

Panthers Outgun Gustine: Huckabay Tourney Next

The Gorman Panther basketball team traveled to Gustine on November 21st for the first varsity game following an extended football season and came away with a 74-55 victory. Gorman jumped out to a 20-12 lead at the end of the first period, but trailed 33-32 at the halftime mark. But in the third quarter the Big Red popped in 26 points to just 8 for Gustine and had a 58-41 lead at the end of three. In the fourth period the teams played on even terms with Gorman edging Gustin 15 to 14 for the victory.

Gorman hit 21 of 43 two point shots and added 7 of 16 three pointers for a 47% field goal percentage and hit 11 of 20 free throws for 55%. They out-rebounded Gustine 36 to 30 and had 13 turnovers and 16 assists.

Donald Majors led the Panthers with 21 points and 8 rebounds, Jason Posey hit 17; Nic Burselon hit 9 and had 7 rebounds; Ronald Majors had 7 points; Justin Burlson hit 5 points; Nick Guthery had 4 points and 5 rebounds; Justin Snider hit 4 points and had 7 rebounds; Margarito Sanchez had 5 points and Marco Herrera hit 2 points and had 4 assists.

Scotty Walton Completes Mechanic Training

Marine Lance Cpl. Scotty R. Walton, son of Ronnie R. and Brenda K. Walton of Route 1, Desdemona, Texas, recently completed 12 weeks of aircraft mechanic training at Marine Corps Air Station cherry Point, N.C.

Walton was one of several enlisted Marines who attended the AV-8B Harrier aircraft structures mechanic organizational maintenance training given by instructors at marine Attack Training Squadron 203.

Walton learned all about hte structure and hydraulics of the Harrier, which include power generating systems, engine services, warning systems, flight controls, landing gear and instrumentation. Walton also studied varius aspects of testing and troubleshooting maintenance on the Harrier.

Walton learned the details of aircraft launch and recovery, inspection and servicing, and repair of the engine and fuel system. He also spent several weeks training to disassemble, assemble and inspect the Harrier's Rolls Royce engine. The Marine Corp's AV-8B Harrier is a single-engine strike fighter used to escort helicopters, conduct close-combat air support and fly offensive missions against enemy ground-to-air defenses. With a one-man crew, the Harrier is capable of vertical short takeoffs and landings from amphibious assault ships and unimproved small landing areas.

The 1994 graduate of Gorman High School of Gorman, Texas, joined the Marine Corps in November 1994.



## CJC To Offer Defensive Driving Course Dec. 11 - 13


