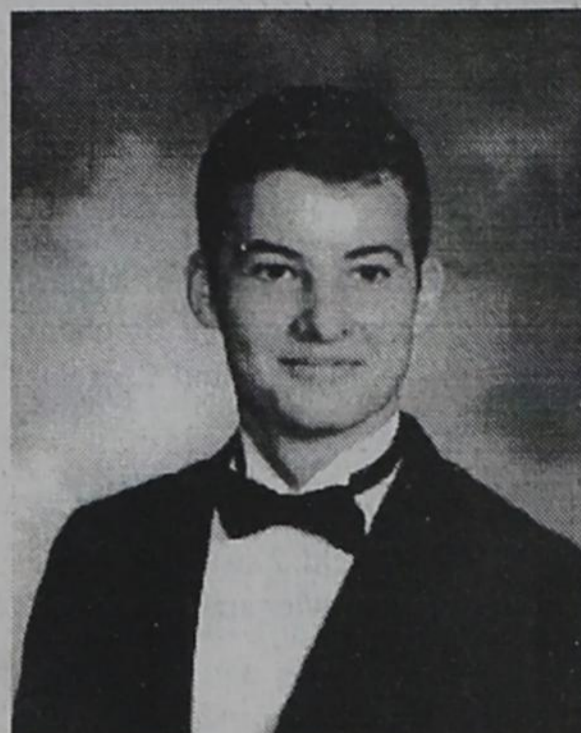

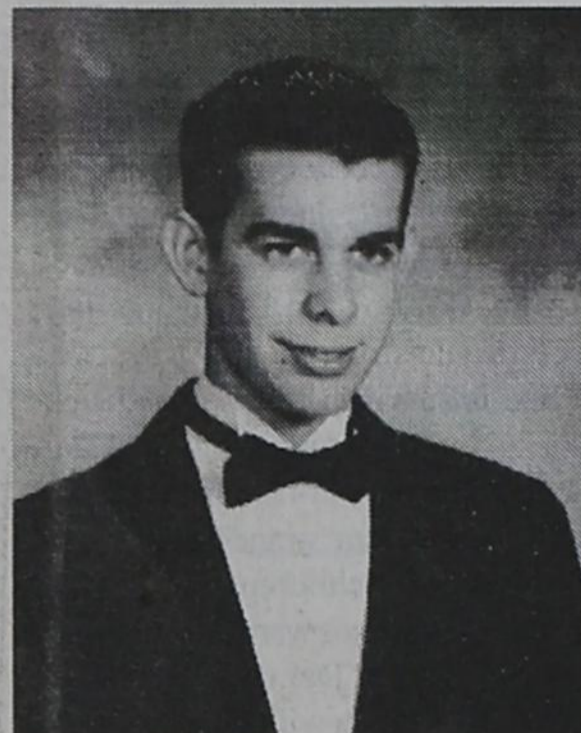
Mark Glover

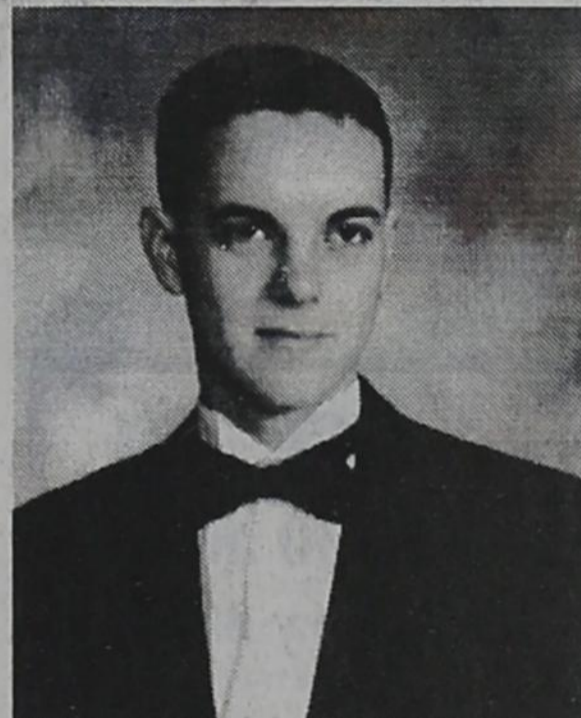

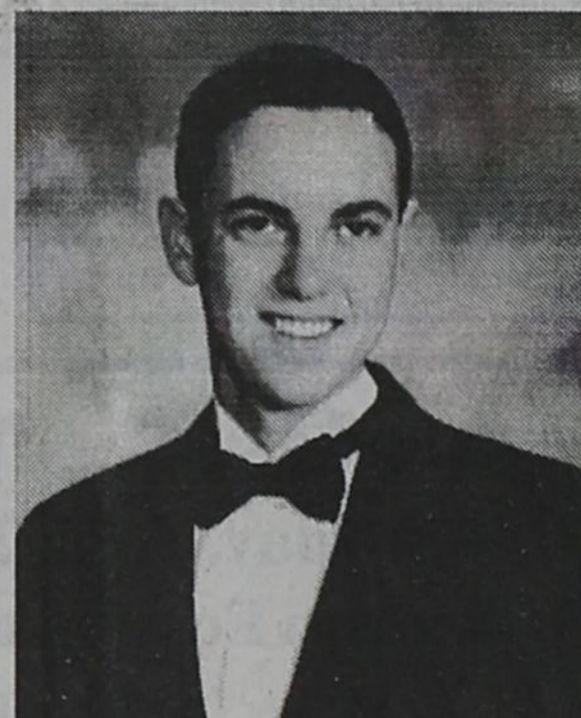
Cody Simpson

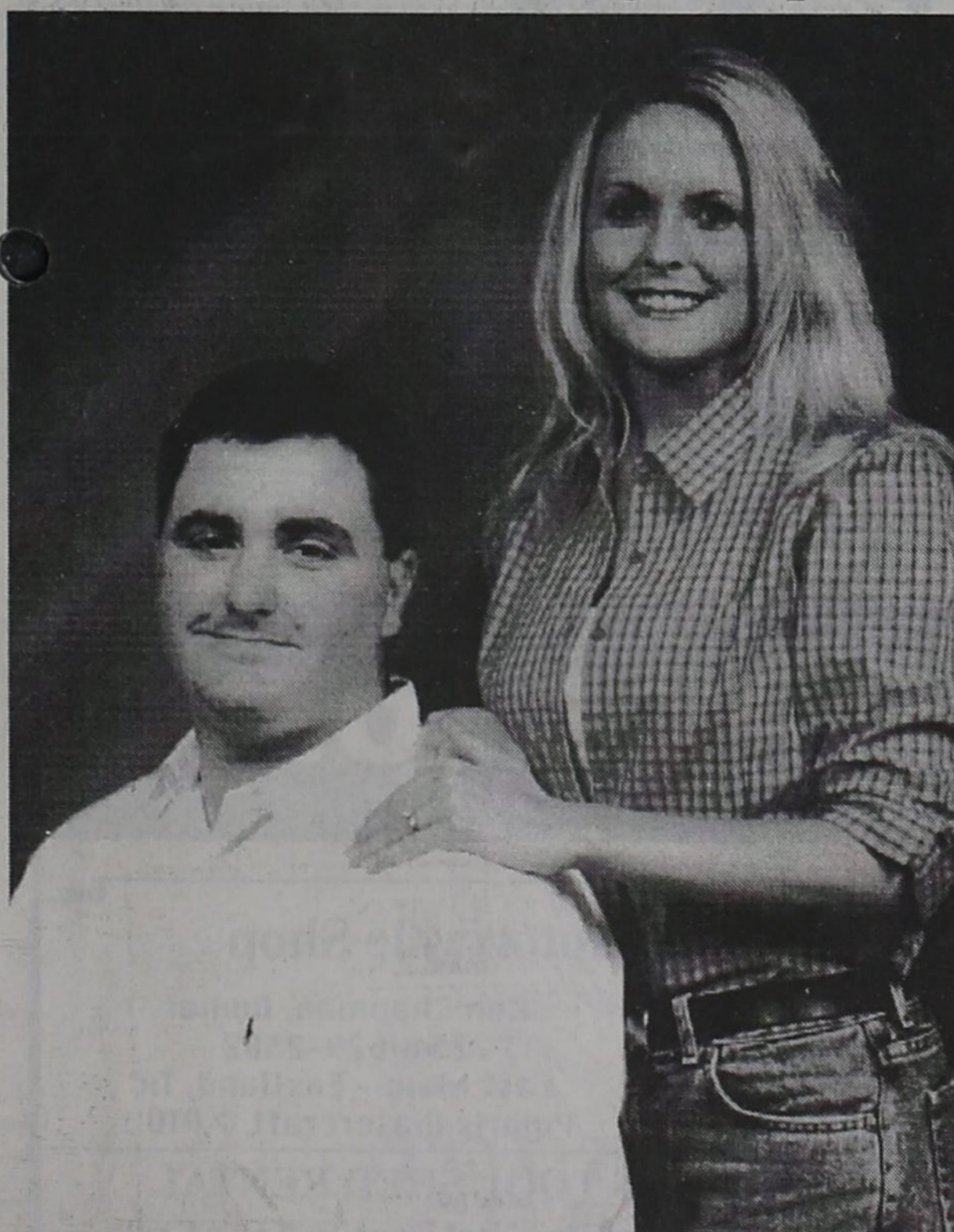

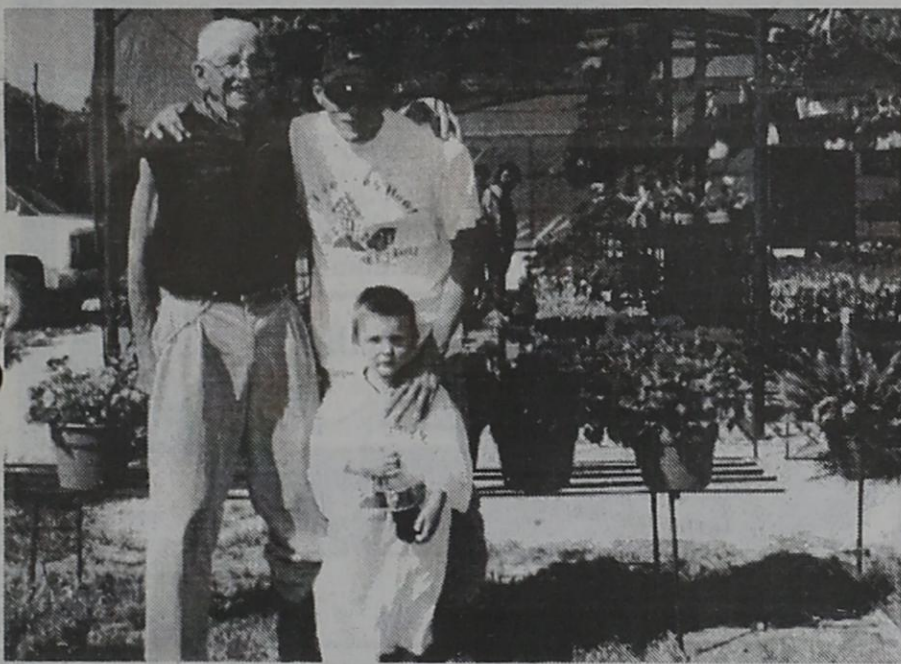
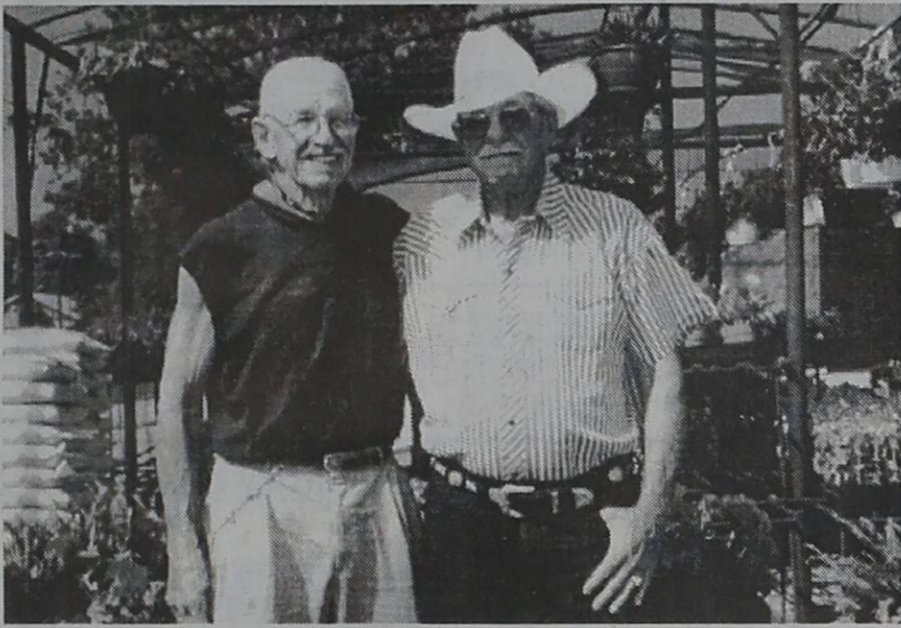

DR PEPPER, TEXAS Prepares for 110th Birthday Party



While most modern businesses are replacing old equipment, the Dublin Dr. Pepper Bottling Company takes pride in maintaining theirs. The bottling line is one of the plant's biggest tourist attractions, providing visitors the opportunity to see the soft drink bottled much the way it has been for the past 110 years. The Dublin plant is the oldest Dr. Pepper plant in the world and the only one which still uses the original recipe.

DUBLIN, TX — For one week each year, this North Central Texas community of 3,900 officially becomes DR PEPPER, TEXAS.

The changing of the city limits sign on Highway 377/67 on Monday, June 4 will signal the start of Dr Pepper Days, the 110th birthday celebration of the oldest Dr Pepper bottling plant in the world and the only one which continues to use the original pure cane sugar recipe.

The celebration is a customer appreciation event hosted each year for the past decade by Dublin Dr Pepper Bottling Company.

Although several community activities are planned for the week, it is Saturday's events which traditionally pack the streets with 3,000 to 5,000 visiting Dr Pepper aficionados. Traditionally, the most popular draw of the day is the bottling plant itself where tours will begin at 9 a.m. The bottling line is a step back in time because much of the original equipment is still used and the bottling process is much the same as it was when owner Sam Houston Prim began bottling Dr Pepper in 1891. The Dr Pepper museum and gift shop and its popular Old Doc's Soda Shop will also be open all day.

A highlight of the Saturday activities will be the crowning of the 2001 Pretty Peggy Pepper, the young lady who serves as ambassador for the Dublin Dr Pepper Bottling Company. She is named for Dr Pepper's advertising icon which was introduced in the early 1940s.

Much of the day's family-oriented entertainment will turn back the calendar to pre-television days when entertainment called for participation, not just observance. The Backyard Circus is expected to be a hit with youngsters and parents alike. Trunks are opened, the dress-up begins and the result is a Big Top extravaganza of children who may become Wanda the Tightrope Walker, prepared to climb her imaginary ladder, or Marco the Lion Tamer who directs the lively lions and tigers. Costumes, including the tutus for the Butterfly Ballerinas, go right over blue jeans so the transition of a bright-eyed youngster into a circus performer is almost instant. The circus, which will be performed at "10, 2 and 4" (in keeping with the Dr Pepper advertising slogan), is part of the Dr Pepper Carnival which will include a variety of family-oriented games and activities such as an old-fashioned dunking booth, high strikers in adult and children's sizes, fishing booth, sandbag toss, train ride, face painting, cake walk, bouncing house and more. There will also be a NASCAR booth with a pit stop simulator which is expected to draw dads as well as the kids.

Another popular attraction is Molly, the Jersey "spokes cow" of Promised Land Dairy in Floresville which provides ice cream products for Old Doc's Soda Shop. Molly tells her audience how milk is produced and processed. The Promised Land exhibit also provides a sample of milk, information about dairy products and the opportunity to pet Molly who is kid-friendly.

The downtown streets will be lined with arts and crafts booths and The Art Gallery will display winning entries in the Dr Pepper art and photography contest. A silent auction of Dr Pepper memorabilia is expected to be a popular draw for souvenir hunters. A barbecue cookoff and antique car show, hosted by the Dublin Chamber of Commerce, will take place at the Dublin City Park.

The day will conclude with a dance at "Club Pepper" in the Dr Pepper warehouse. Proceeds benefit Habitat for Humanity.

The Dr Pepper 110th birthday celebration coincides with the annual Dublin Area Reunion at Dublin High School and the Dublin Historical Society Summer Fair and the barbecue lunch at the downtown park.

Texas EMS Week May 20-26

Most people know that when emergency medical help is needed, dialing 911 on the nearest telephone bring quick response. But some people may not think about exactly who is answering that call for help.

The Rural EMS Task Force Committee and the Texas Department of Health (TDH) reminds you and your family that every response team provides a lifesaving link between ill and injured individuals and medical care in Eastland County.

"Emergency medical response across Texas is provided everyday by dedicated trained professionals, working in ambulances and trauma centers stocked with lifesaving equipment," said Kathy Perkins, Chief of TDH's Bureau of Emergency management.

Ambulances staffed with two highly trained EMT's or Paramedics respond to calls for ill and injured people. The Texas Trauma system made up of 185 trauma centers across Texas coordinates in-hospital care so those patients receive the type of care they need as quickly as possible. This system is on alert, ready as soon as someone calls 911.

"Nearly 45,000 trained, certified emergency personnel are part of Texas EMS," Perkins said. "They respond to people in need and give the best emergency medical care possible. These highly trained EMT's and Paramedics treat patients from the emergency scene to the hospital and are an integral part of our emergency care system for victims of sudden and serious illness and injury."

In Texas, this system begins with an informed public able to recognize a medical emergency and make the call for help, then moves through a network of call to trauma centers that provide highly specialized treatment for the most seriously ill or injured.

Thanks again to everyone who came to donate their time for a worthy cause!



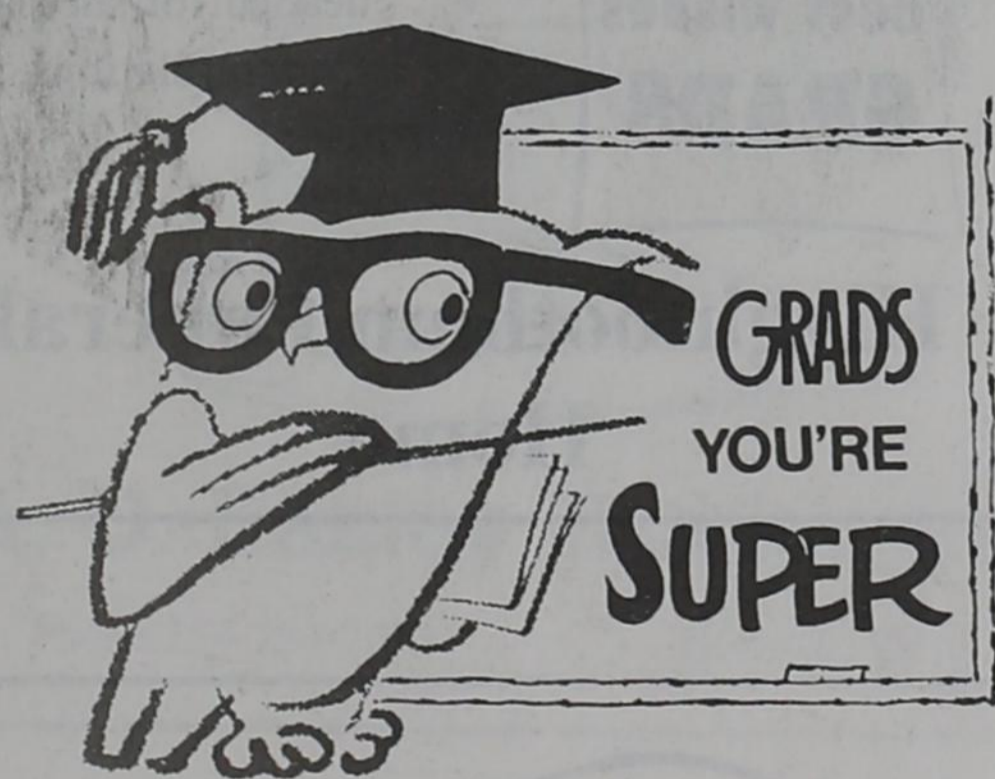

2001 FISHING TIPS WITH BERNIE SCHULIZ

The Right Way To Fish A Dock

With fish docks most anglers have a tendency to cast to the edges of the dock. Sometimes this produces a strike, but often the bass is located well beneath the structure.

After making a few casts to the outer perimeter, start targeting the center supports under the dock. From there move to the backside and try pitching to the key supports along the cat walk. If it is a floating dock, try fishing the inside corners, or wherever the dock makes a turn. The more thorough you work a boat dock, the more you increase your chances of success.

Remember that docks with diving boards are usually void of any structure, while docks with lights mean a brush pile is probably present.

HEAD TO HEAD ON AGRICULTURE EXPORTS

Agriculture is a key element of American success in the global marketplace. The 15 member countries of the European Union represent a market with some 370 million consumers - all potential diners on U.S. beef, rice, dairy products and corn, and potential users of high quality U.S. cotton. The European Union is one of our chief trading partners, and at the same time, a competitor in world markets.

Those facts were at the center of discussions I had in April with EU Agriculture Commissioner Franz Fischler on ways to tear down trade barriers that currently impede the export of certain U.S. products to European markets.

The European Union has, over the last 10 years, imposed significant restrictions on American agricultural products, causing great harm to U.S. producers, even though in several cases the U.S. producers have been successful in fighting these bans as violations of World Trade Organization (WTO) rules.

Beef represents a case in point: In 1989 the European Union closed its markets to U.S. beef when it was alleged that American cattle were being fed growth hormones that pose a threat to human health. The hormone charge refers to a naturally occurring, growth-promoting hormone that is scientifically proven to contribute to the production of healthy beef products. Since then the European Union has increasingly insulated its own beef industry from competition, despite the fact that in 1996, the World Trade Organization ruled that the EU had failed to make its case against U.S. beef. In May of 1999, the EU missed the deadline for complying with the WTO panel ruling. In this country, we call that thumbing your nose, so in August, 1999 the United States imposed 100 percent tariffs on \$116.8 million worth of imports from the EU. The current crisis caused by outbreaks of "Mad Cow" disease and foot-and-mouth disease in the European Union has made it even more difficult for European consumers to put meat on their tables.

With that history in mind, I made it clear to Commissioner Fischler that trade in agriculture products will be a top U.S. priority at this year's round of WTO negotiations.

Changes we are asking the European Union to make in its agriculture policies include greater market access for U.S. products, the reduction of EU export subsidies, the reining in of state trading enterprises and the elimination of non-tariff trade barriers.

Our discussions were extremely cordial, but I told the commissioner that the United States expects the European Union to comply with the current trade agreements (and specifically with the agreement on beef), and to make substantive progress toward opening its markets to U.S. imports. We want trade equity — and will not settle for less.

Commissioner Fischler understands that trade barriers penalize U.S. producers and European consumers alike, and we agreed to continue to work on mutually beneficial ways to open, rather than close markets. He is scheduled to arrive in Washington for a second meeting the third week in May. We hope that the constructive dialogue we started in Brussels will continue, bringing both the United States and the EU to a workable and fair trade arrangement.

Texas Department of Human Services 2000 Annual Report

The state spent a total of \$8,012,219 has year for major welfare programs in Eastland County, according to Barbara Evans, Regional Administrator for the Texas Department of Human Services.

"Food stamps worth \$1,338,717 were issued for the fiscal year which ended August 31, while Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) totaled \$260,027. Food stamps are funded entirely by the federal government, while the department determines eligibility of potential clients and non-clients and issues the Lone Star Card.

The state and federal governments share in the cost of TANF to families where needy children are deprived of support because of the absence or disability of one of both parents.

Nursing home costs of approximately \$4,848,034 were paid for aged and disabled residents. Community Care for Aged and Disabled spent \$1,365,372 for Medicaid related services and \$200,069 for non-Medicaid related services," Ms. Evans said.
