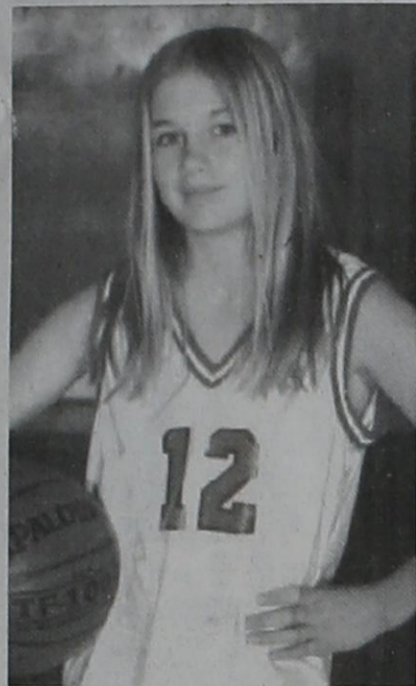

The Gorman Athletic Department will be having physicals for all incoming 7th- 12th graders that plan to participate in athletics for the 2004-2005 school year, as well as any 6th grade boys who plan to play football for our Junior High team if the numbers permit so on the first day. These physicals will be held at Dr Dan Brudnak's office located downtown next to the drug store. These physicals will be from 9:00 am til 12:00 pm on July 14th only. The cost of the physical is free if you attend during this time. We would like to thank Dr. Brudnak for his generosity and dedication to Gorman ISD.

It is important to note that the Gorman Athletic Department requires new physicals on our athletes every year. Last year's physical will not work. A letter has been sent to all athletes with the UIL physical forms that are required to be used. If you did not receive this letter by the day of the physicals, we will have a few extra copies at the doctor's office. Please fill out the forms completely front and back and sign in all pertinent places. Project ChildSafe Reaches all 50 States With Key Firearm Safety Materials

NEWTOWN, Conn. - Project ChildSafe, the nation's largest firearm safety education program, has encouraged millions of gun owners to practice safe and responsible firearm ownership and storage since it began distributing gun lock safety kits eight months ago. The program, which has been to 49 states and will arrive in Hawaii-the 50th state-in June, has distributed over 12 million free firearm safety kits so far. Each firearm safety kit includes a cable-style gun lock and a safety brochure that discusses safe firearm handling and proper storage practices.

Project ChildSafe is funded by a \$50 million grant from the U.S. Department of Justice and is managed by the National Shooting Sports Foundation (NSSF). The program, designed to make homes with firearms safer, will distribute an additional eight million safety kits throughout the nation during the spring and summer of 2004. The safety kits are made available to gun owners free of charge through participating local law enforcement agencies nationwide.

"This is truly a monumental milestone for firearm safety and education," said Doug Painter, president of the NSSF. "Project ChildSafe has reached over 13,000 communities with its important

firearm safety message."

Project ChildSafe has partnered with governors, lieutenant governors, U.S. Attorneys, mayors and local law enforcement agencies across the country to distribute this massive number of safety kits. The program will continue to work with these officials and organizations as it continues distribution during the remainder of 2004 and into next year.

Project ChildSafe is a component of Project Safe Neighborhoods, a gun-violence prevention initiative of the US Department of Justice and the Bush Administration. 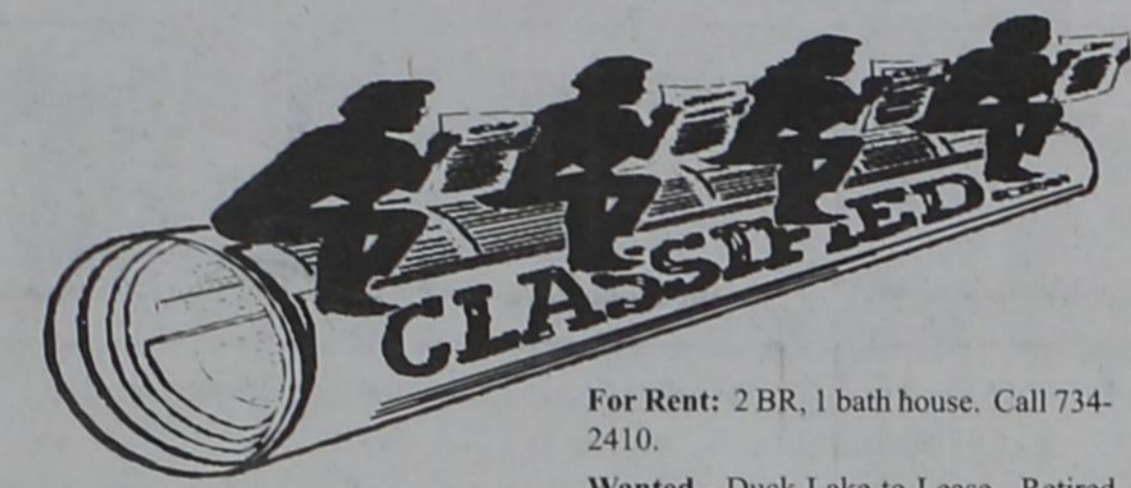

SUBJECT: Violation of Ordinance No. 302
An Ordinance to protect the public health and welfare of the City of Gorman

RE: Property At: 300 W. Lexington St.

Dear Mrs. Smith:

Ordinance No. 302, requires that any occupied or unoccupied lot or parcel of land, or any part thereof, in the city be maintained free from accumulations of weeds, trash, garbage, solid waste, unwholesome matters and any other objectionable, unsightly, or unsanitary matter of whatsoever shall exist. This same area shall be declared a public nuisance, and the prompt removal of such is hereby declared a public necessity. Any such nuisance shall be removed from the property by the owner or other person in possession or control of such property.

The above referenced lot has been classified under this Ordinance as being in violation and you are hereby notified that you have a period of SEVEN (7) DAYS, from the receipt of this letter, to comply with the above requirements and bring the property into compliance. This is the only notification you will receive for the year beginning April 1, 2004 through April 1, 2005.

Should the owner or occupant fail to comply in accordance to the Ordinance within ten days and maintain the property for the rest of the year in compliance with the Ordinance, the City may choose to remove all said nuisances from the property. The expense of doing such work or having such work done, will be assessed to the property owner and a lien will be placed upon the property for all expenses incurred. Additionally, the violation noted above is a misdemeanor under the Ordinance and charges in municipal court may be filed against the owner and occupant for each violation.
