Doing business with Social Security does not need to mean a long wait in our office, Glyn Hammons, Social Security manager in Abilene, said today.

Most Social Security questions and benefit applications can be taken care of now by telephone. Office and telephone appointment services are available too, Hammons said.

Original documents needed for an application, a child's birth certificate, for example, can be mailed to the office. We will photocopy the document for our records and mail it right back. People who prefer to bring their documents to the office can save time by calling first.

Toll-free telephone service is now available throughout the country. The telephone number to call in this area is 1-800-234-5772.

The Abilene Social Security office is located at 142 South Pioneer. The office is open weekdays from 9 to 4:30.

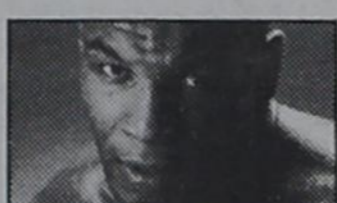

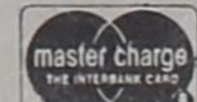

Ninety-five percent of all diving accidents in pools occur in five feet of water or less. Diving should take place in the deep end of the pool and never across the narrow end where there is not a clear dive path of at least 25 feet, say experts at the National Spa & Pool Institute (NSPI). Do not let anyone dive off the side of a diving board, slide or any other pool equipment. Never try to dive through an inner tube.


