomach where I had been operated on. He found out I was teaching school at that time.

He asked me to name all nations in Central and South America and their capitals, the same in Europe, Asia and Africa. All rivers, lakes,

canals and straits, etc. He told me I knew the face of the world. He came from Germany at 17. Two year in high school, then to college for Dr. Age 46. He wanted to go over seas. He said he was American first and always.

We talked three hours. Now wouldn't Vera Henderson enjoy a talk like that. He stopped after three hours and called a Sgt. to take his place. He told the Sgt. to talk some and not let me go to sleep. The Dr. Came back in two hours and said that I was making it OK and I could go to sleep. As we had won the battle of the bluge. As the jaw had began to recede. My what a relief.

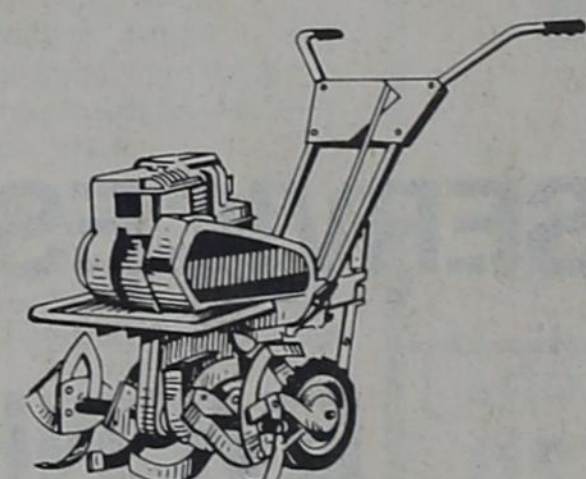
