


Supper Slated March 8





Three Defendants Sentenced To Prison Time

Last week, a petit jury sitting in the 91st District Court convicted and sentenced Clay Perez Savala, 26, for rying of a Firearm by a Felon. Savala, formerly of San Angelo, was assessed ten years confinement in prison and fined \$2,500 by an Eastland County sented by D.P.S. Trooper Jason Shea. Judge Steven Herod presided.

In addition, Presiding Judge Steven Herod Sentenced Kevin Joseph Carpino, 37, of Cisco, to twenty years confinement for the offense of Burglary of Habitation. Mr. Carpino was also sentenced to fifteen years in prison for separate forgeries of checks taken in the burglary. Larry Weikel of Cisco Police Department was instrumental in conducting a thorough investigation which resulted in the lengthy sentences.

Ending the week, Hector Saenz Castillo, of Dallas, received a ten year prison sentence for Possession of a Controlled Substance, Methamphetamine, and must also serve the maximum amount of confinement for a misdemeanor DWI. Judge Steven Herod presided over the drug charge while County Judge Brad Stephenson sentenced Castillo for the DWI. Criminal District Attorney Russ Thomason credited D.P.S. Troopers Bryan Sheridan and Timothy Falkner stating, "Their (the Troopers) excellent investigation and report made the convictions and sentences of Castillo make Valentines a special day possible.

Another jury was selected to hear testimony in a cast in the 91st District Court beginning February 26, 2003 at 9:00 a.m. This case will involve an allegation of assault against two public servants.
