#### Lewis - Howard - Howard Receives I at Contest Sarah and Lacy Qualifies For State in Solo and Ensemble





#### **Herbert Ronald Payne**


Herbert Ronald Payne, 72, of San Angelo, went to be with his Lord on Monday, March 17, 2003.

### **Veneman Reminds Producers** Of Important Program Dates

Agriculture Secretary Ann M. Veneman reminds owners, operators and producers that April 1, 2003, the final day to update base and yields, is fast approaching.

"The 2002 Farm Bill provides a one-time opportunity to update base and yields," Veneman said. "We encourage farm owners, operators and producers to take advantage of this opportunity by visiting their respective USDA Service Center before April 1. USDA is committed to assisting producers, and it is critical that the necessary updates are made to ensure timely payments."

USDA has monitored the sign-up progress closely and worked hard nation's eligible producers have signed up. Another 25 to 30 percent are expected to take the default option provided in the 2002 Farm Bill, leaving less than 10 percent of producers to enroll.

In some few counties across the country, the office workload is very heavy and some producers may not be able to get an appointment before the April 1 date. In that case, the producer must contact the county office and indicate the intention to sign up and obtain an appointment for as soon after April 1 as possible.

The Service Centers continue to make all possible efforts to accommodate producers prior to April 1 through a combination of extending office hours, shifting personnel among counties, and adding temporary personnel to assist with administrative functions. In those cases where appointments cannot be obtained before April 1, producers will not lose the opportunity to make the base and yield election.

Two other important dates are the March 31, 2003, deadline for peanut producers to designate their peanut base and yield information to a farm or farms, and the June 2, 2003, closing date to sign up for the 2002 and 2003 Direct and Counter-cyclical Program.




