New Water Rates Set For Gorman Citizens

Upper Leon Municipal Water District, who supplies water for Gorman, has increased water rates to the City. City Commissioners voted to pass the increase to consumers.

The base rate will be \$12.50 for 1500 gallons minimum. All over will be \$3.25 per 1000 gallons. Sewer rates will increase from \$8.00 to \$8.50 minimum. All over will be \$.50 per 1000 gallons.

Rates will be effective October 1, 2002.

The Gorman Peanut Festival is looking for contestants to run in the 2002-2003 Peanut Queen Contest.

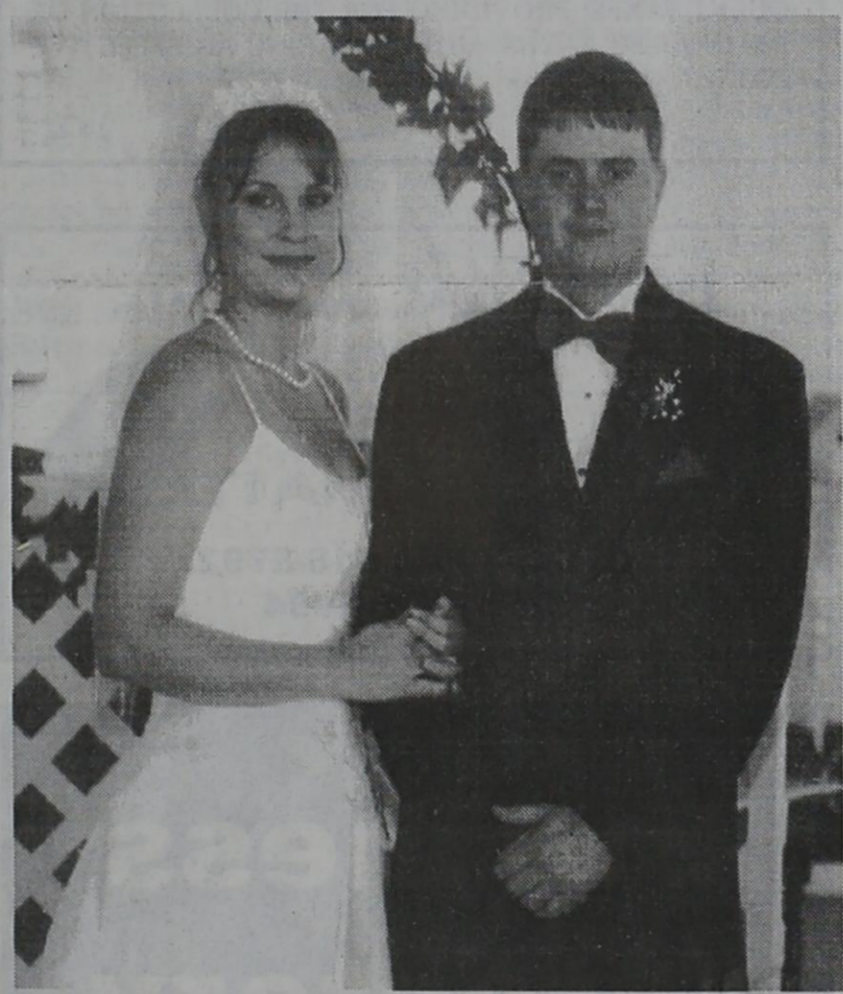

VENEMAN ANNOUNCES SIGNUP PERIOD FOR \$1.3 BILLION PEANUT BUYOUT PROGRAM

Eligible Farmers Have Two Payment Choices

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19, 2002 -- Agriculture Secretary Ann M. Veneman today announced that the signup period of the Peanut Quota Buyout Program (QBOP) as provided in the 2002 Farm Bill will begin on Sept. 3, 2002, and end Nov. 22, 2002.

Payments will be made after all program regulations have been issued.

"The 2002 Farm Bill makes significant changes in the peanut program by replacing the peanut quota system that was established in the 1930's with direct and counter-cyclical payments to eligible peanut producers," Veneman said. "USDA continues to aggressively implement the new farm bill and this announcement today is another positive step in that regard."

Generally, to be eligible for the QBOP, a person must have owned 2001 basic peanut quota as of May 13, 2002. Eligible persons will receive a QBOP payment of \$0.11 per quota pound owned in five equal installments or a lump sum payment of \$0.55 per pound. Eligible quota holders have the option to elect to receive either a lump sum payment or five equal installments.

Letters were sent to producers in July asking them to update their peanut acreage history and yield information with USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA). The information will be used to determine each peanut producer's peanut base and yield for direct and counter-cyclical peanut payments for 2002 through 2007 under the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002, the 2002 Farm Bill. Peanut quota holders on record in their local Farm Service Agency (FSA) office will soon be notified by letter of their potential quota buyout eligibility.



Keeping an Eye on Texas

Pecan tree watering tips

During the hot summer months, it is important to make sure pecan trees get enough moisture to ensure a decent fall crop. Irrigation is essential for consistent production of quality nuts on bearing trees. Water regularly from mid-March through September, applying at least 1 inch of water each week. And during the Summer, pecan trees may need up to two inches per week. One good soaking per week is much better than lightly watering two or three times a week.

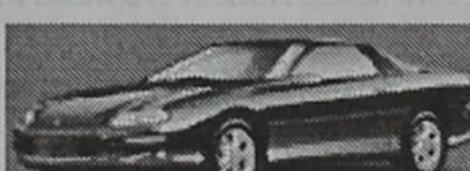
