The veteran then tenders this certified form to the Texas Motor Vehicle Division with one dollar for handling and mailing. The dollar should not be sent with the form to the VA.

Since several days of mail transmission to and from the VA and records checking by the VA will be necessary, veterans are captioned not to wait until the last ew days in September before acceptant


