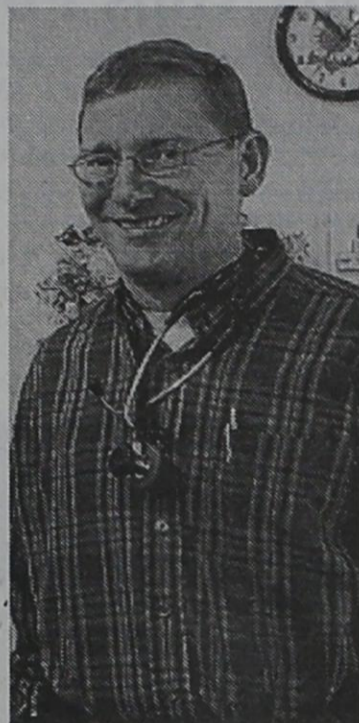

Dr. Dan Brudnak To Open Gorman Medical Clinic

Dr Dan has been making his way to Gorman since fifth grade. That's when he decided to be a doctor in order to take care of a community. He graduated from University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston on a scholarship from the United States Air Force in 1991. Dr. Red Duke was the faculty member that presented him his doctoral cape. Upon graduation he was stationed at Patrick Air Force Base and was a Flight Surgeon in Space Command supporting the Space Shuttle missions, Combat Search and Rescue missions, and Atlas, Delta and Titan missile launch missions.



After he left the Air Force he opened a family practice in Corpus Christi, TX and was asked to be the team physician for a Professional ice hockey team, the Ice Rays which he did in addition to his practice. (...Ice hockey in Corpus Christi?) He stayed in the Air Force Reserve as the Chief of Aerospace Medicine for his Reserve Squadron in Florida for a year until he transferred to the 307th RED HORSE Squadron in San Antonio as their Surgeon General.

Dr Dan has two board certifications. He is a Fellow of the American Academy of Family Practice (FAAFP), which is an advanced certification in Family Practice, and he is one of the first 70 doctors in the world to be board certified in Medical Acupuncture (DABMA). Dr Dan used his Acupuncture extensively in the Air Force on the Space operations crews and Combat Rescue pilots and crews, but he insists that acupuncture is only one of the many tools he uses to help his patients stay healthy. If you don't like needles he won't stick you.

Dr. Dan is also Advanced Trauma Life Support Certified (ATLS), an instructor in Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), a CPR instructor for the Military, and has recently been approved by the Gorman Volunteer Fire Dept. to be their Medical Director.

Dr. Dan Brudnak and his parents, Mike and Lil, live outside Gorman on their ranch with 4 dogs and 2 horses.

Gorman Medical Clinic will consist of Dr Dan and Nurse Judy, Judy Warren, and is scheduled to open about December 17 2002. The clinic will work out of Sharp imaging temporarily until the building next to the pharmacy is ready.

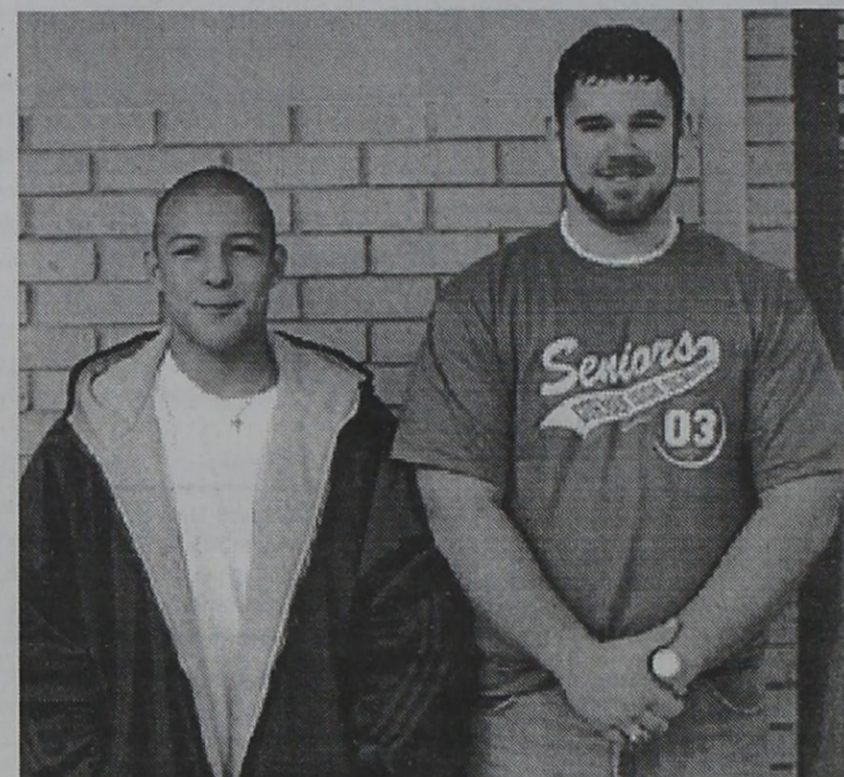

Brian Hunt and Rolly Torres were named to the Associated Press Class A All-State Football Team.

Brian made Honorable Mention at both Offensive Line and Defensive Line while Rolly made Honorable Mention as a Linebacker.

Rolly led the team this season with 127 tackles. He also recorded 6 sacks, 3 caused fumbles, 2 fumble recoveries, 1 blocked kick, 1 blocked punt, and 2 interceptions. Rolly was a big part of our defense that held opponents to 102 yds rushing per game. He helped highlight our season when our defense held the District 14-A Champion Tolar Rattlers to 50 yds total offense and -24 yds rushing.

Brian was an integral part of our offense that averaged 324 yds per game (300 rushing). Brian opened up holes on a regular basis for our backs and he recorded 39 pancake blocks on the year. Brian also play a part in our defense success. He recorded 87 tackles which included 9 for a loss and 6 sacks. He also had 3 caused fumbles, 2 fumble recoveries, and 1 safety. He was able to do all of this while often being double teamed.

Rolly and Brian served as great players and great leaders (as did all our seniors), they will be dearly missed come next football season. They definitely left some big shoes to fill. Congratulations on this prestigious honor.
