PANTHERS DROP WILDCATS 42-6; HOST SANTA ANNA FRIDAY NIGHT

The Gorman Panthers evened their season record to two wins and two losses on Friday night as they hosted the Santo Wildcats in their first home game of the season and really thrilled the hometown Panther fans by overwhelming the Wildcats 42 to 6.

The Panthers kicked off to Santo and held them. Then took the punt on their own 40 and scored in 8 plays with Brandon Gilmore getting the final 4 yards on a run with 5:36 left in the period. The drive featured a 32 and 11 yard run respectively for Robby Hand before Gilmore's run. Kevin Hirst kicked the point after.

On the next Santo possession the Big Red defense got a Wildcat fumble on the Santo 33 and scored in 4 plays with Gilmore again getting the scoring honors on a 9 yard run with 3:46 left. The drive also featured a 12 yard run by Hirst and a Santo penalty also helped. Hirst kicked the PAT and Gorman led 14-0.

Then on the next possession the Wildcats took the ball on their own 34 and started a drive. The first play netted 20 yards, then the next gained 4 before the Big Red defense was shocked by Santo when L. D. Crawford broke loose off the outside and raced 45 yards for the score with 2:24 left in the first period. The kick for point after was blocked and the score was 14-6.

But from that point on the Panthers took control of the game. On the next possession the Panthers got the ball on the Santo 40 and scored in 8 plays with Kevin Hirst running it in from 7 yards out with 11:23 left in the second. The drive featured a 9 yard run by Gilmore for a first; and then a 12 yard play, before Hirst passed to Jason Ditmore for 13 yards and a first down at the Santo 15. Following runs of 6 and 2 yards, Hirst hit paydirt. Hirst added the PAT and the score was 21-6.

Then with 4:30 left in the half the Panthers took the ball on an interception at the Gorman 22 and went the distance in just three plays with Gilmore getting the final 69 yards on a beautiful run behind some good blocks in the line. Hirst added the punt after and the score was 28-6.

But the Panthers were not through as they took a punt on their own 37 and went the distance in just 5 plays with Chad Campbell getting the honors on a beautiful pass from Hirst for 33 yards with 52 seconds left. Hirst added the PAT and the halftime score was 35-6.

Following the intermission the Panthers came out and got another touchdown on a great 47 yard run for the TD by Gary Browning on a run in which he broke several tackles to score with 4:43 left in the third. Hirst booted the point after and the score was 42-6.

From there the substitutes took over and went the rest of the way.

Gilmore led the Gorman ball carriers with 127 yards on 12 carries. Browning had a good night with 74 yards on 6 tries. Robby Hand did good with 75 yards on 10 trips. Hirst had 56 on 6 keepers. Jason Ditmore had 31 on 7 tries. Chuck Fonville got 8 on 6 trips. Rajee Patel had a minus 2 on 3 carries.

The Big Red defense did a very good job on the Wildcats most of the night, allowing only a couple of big runs, one of which was the touchdown scamper.

The Big Red defense will be tested again this Friday night as they host the Santa Anna Mountaineers in another Class A struggle at Brogdon Field at 8 p. m. Santa Anna has also had tough sledding so far but have a very good team and the Panthers will have to be ready for this one.

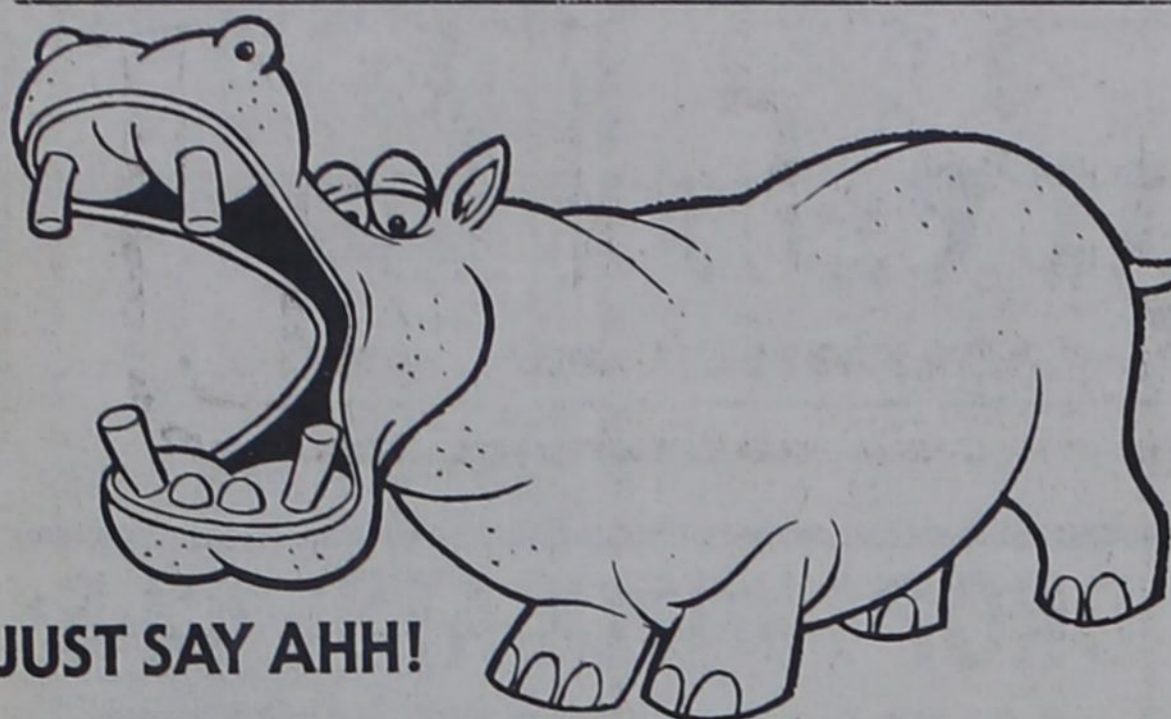

Pecan growers in Eastland County will tour the Charles Walker pecan orchard Friday, October 6th from 9:45 to 12 noon.

Extension Agent, DeMarquis Gordon says, the tour will feature pecan management and a pecan insect control demonstration.

Dr. Larry Stein, Extension Horticulturist, will be on the tour to discuss the 1990 state and national pecan crop and market outlook. Dr. Chip Lee, Extension Plant Pathologist, will speak to the group on pecan disease control in pecan orchards.

Gordon says, it will be a good opportunity for pecan growers to visit with the specialists and other growers about pecan production.

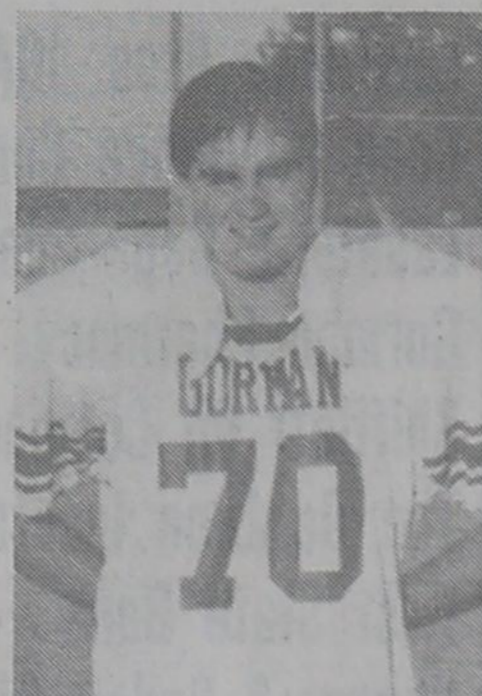
