PUBLIC MEETING

The State Board of Education has called for public hearings to be held throughout the state on a proposed rule regarding student absences for extracurricular activities.

The hearings will be held between Feb. 21 and March 15, 1984, at the 20 regional education service centers. Two hearings will be held at each site. Members of the State Board of Education will sit on each hearing panel. The proposed rule to be discussed is as follows: School districts shall not schedule, nor permit students to participate in, any school related activities on or off campus that would require, permit or allow a student in grades seven-12 to be absent from class in any course more than five times during the 175-day school year (full-year course) or more than three times during any one semester (full-year and semester courses). Classes missed for UIL and stateapproved VOCATIONAL COMPETITION ABOVE THE DISTRICT LEVEL, AS WELL AS LOCAL DIS-TRICT-APPROVED participation in extension of the

academic curriculum (sub-

ject-related fairs, assem-

blies, field trips, and other

subject-related activities) in

English/language

reading, mathematics, science, social studies, fine arts, or other languages, or student organizations, shall not count as any of these absences. Each student who participates in these activties must have and maintain at least a 70 average in at least four of the courses in which the student is enrolled for that semester.

Districts shall develop a policy which implements the stipulation of this rule.

The proposed rule has been accepted for first reading and filing authorization by the State Board of Education.

Board chairman Joe Kelly Butler of Houston, 7th Congressional District, described the rule as a very important issue and said individuals who have concerns regarding the rule should plan to attend one of the hearings.

 Stagger the nails when installing redwood decking fine grain can easily dent lumber. This type of redand split unless you use the wood is often unseasoned and shrinks as it dries. If you do not stagger the nails, the wood can buckle and split with age.

• For most applications, nails should penetrate at least 11/2 inches into the wood. For example, use 8d finish nails for 1-inch-thick paneling. Use longer nails when placing redwood over old paneling or sheathing.

 Avoid nailing close to the edge of redwood, since this can cause splitting. Also avoid nails with needle or chisel points, which tend to split redwood.


