Panthers Edged By Ranger; Travel To Bryson Friday

The Gorman Panthers started out like a bulldozer on first three possessions on Friday night against the Ranger Bulldogs at Brogdon Field, scoring 21 first quarter points, but were stymied pretty well the rest of the way as the Ranger Bulldogs adjusted their defense to hold the Panthers the rest of the way until the latter part of the fourth quarter, then scored with 1:47 remaining to edge the Panthers 32 to 28 in a real battle.

The Panthers held the Bulldogs on their first possession and received the ball on their own 45. On the first handoff of the night, Don Mauney hit off tackle and rambled 50 yards to the Ranger 5. Then Marco Herrera took a handoff for 4 yards to the one yard line. Herrera again got the call and went in from the one with 8:51 left in the first. Don Mauney kicked the point after and Gorman led 7-0.

Following the kick to Ranger the Big Red defense again held the Bulldogs and forced a punt. The Panthers took the ball on the Ranger 38 and moved the distance in just three plays. Mauney carried for 12 yards. Then after an incomplete pass, Mauney again broke loose and ran 26 yards for the score with 6:45 left in the period. Mauney booted the extra point and Gorman was up 14-0.

But on their next possession, the Bulldogs started their comeback as they started a drive on their own 34 and scored in 10 plays with Michael Linden running it in from 16 yards with 1:37 left in the period. Hildebrand kicked the point after and the score was 14-7.

On their next possession the Panthers came back with a score of their own as they took the ball on their own 36 and scored in just four plays. Mauney again broke loose for a 50 yard ramble following a 7 yard gain by Herrera. Paul Petree ran for 5 yards to set Gorman up at the Ranger two yard line. From their Mauney rammed it in for the score with just 5 seconds left in the wild first period. Mauney added the point after and Gorman held a 21-7 lead at the end of the first period.

Following the Panther score, the Bulldogs took the kick on their own 33 and moved to the Gorman 27 in 7 plays where Holdebrand kicked a 37 yard field goal with 8:02 left to make the score 21-10.

Then with three minutes left in the second period, the Bulldogs took the ball on their own 34 and scored in just four plays with Linden again getting the honors from 6 yards out. Blain Huston ran for the two pointer and the score was 21-18. This was the score at the halftime intermission.

Both the Gorman Panther Marching Band and the Ranger Band turned in outstanding performances during halftime and received standing ovations from the fans.

Following the halftime break the two teams played on fairly even terms until late in the third quarter. The Bulldogs took the ball on their own 22 and started an eight play drive that resulted in a 29 yard scamper by Linden just at the period change in the fourth. The kick failed, but the Bulldogs had a 24-21 lead.

The Panthers came right back with a drive of their own as they took the ball on their own 36 and scored in 10 plays with Mauney again getting the honors from 10 yards out to put the Panthers back in front. Mauney kicked the point after and Gorman was out front with a 28-24 lead.

The Bulldogs were not to be denied this night, however, as they took the kick on their own 20 and started an 11 play drive that killed a lot of the six minutes left on the clock

and scored on a 2 yard run by Blain Huston with 1:47 left. Huston ran for the two pointer and the Bulldogs were ahead 32-28.

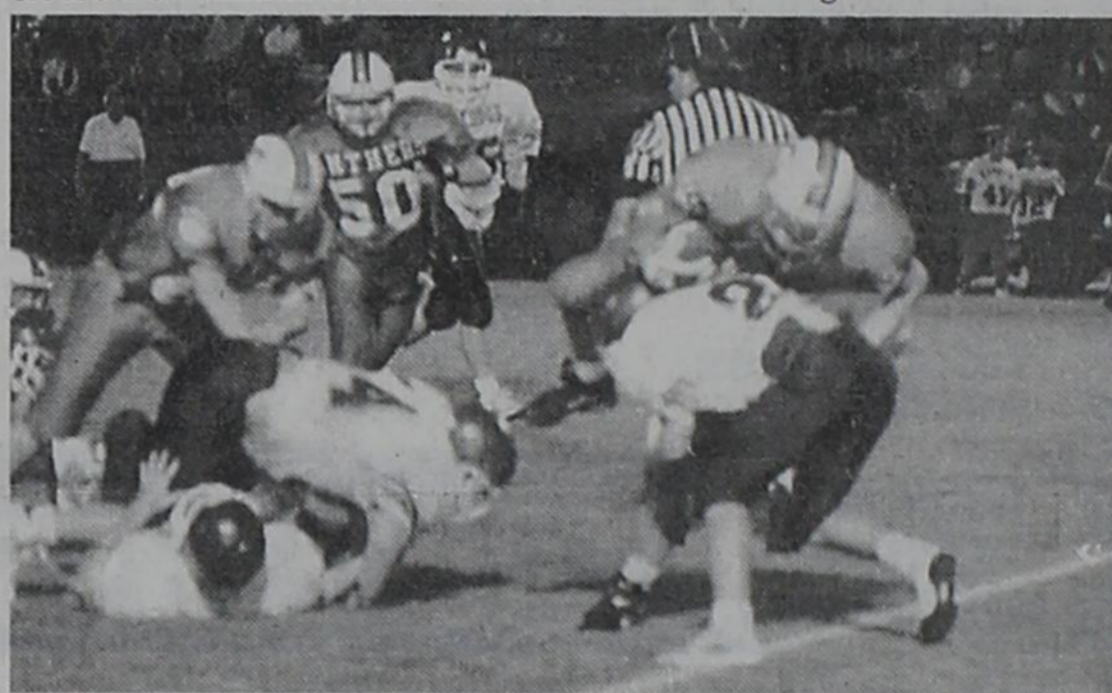
Gorman started a drive on their own 45 and moved to the Ranger 31 with time running out. With just two ticks left on the clock, Quarterback Nick Guthery lofted a last second effort for a score trying to complete a pass in the end zone. The ball was intercepted as time ran out.

This was a thrilling football game for the fans with all the offense. However, the defense on both sides left a lot to be desired. Ranger adjusted their defense in the game and did a pretty good job of shutting down the Panthers. However, the Big Red defense just couldn't stop the outstanding running of Michael Linden as he racked up big chunks of yardage all evening.

Mauney led the Panthers on the ground with 236 yards on 22 carries. Marco Herrera had 51 yards on 13 tries. Paul Petree got 20 on 4 carries.

Gorman will travel to Bryson to take on the Cowboys this Friday night in their quest for their first win of the season. Bryson has a fine team and the Panthers will really have to turn in a fine performance in this one. Let's all follow the Panthers to Bryson and show them our support.

The Gorman Junior High combined team defeated the Ranger team 23 to 16 and the Junior Varsity Panthers defeated the Bulldog JV 23-12 on Thursday night in Ranger.

In the Junior High action the Panthers scored twice in the first quarter with Francisco Madera scoring from 58 yards out for Gorman and Margarito Sanchez scoring from about 15 yards out for the second TD.

Ranger scored shortly before halftime to make the score 16-6.

Francisco scored once again in the third period when he broke loose on a 68 yard dive play for the touchdown.

Ranger scored late again in the fourth period. In the Junior Varsity action the Bulldogs struck first.

But not long afterwards, Panther Jeremy Janeczek caught a 70 yard touchdown reception from Kevin Scitern for the score, making the score 7-6. Chris Hallnad kicked the PAT.

Gorman scored again when Jeremy Brown took a handoff and raced

in from 50 yards out for the score. The two-point conversion was good when Janeczek caught a pass from Scitern.

In the second half, Gorman tackled the Ranger runner in the end zone for a two-point safety and Bryan scored once again on a 48 yard run.

Ranger scored it's final touchdown late in the fourth period.

"Our JV is showing improvement," said JV Coach Eddie Pettit. "We don't have many on the team but they like to get after it."

Ranger had the momentum to stay closer in the game but two turnovers inside the thirty halted the Bulldogs from scoring.

The next action for the Gorman teams will be on Thursday, September 22nd when Bryson comes to Gorman for games starting at 6 p. m.

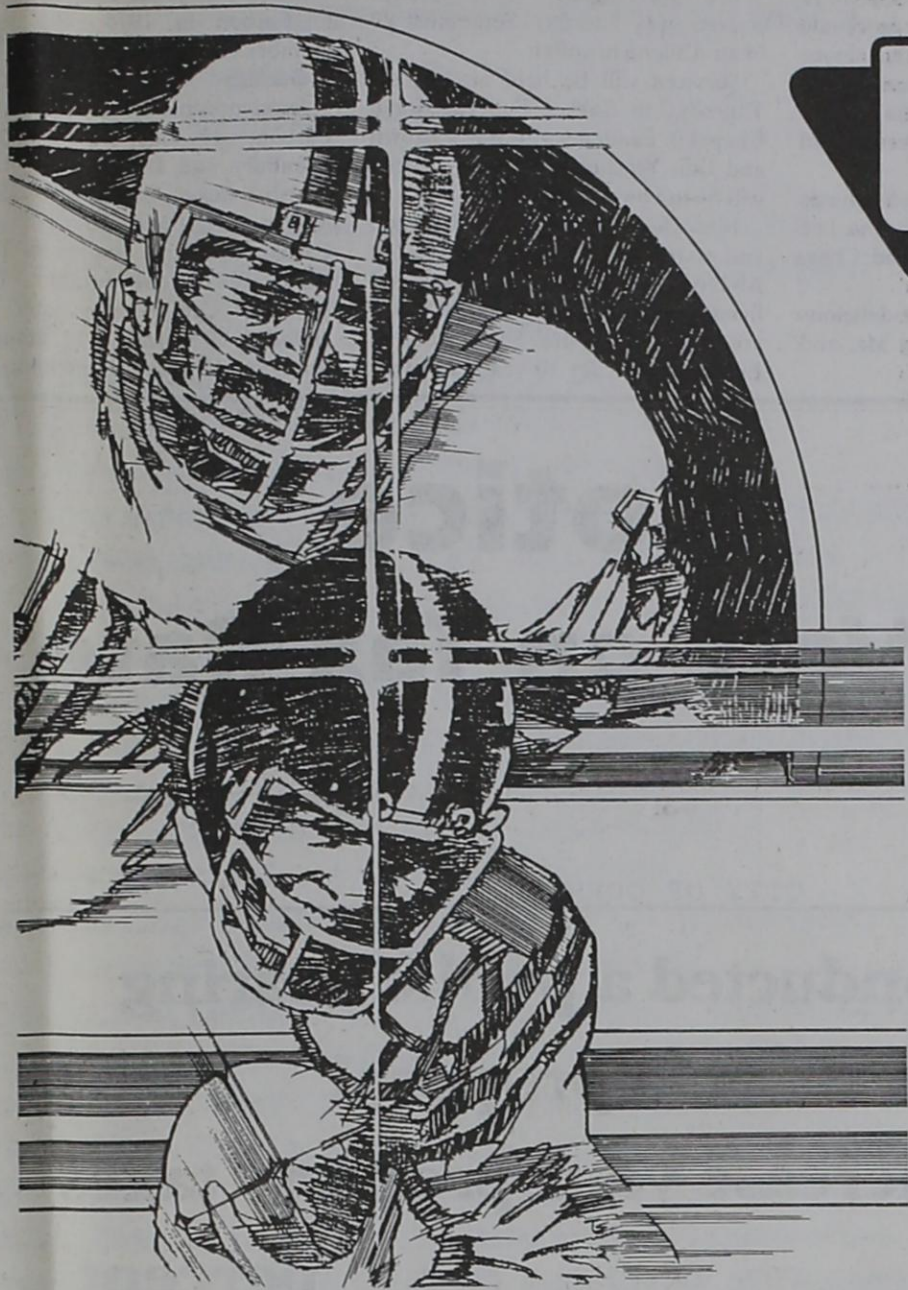

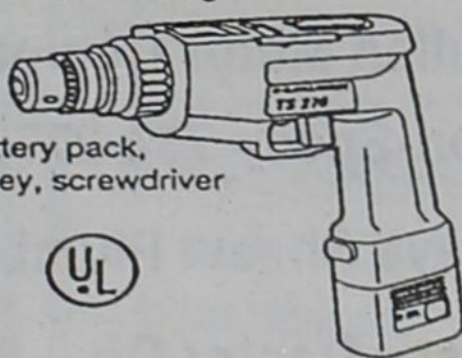
