

Panthers To Host Hico After Loss To Baird

The Gorman Panthers opened the season at Baird on Friday night and came out on the short end of a 27-7 score. The Panthers had trouble with turnovers all night as they turned over the ball 5 times and could just never get good sustained drives completed as they would lose the ball on fumbles or pass interceptions deep in Baird territory.

The first Baird score came on a return of an intercepted pass at the Baird 5 yard line when Kirt Harle got the interception and raced 95 yards for the score with 2:13 left in the first period. Ben Barron booted the point after and Baird led 7-0.

Then following a Panther turnover at the Gorman 38 the Bears moved the distance in just 2 plays with Donny Strause getting a pass from Kirt Harle for 18 yards for the TD with 2:23 left in the second. Again Barron kicked the extra point and the Bears were up 14-0. This score held up through the first half.

The Panther Marching Band and the Baird Band put on a very fine performances at halftime.

Following the intermission the Panthers came out fired up and took the ball on their own 29 and went the distance in 13 plays with Paul Petree getting the honors on a 14 yard pass from Nick Guthery with 5:07 left in the third. The drive featured first down runs of 15 by Guthery and 16 and 15 yards by Marco Herrera and a 3 yarder by Paul Petree. Justin Snider kicked the point after and the score was 14-7.

But the Bears came right back and drove 18 yards in just 4 plays after again recovering a Panther fumble at the Gorman 18. Barron kicked the point after and Baird led 21 to 7 with 7:55 left in the third period.

The teams played on fairly even terms until the final 35 seconds of the

game when the Bears got the ball on their own 10 yard line and scored in just 3 plays with Kirt Harle rolling out on a keeper play and tossing to R. J. Calzo who raced the final 70 yards for the score to cover 82 yards. The kick for point failed and the final score was 27-7.

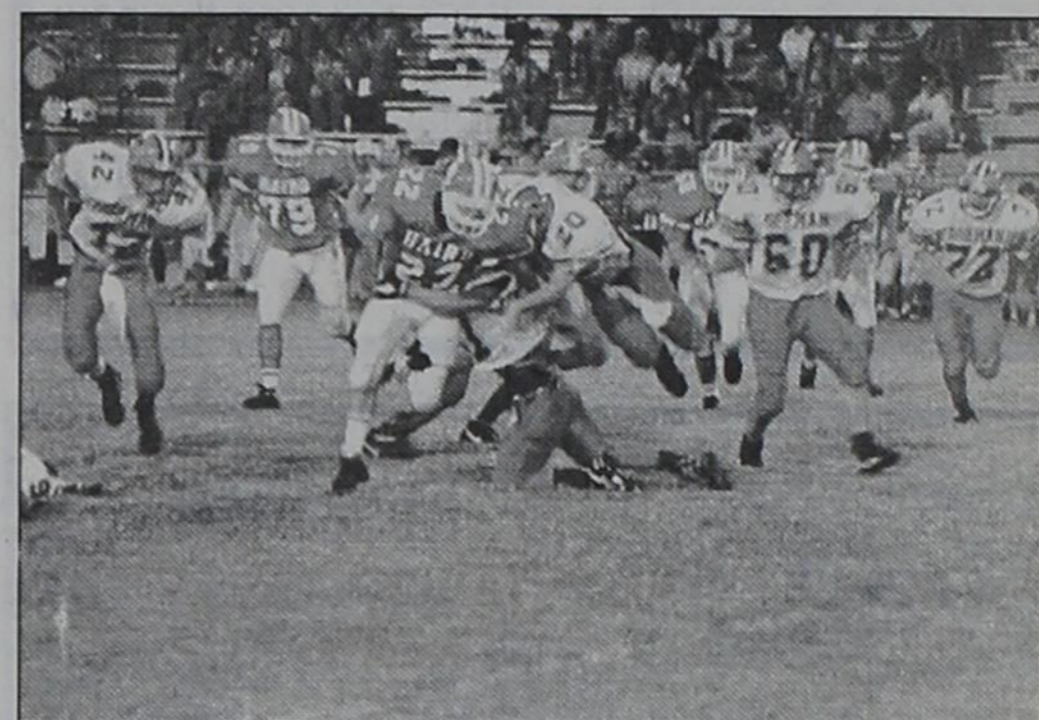
Marco Herrera led the Big Red 95 yards in 15 carries, but was injured early in the game and had to leave the game. Paul Petree had 50 yards on 18 carries. Margarita Sanchez got 15

yards on 6 tries. Josh Hampton was -6 on two reverse plays. Guthery was -13 on 7 keepers, being tackled for losses on 3 pass tries.

The Big Red defense did pretty good except for letting down on a few big plays. But the turnovers is what really hurt the Panthers.

The Panthers will host the Hico Tigers at Brogdon Field on Friday night at 8 p.m. and hope to rebound from the opening loss.

Recipe Follows:
3 eggs seperated 3 tbsp. oleo
2 cups milk 3/4 tsp salt
1/2 cup granulated sugar
1/4 cup corn starch 1tsp. vanilla

Cook as any Cream pie filling.
3/4 powdered sugar
1/3 cup peanut butter (I use crunchy) mix until crumbly, sprinkle into baked pie shell, (reserve enough to sprinkle on top of meringue).

Pour Crem pie filling over peanut butter mix.

Beat egg whites until foamy add 1/4 tsp. Cream of tartar, beat until peaks. Add 1/2 cup sugar slowly and beat until stiff, pile on top of Cream filling. Sprinkle remaining peanut butter mix on top. Brown in 375 degree oven.
