Services Held for Juan Gutierrez

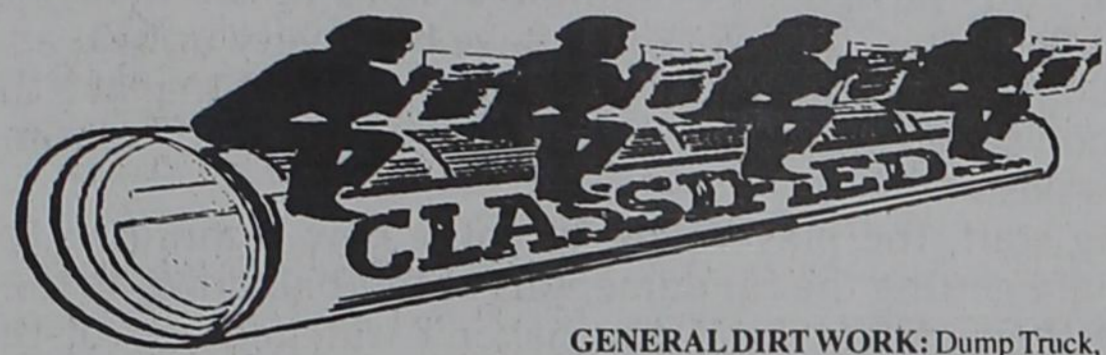
