UIL SCHOLAR AWARD PRESENTED TO STUDENTS

Last year The University Interscholastic League inaugurated a "UIL Scholar Award," to be presented to students who have graduated in the top 10 percent of their classes and who participated in a UIL academic, music or athletic contest.

The purpose of the award is to honor students whose "Academic and extracurricular achievements have been exemplary and whose self-discipline in preparation and integrity in competition are a model to others," said Dr. Bailey Marshall, League director.
