The Gorman Lion's Club will host a community blood drive on Monday, September 8. The Meek Blood Center Bloodmobile will be at the City Park from 1 p.m. until 6 p.m. Meek Blood Center supplies blood to sixteen medical facilities in the Texas Midwest.

Each pint of blood donated can save up to three lives, according to a Meek Blood Center spokesperson. Those who may need blood or blood products include cancer patients, surgical patients, premature babies, obstetric patients, accident or trauma victims and patients with blood disorders.


Blood donors must be at least 17 years of age, weigh at lease 110 pounds and in good health. Aspirin, and most maintenance medications including blood pressure, cholesterol, thyroid, hormones and anti-depressants are acceptable. There are some restrictions regarding some medications, certain medical conditions and some travel areas outside the U.S. Those who have questions regarding donor eligibility may call 325-670-2805. Donors are asked to eat a meal and to drink plenty of fluids prior to giving blood.

Each donor will receive a mug and a complimentary total cholesterol reading. Cholesterol results may be obtained two days after the blood drive by calling 325-670-2799.




He served in the U.S. Army, was a nursery worker as a tree surgeon for many years, and a retired cedar cutter.





"Cancer Does Not Stop For Nighttime."

RELAY FOR LIFE starts at dusk and ends at the next day's morning. The light and darkness of the day and night parallel the physical effects, emotion, and mental state of a cancer line until we find a cure. patient while undergoing treatment.

The RELAY begins when the sun is setting. This symbolizes the time that the person has been diagnosed as having cancer. The day is getting darker and this represents the cancer patient's state of mind as they feel that their life is coming to an end.

As the evening goes on it gets colder and darker, just as the emotions of the cancer patient does. Around 1:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. represents the time when the cancer patient starts treatment. They become exhausted, some sick, not wanting to go on, possibly wanting to give up. As a participant, you have been walking and feel much the same way. You are tired, want to sleep, maybe even want to go home, but you cannot stop or give up.

Around 4:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. symbolizes the coming of the end of treatment for the cancer patient. Once again they are tired, but they know they will make it.

The sun rising represents the end of treatment for the cancer patient. They see the light at the end of the tunnel and know that life will go on. The morning light brings on a new day full of life and excitement for new beginnings for the cancer patient. As a participant, you will feel the brightness of the morning and know that the end of the RELAY is close at hand.







ORDINANCE #2003 - 03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GORMAN, TEXAS, LEVYING TAXES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2003 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2004: PROVIDING DISCOUNTS FOR ADVANCE PAYMENT OF AD VALOREM TAXES; PROVIDING PENALTY AND INTEREST FOR DELINQUENT TAXES; PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION OF DELINQUENT TAXES; AND DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, notice of a Regular meeting with the adoption of a tax rate was duly posted on the

WHEREAS, a Regular meeting was duly held at the time and place as provided for in the notice of such meeting and all interested persons were given opportunities to be heard on said tax rate; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary, at this time, that said ordinance be passed levying taxes on all property, both Real and Personal, within the City of Gorman, Texas, in accordance with such budget and all requirements of Article 7244c RCS of the State of Texas have been complied with:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GORMAN, TEXAS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That there is hereby levied, and there shall be collected for the use and support of the municipal government of the City of Gorman, Texas, for the year 2003 upon all property within the corporate limits of the City of Gorman, Texas, subject to taxation for the year 2003, a tax at the rate of .62336 on each One Hundred and no/100 (100.00) valuation of property to be assessed and collected for the purposes hereinafter stipulated, to-wit,

Section 2: All taxpayers shall be allowed discounts for the payment of 2003 ad valorem taxes due to the City of Gorman, Texas, said discounts to be allowed under the following conditions:

(a) Three percent (3%) discount on ad valorem taxes due to the City of Gorman, if same are paid within the

(b) Two percent (2%) discount if such taxes are paid in the month of November, 2003. (c) One percent (1%) discount if such taxes are paid in the month of December, 2003.

Section 3: The general laws of Texas, and all provisions of Article 7336, and the Title 122 of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, and all amendments thereto, relating to the date of delinquency, penalties, interest, cost, and the collection of delinquent taxes, insofar as such provisions may be applicable in connection with the collection of all taxes assessed and levied by the City of Gorman, Texas, for the year 2003, are hereby referred to and

Section 4: This ordinance shall take effect and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.




