NEW DEVICE PROVIDES SAFER PICTURE OF INSIDE OF THE BODY

Getting a picture of the inside of the body is now safer and clearer with a newly approved device called the nuclear magnetic resonance scanner.

The NMR is a large, doughnut-shaped device that can show detailed cross-sections of the body's interior, according to the Texas Medical Association. This is done without the possible risk of radiation side effects

of X-rays or highly advanced computerized axial tomography (CAT scans).

An NMR uses radio waves and a strong magnetic field to produce a picture of the body that can differentiate between adjacent soft tissues that might look the same on an X-ray.

To obtain an NMR image, the patient is placed inside a large

magnetic coil. When the magnetic field is turned on, it causes certain particles within the atoms of the body line up in one direction.

Then the radio waves flip the particles in another direction. When the radio waves are turned off, the particles flip back again, releasing an electromagnetic signal that a computer translates into an image.

Physicians investigating nuclear magnetic resonance have reported success in diagnosing multiple sclerosis, locating brain and lung tumors, and measuring the buildup of fatty deposits in blood vessels.

The device also may prove useful in diagnosing lumps of the breast, as well as kidney and liver disease.

But the strong magnetic fields and radio waves of the NMR could be harmful to persons with metal artificial joints or electronic pacemakers, warns the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, which approved the device.

Laboratory chemists have used NMR techniques for about 30 years to analyze the chemical makeup of substances. In the future, these machines may even prove useful in analyzing the interior chemistry of parts of the body. For example, they may determine how badly damaged the heart muscle is after a heart attack.

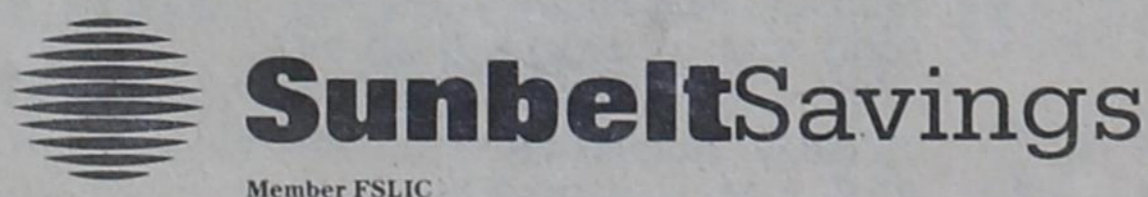
