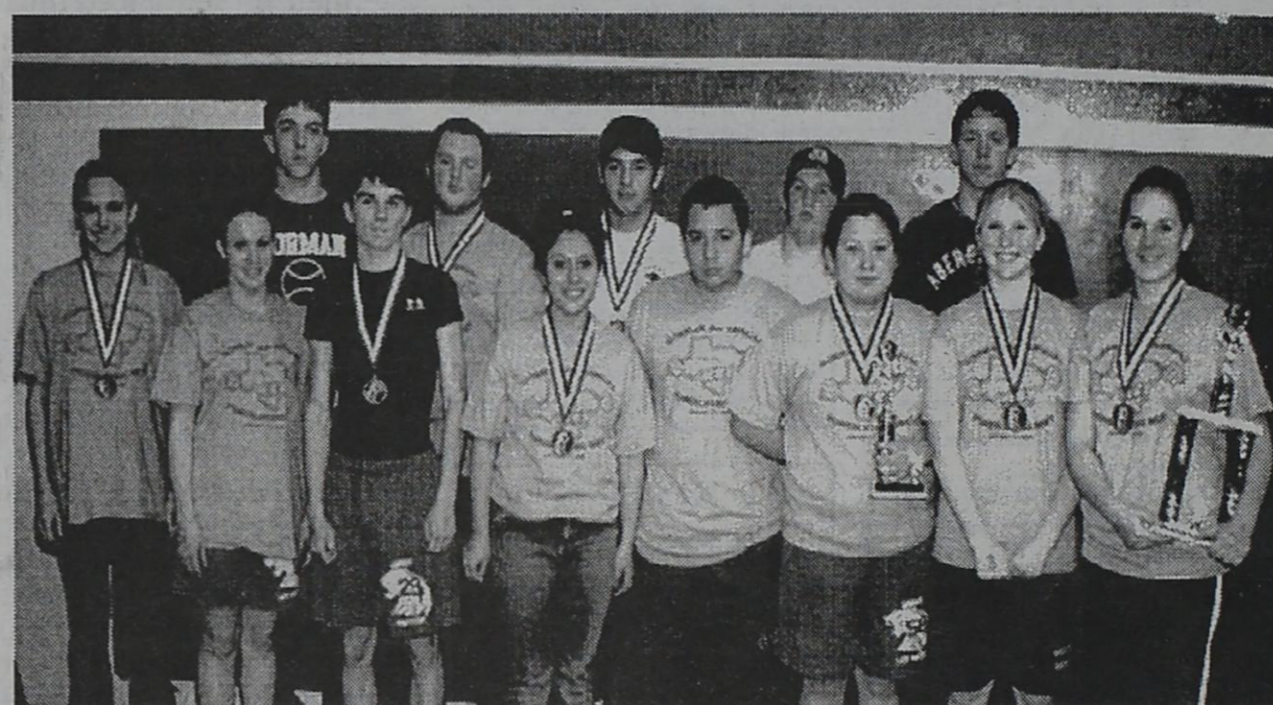

## Lady Panthers Finish Second - Panthers Finish Fourth At Gorman Powerlifting Meet

The Gorman Athletic Department hosted the 2nd Annual Gorman Powerlifting Meet on January 17th. The Athletic Department would like to thank the Athletic Booster Club for the work they did in helping run off the meet as well as all the coaches and volunteer workers that gave their time to put on a quality meet. We would also like to thank Dr. Pepper, City Grocery, Pro Maxima, and all those who donated food, refreshments, and/or your time. There were over 100 lifters that competed in the meet and 10 schools that were represented. Just as last year, the meet ran smooth and the athletes competed well. For those that don't know, the athletes get 3 attempts at 3 stations of lifts. They begin with the Squat, move on to the Bench, and the competition ends with the Deadlift. They must get a good lift on at least one attempt at each station. Their best lifts at each station are added for their overall total.

The Lady Panthers finished second overall behind Clyde HS which had 11 girl lifters. The Lady Panthers had 6 lifters which included Amanda Naeseth, Brittany Shirley, Sandra Lara, Nikki Keith, Kendra Swanner, and Summer Olvera. Amanda Naeseth took second place in the 114 lb division with a total of 440 lbs. Brittany Shirley finished 6th in the 123 lb division with a total of 340 lbs. Sandra Lara took first in the 132 lb division with a total of 440 lbs while Nikki Keith took second in that same division with a total of 425 lbs. Kendra Swanner finished first place in the 165 lb division with a total of 560 lbs. Summer Olvera rounded out the scoring with a first place finish in the 198 lb division with a total of 725 lbs. Summer also received the award for Outstanding Lifter of the Girls Heavyweight Divisions.

The Panther Powerlifting Team finished 4th behind Clyde, Eastland, and Strawn. The boys team consisted of Ryan Wright, Clint Jones, Scott Lewis, Pete Ramirez, Tim Guerra, Zach Bryan, and J.T. Whitfill. Ryan Wright finished 2nd



in the 114 lb division with a 650 lb total. Clint Jones finished 10th in the 165 lb division with a 700 lb total. Scott Lewis took 7th in the 181 lb division with a 785 lb total while Pete Ramirez finished 9th in that same division with a 685 lb total. Tim Guerra took 1st place in the 165 lb division with a total of 1005 lbs. Zach Bryan finished 6th in the 181 lb division with a total of 825 lbs. J.T. Whitfill took 1st place in the 275 lb division with a total of 1080 lbs.
