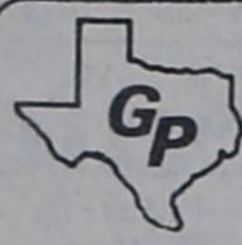

## SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS HELD SATURDAY

Two incumbents and two new comers received most of the votes to win positions on the Gorman Independent School District board of trustees Saturday.

Incumbents Gene Snider received 170 votes and Dale Curb received 160 votes. Jackie Grice received 126 votes to round out the three three year terms at large on the board.

Howard Hagood also a candidate for a full term position lost with 70 votes.

Corky Brown won the one year term on the board with 91 votes, beating out Windell Treadway by eight votes. Treadway had 83 votes.

## CITY ELECTION HELD SATURDAY

Frank Leazar who had served as an appointee for the past year in the position of Place One on the City Commission was elected to a full two year term Saturday with 110 votes. A new comer Bill Mears was elected to Place Three on the City Commission with 75 votes. Both candidates were Unopposed.

Wilbur Shell received 43 write in votes for Place Three and Brenda Hirst received 10 write in votes.

A total of 131 votes were cast.

## HOSPITAL BOARD ELECTION HELD SATURDAY

Four positions on the South Eastland County Hospital District Board were filled with two incumbents, Woodie Beene with 139 votes and James Mears with 130 votes. New comers elected to the board were Lowell Rawls with 143 votes and Cordell with 139 votes, a total of 150 votes were cast. There were 9 write in votes.

## TWO WOMEN WIN HALF PROCESSED HOG

Two Eastland County women Diane Fisher of Cisco and Sandra Creech of Rising Star, were the winners of one half processed hog. The women's names were drawn at the County Livestock Show Sale of Champions, March 19.

Bill Kendall and Sons of Cisco donated the hog to the Eastland County Livestock Raisers Association. Rust Processing Center, located on Highway 80 between Cisco and Eastland, processed the hog as a donation to the association.

The two names were drawn from a list of 1,300 people who had given a dollar donation to the association. The money donated will be used to make improvements to the livestock show facilities.

The Cisco FFA chapter won \$100 from the association for collecting more donations than any other 4-H club or FFA chapter.

# Livestock Show Sale Sets Record

The Eastland County Livestock Show Sale topped previous records last Saturday night. The sale brought Eastland County 4-H and FFA youth, a total of \$108,409. Last year's sales totaled \$84,000. A total of 197 market animals were sold. Only the top 50% of each class was eligible for this sale.

Parti Port Petroleum purchased Jim Moylan's Grand Champion Steer for \$3.00 per pound. The steer weighed 1,315 pounds. Parti Port Petroleum included four local companies - W.A. Hill & Son Inc., Center Point Enterprises, Eastland Drilling and Omega Enterprises.

Randall Gibbs of Gorman sold his Grand Champion market hog to Brown's Feed Store for \$2.25 per pound. His hog weighed 258 pounds.

The Grand Champion Lamb, owned by Stephanie Koch of Ranger was purchased by the First State Bank for \$2.40 per pound.
