




James A. Boucher

Pioneers On The Frontier The second of a series of programs on the legends and history of Desdemona, Texas, will be held on Thursday, July 24th from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Desdemona Community center, the former high-school building, located on FM 8. Sixty residents of the Eastland, Erath, and Comanche counties attended the first of the series programs.

The July program will emphasize area springs and water sources, that attracted Native Americans and pioneers. Nineteenth century settlements of immigrants from the old southern states in the Desdemona area include Ellison Springs near Gorman, Blair Fort on Hog Creek, and McGough Springs at Lake Leon, and Mansker Lake near present day Alameda. These territories, today, are in the upper Leon River water shed.

William Carson McGough settled McGough Springs by 1858. Today, the site of the settlement is accessible only by boat, since Lake Leon is engulfed the springs.

J.M. Ellison erected a cabin near Ellison Springs in October of 1854. Lillian He married Eliza McGough in 1858. During the civil war, a militia company was formed at the Ellison home location. On August 9, 1864, six members of the militia were killed by Indians and Ellison was disabled for lift. A small lake formed by the springs is four miles northeast of Gorman, near the Ellison Springs cemetery. The Ellisons joined other families and forted up near Hog Creek at Desdemona through the Civil War, 1861-1865. The family fort was called Blair Fort, and was named after founders Charles Culpepper Blair and Meekie Reeves Blair who arrived in the area by 1858. The fort later became an established stop on the Old Waco to Fort Griffin road.

> The program on July 24th will open with entertainment by J.W. "Junior" Trice, of Dublin. Descendants of pioneers attending the program will be recognized. A pioneer story of a trip from Alabama to McGough Springs will be read by Ray Brazell, Desdemona. A descendent of McGough's W.C. McGough, Sr. of Eastland, hopes to attend with family stories.

> Other speakers about pioneers on the frontier will include Mrs. Clyde Buchan Wright of DeLeon, an Ellison descendent. Mrs. Frances Stubblefield Bishop of Eastland will discuss Alameda's historical significance. Mr. Raymond Lindley, of Desdemona, will close the program with a first-hand account of the Duke Oil Well fire in 1918.





FDA to prohibit the re-importation of drugs into the U.S. "I hear all the time from seniors who are forced to choose between buying groceries and paying for medicines their doctors prescribe for them," Stenholm added. "We must work to bring greater competition to the prescription drug marketplace in order to reduce the price of medicines for all Americans, especially seniors."

It now is up to the U.S. Senate to approve similar legislation. Then the House and Senate must agree on identical language, before a final version of the agriculture appropriations bill can be sent to the President to sign into law.


