Eastland County is one of thirteen in Texas recently named by Secretary of Agriculture Richard E. Lyng as eligible for loans to cover actual
physical losses resulting from fire. physical losses resulting from fire
Phillips said farmers and ranch may be eligible for loans of up to 100 percent of their actual losses or $\$ 500,000$, whichever is less. For
farmers unable to obtain credit from farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lend
"Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be accepted until November 22, 1988, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could
create backlogs in processing and possibly over into the new farming season," Phillips said.
FmHA is a credit agency of the $U$. S. Department of Agriculture, It is authorized to provide disaster emerwho work at and rely on farming for a substantial part of their living. Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who are U. S. citizens and to farming partnerships, corporations
or cooperatives in which U. S.
