The new farm bill, changes in insurance coverages, new technologies in peanut farming—It is these and other challenges to peanut production that will be addressed at a multi-county Peanut Shortcourse to be held Tuesday, February 11. Growers from throughout the Cross Timbers including Erath, Comanche and Eastland counties along with the scattered growers in Brown and Callahan counties will join together as a group to address grower concerns and issues. The Cross Timbers Peanut Shortcourse will be held on Tuesday, February 11, 2003 at the DeLeon City Auditorium on Hwy 16 in DeLeon. The program will start at 9:00 a.m. with registration and then get underway at 9:30 a.m. There is no cost to attend but participants are asked to preregister by calling their local Extension office or 915/356-2539. A sponsored lunch will be served and 1 pesticide credit in IPM will be offered to private, non-commercial and commercial applicators.

Individuals with disabilities who require an auxiliary aid, service or accommodation in order to participate in this program are encouraged to contact Texas Cooperative Extension in Comanche County at 915/356-2539 to determine how reasonable accommodations can be made.

What would it cost you to start producing peanuts in Central Texas? What would it cost to grow peanuts if you owned quota? Can you afford to grow additional? What changes will there be in the peanut insurance program and how will it affect 2003 production? To discuss the economics of peanut production and Federal Crop Insurance program, Dr. Ken Stokes, Extension Economist, Texas A&M Center - Stephenville will lead off the Peanut Shortcourse. Ken has been very influential in helping form peanut program and insurance policy.

Dr. Chip Lee, Extension Plant Pathologist will bring an update on fungicides growers can use in 2003 including some new changes and the new labels and labeling and Dr. Charles Simpson, Peanut Researcher will talk about the newest peanut varieties including how they perform under less than ideal conditions and give us an update on progress in peanut breeding programs for the future. Dr. Simpson will be retiring this month and the industry will lose a tremendous resource.

Following Dr. Simpson will be Dan Hunter, Manager, Southwestern Peanut Growers Association. Dan will give growers a "Peanut Program Update" and discuss what growers can expect in 2003 and beyond.

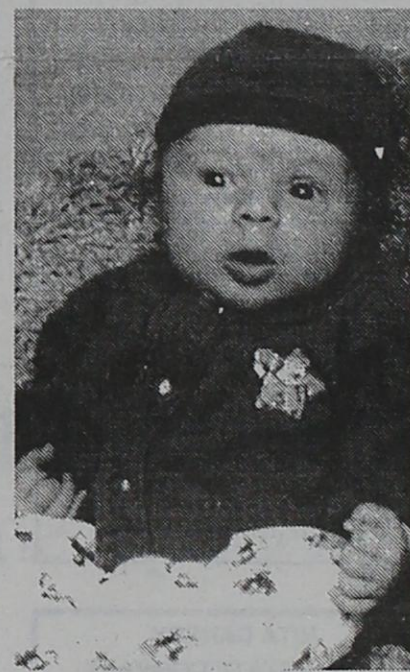

Minutes of the Gorman EDC from January 13th

The Gorman Economic Development Corporation held its monthly board meeting on Monday January 13, 2003. In attendance were Alex Granado, Mark Simmons, Karen Pena, Judy Warren and Director Lori Dodd. The meeting was called to order by Vice President Judy Warren at 5:45 PM.

First order of business was to elect a new Secretary of the Board. Motion was made by Karen Pena to have Alex Granado fill that position. Second by Mark Simmons, motion carried 4-0.

Minutes were read, motion made to approve minutes by Mark Simmons, second by Alex Granado. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion to approve the bills for payment made by Karen Pena, second by Mark Simmons, motion carried 4-0.

Lori Dodd gave an update on Stewart Parnell's business returning to Gorman. There will be a public hearing for a Capital Improvement Fund loan in February. He should have possession of the building by the end of February and begin improvements, barring any unforeseen problems.

Texas Economic Development Council will be hosting a mandatory training for EDC directors, board members, and city officials. The 77th Legislature mandated training for all directors, boards, and city officials to receive training if that city collected a 4A or 4B state sales tax. This training will be in Abilene, Lori and Bill Mearns will be attending, but it was unknown if the Mayor or City Secretary would be at this training.

Lori presented an amended budget for 2002-2003 fiscal year for the EDC. Motion to amend made by Mark Simmons, second by Alex Granado, motion carried 4-0.

Lori wrote a grant to submit to the Tocker Foundation for the Library. It will purchase new furniture for the computers we will be receiving for TIF. Award date is March 15.


Old Business — Final report on the EDC garage sale efforts was over

\$400. Those funds will be added to the existing Special Account for the Medical clinic. A donation from Sharp Imaging for \$500 puts the account at approximately \$1000. The grant match must be at least \$15,000 to apply. The grant is due May 31, 2003. The EDC will work on other fundraising ideas to help raise the money for a medical clinic and Dr. Dan. Judy will check on prices from Cooks and Lori will check with ZJs to possibly host a catfish dinner and Karen will check on items for a silent auction.

Lori turned in the final report to WCTCOG regarding the chipper we received in April. There was a problem with COG concerning lack of use, but board concluded to let the City Commission handle it since it does not deal directly with economic development.

There was no new business to discuss. Motion to adjourn was made by Karen Pena, second by Mark Simmons, motion carried 4-0. Meeting adjourned at 6:50 PM

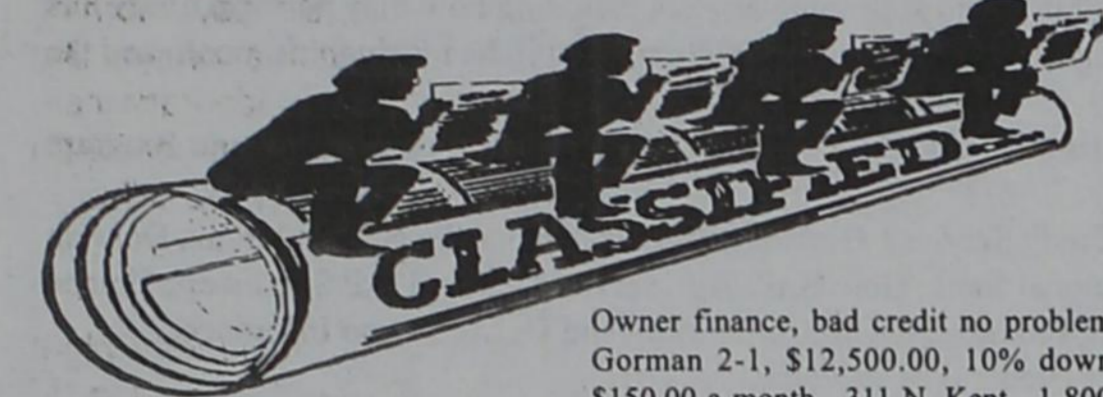

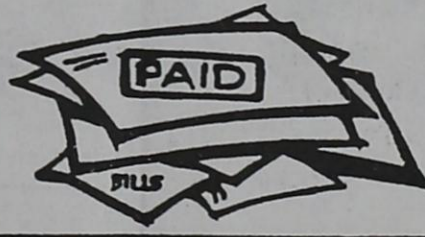
