Panthers Beat Elks 61-0; Meet Santo In Playoffs

The Gorman Panthers hosted the Evant Elks at Brogdon Field on Friday night to decide the runner-up spot in District 14A and took an overwhelming victory over the Elks as they posted 34 first half points, then added 12 in the third and 15 in the final period for the 61-0 score.

The Panthers wasted little time in showing their offensive punch as they took the kickoff on their own 47 and went the distance in 8 plays with Don Mauney getting the honors from 20 yards out with 8:22 left in the period. The drive featured runs of 7 and 10 for first downs for the Big Red before Mauney got the score. Mauney added the point after and Gorman was up 7-0.

The Big Red defense held the Elks on their first possession and got the ball on their own 20 after the punt. They moved the 80 yards in a time-consuming 14 play drive with Mauney again getting the honors from 17 yards out with 2:22 left in the first. The drive featured a 7 yard run for a first by Marco Herrera, a 10 yard run by Mauney, then two 4 yard runs for first downs by Mauney, with Paul Petree getting 9 yards for a first down at the Elk 17. Mauney booted the point after and Gorman was up 14-0.

On the following kickoff to Evant the Panthers got the ball on a fumble at the Elk 35 and scored in just three plays with Mauney again getting the honors from 10 yards out. On the first play Mauney ran for 10 and a first down. The Elks were called for a 5 yard penalty; then following an 8 yard run by Mauney, Don hit the end zone with 1:31 left. Mauney added the point after and Gorman led 21-0.

Things rocked along a bit slower in the first part of the second period, before the Big Red took the football on their own 21 and scored in six plays with Ronald Majors catching an 18 yard pass from Nick Guthery for the score with 7:27 left in the half. The drive featured runs of 34 and 22 by Marco Herrera and three shorter runs before the score. Mauney booted the point after and Gorman was up 28-0.

Gorman got on the scoreboard again in the second period with 4:41 left when Marco Herrera caught a 10 yard pass from Guthery for the TD. The kick try failed and Gorman led 34 to 0 at halftime.

Following the intermission, the Elks could not move the ball and tried a punt, which was blocked with the Panthers setting up at the Elk 25. And it took only one big fantastic play for the Panthers to score with Paul Petree grabbing a Guthery aerial for the 25 yards and a TD with 8:49 left. Again the kick try failed and Gorman led 40-0.

the Big Red defense held the Elks on their next possession and turned the ball over on a fumble at the Elk 3 yard line. From there Jeremy Sanders got the honors with 8:32 left in the third. Again the kick try failed and the score went to 46-0.

The Panther reserves played most of the second half and the Panthers took the ball on their own 49 and scored in 5 plays with Jeremy Bryan getting the honors from 11 yards out with 11:10 left on the clock. The drive featured a 29 yard run by Chris Holland. Mauney added the point after and the Panthers led 53-0.

The final score came with 1:15 left on the clock with Chris Holland run-

ning in from 1 yard out. A pass from Kevin Scitern to Marco Herrera for the two point play and the final score was 61-0.

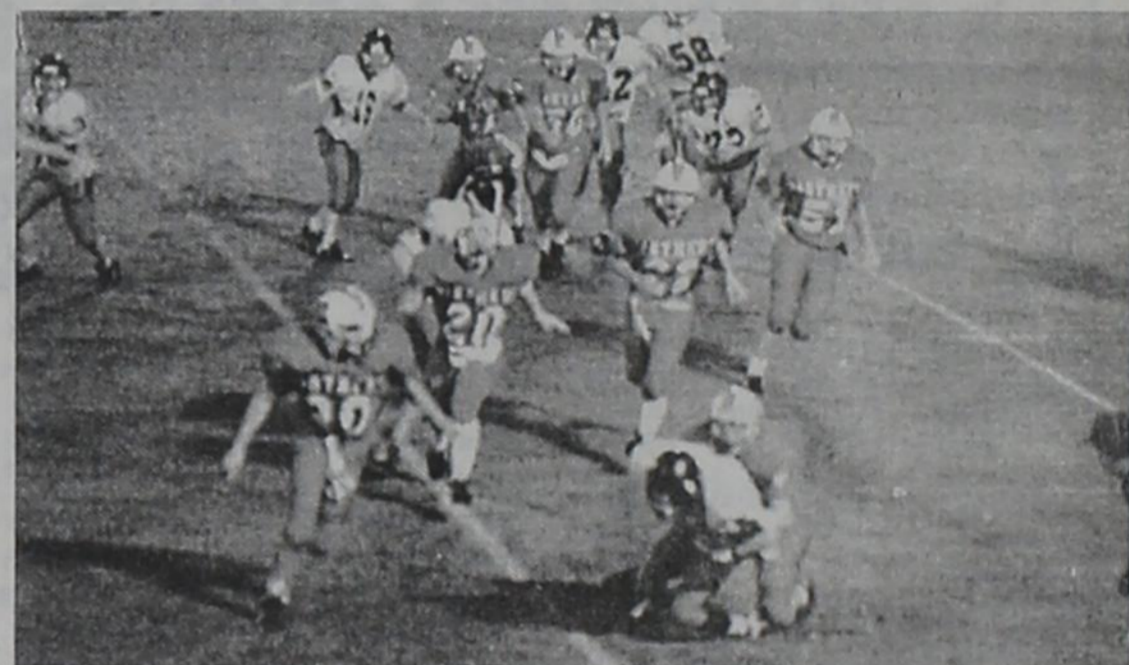
Herrera led the Panthers on the ground with 171 yards on 14 carries. He had 132 yards in the first half and carried the ball only one time for 39 in the last half. Mauney got 114 in the first half and carried only once in the last half for 4 to make his total 118 on 17 tries. Chris Holland had 48 yards on 7 carries. Paul Petree got 43 on 6 tries. Jeremy Bryan had 31 on 6 totes. Jeremy Sanders had 20 on 4 tries. Nick Guthery got 12 on 6 keepers. Kevin Scitern had 8 yards on 4 keepers at the QB spot.

Gorman took the Runner-Up spot in the playoffs with this win and will meet the Santo Wildcats at 8 p.m. Friday night at Mineral Wells. The Wildcats defeated the Panthers at the Gorman Homecoming by a 41-27 score, so the Big Red defense will have to have an outstanding effort against the Wildcats to advance in the playoffs. Let's all follow the Panthers to Mineral Wells on Friday night and back them on to victory.

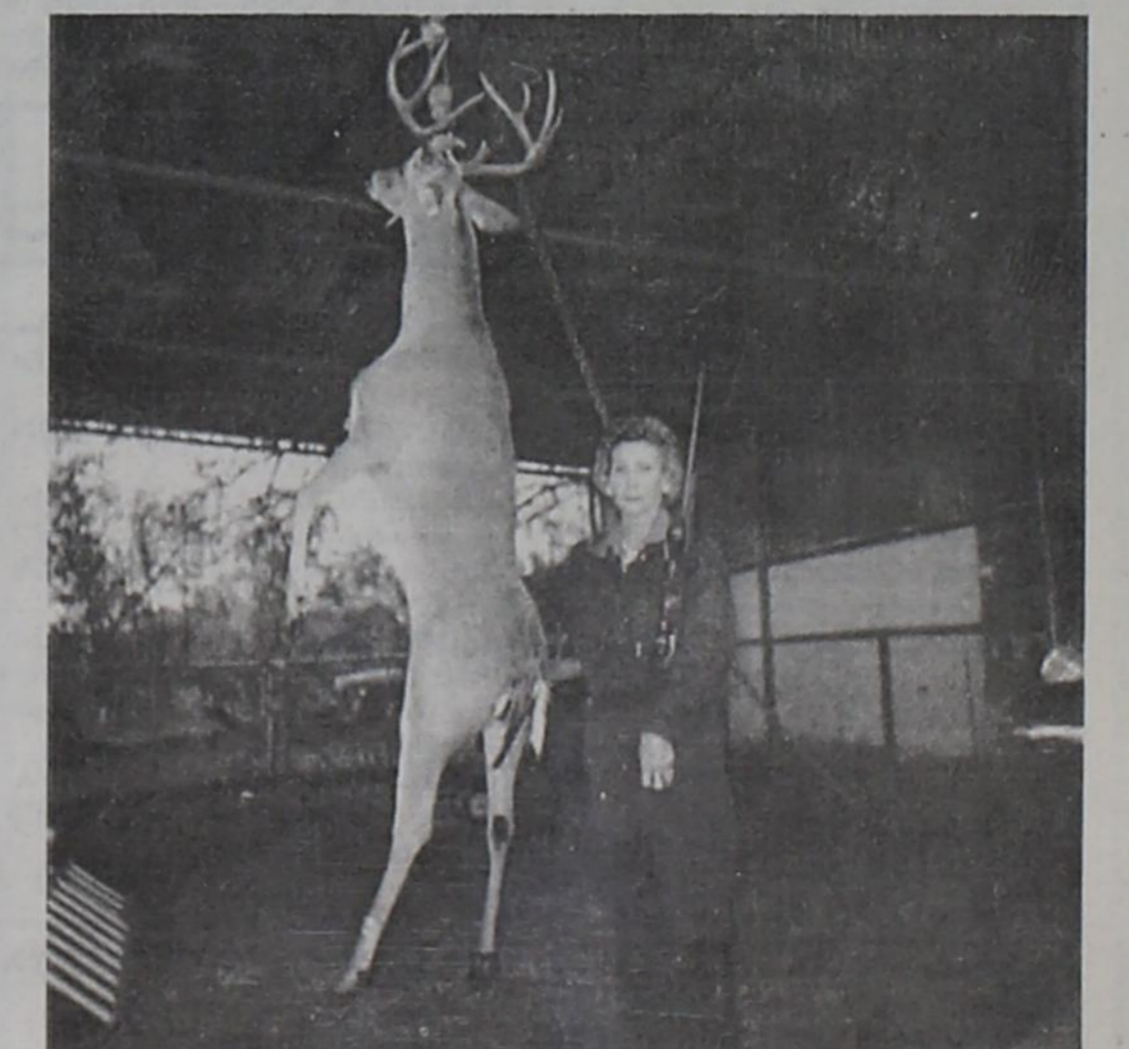

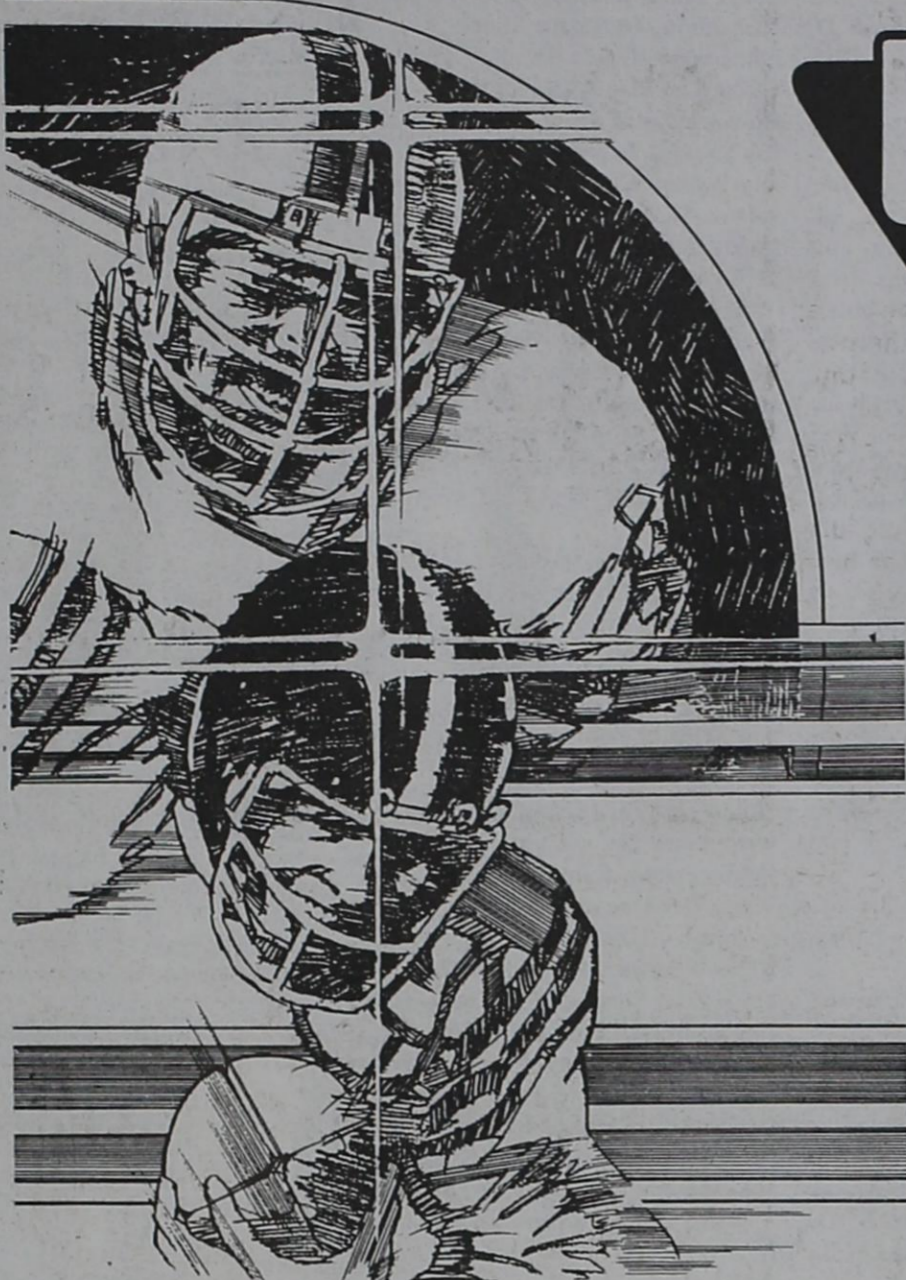
