

Early Childhood Intervention

Gorman ISD would like to make parents aware that on February 26, 2003 a developmental screening will be held for young children ages zero to three (0-3). Early Childhood Intervention will conduct this screening at the Center for Life Resources, 301 Pogue Avenue, in Eastland from 9:30 am to 11:30 am.

The Denver Developmental Screening, which takes about 20 minutes to complete, tests a young child for four areas; personal/ social skills, fine motor skills, gross motor skills and language development. If a child is found to have two or more delays in one area, there is further testing available through Early Childhood Intervention or referral to the appropriate agency.

The purpose of Early Childhood Intervention is to identify and correct as many problems as possible for young children. Early detection of young children's delays has proven beneficial to the child, parents, and teachers.

> A motion presented by Jeff Seaton called for an election for two board positions on May 3, 2003. The two positions open are currently held by Bob Powell and Freddie Gilmore who is filling the term for Windell Treadway who resigned this past summer. The board also appointed Sandra Osborne as the election judge. Candidates can file for the position by picking up an application at the Superintendent's office during regular school hours and returning the completed application by March 19.

> Mrs. Betty Morris, textbook coordinator, recommended that the board approve all texts on the Social Studies textbook list and the board approved the recommendation. Ronny Wright presented the board with a revised Gifted and Talented plan, which was approved, and the board approved the Technology plan for 2004 - 2006 as recommended by the GISD Technology Committee.

> The board discussed the item of purchasing two charter type busses to be used for transporting students on extracurricular and co-curricular trips at length. Mr. Vann reported to the board in October that ABC Bus Sales of Grand Prairie was offering charter type busses for sale at a very reasonable price. Mr. Vann along with Ron Childers, Ronny Wright, and Freddie Gilmore traveled to Grand Prairie to view the busses. Mr. Vann reported that the busses would be reconditioned busses with new paint and decals, new tires, and an auxiliary air system. The busses would also undergo a complete inspection of the brakes, fluids, and air system. After weighing the facts, the board voted to approve the purchase of the two busses for 19,500 each. The price of the bus is less that half of the price of a new school bus. Once the busses arrive in March, the current activity bus will be placed one of the daily routes replacing one of the older busses.

> Each February the board makes a decision on renewing contracts for the campus principals and the athletic director. Bob Powell made the motion to renew Betty Morris's contract and Melinda Harrington made the motion to approve Ronny Wright's contract. Both motions passed unanimously. The final action taken by the board was the approval of Coby Tyson as the athletic director for 2003-2004.


Paul A. Jones



Earned Income Tax Credit

The Texas economy would get a \$3 billion boost if nearly two million Texas families who qualify for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) claim the credit on their federal Income tax returns.

EITC refunds vary, depending on family income and the number of qualifying children in the family. To claim the credit, the internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires families to meet specific eligibility requirements and have a valid social security number for every qualifying family member.

Taxpayers who expect to qualify for the EITC in 2003 and have at least one qualifying child may sign up at work to receive part of the credit in each paycheck, instead of waiting for a tax refund
