2004 Peanut Producer Tour Set for September 2nd

Cross Timbers peanut Producers will come together, Thursday, September 2nd for the 2004 peanut Producer Tour. The Peanut Producer Tour will start with registration at 9 a.m. at the City Auditorium in DeLeon and will leave at 9:30 a.m. and return to DeLeon City Auditorium for a sponsored lunch. The Peanut Tour will include two continuing education credits for private and commercial pesticide applicators. To pre-register please contact the Texas Cooperative Extension office in Comanche at 325/356-2539.

The Peanut Producer Tour will feature four well known speakers on the subject of peanuts. Dr. Charles Simpson will be on the tour to discuss peanut variety work conducted all over Texas and what impact this will have on Central Texas peanut production. Dr. Chip Lee, Extension Plant Pathologist, will address concerns growers have with controlling soil-borne diseases plus the possibility of outbreaks of sclerotinia blight with cool, rainy weather. Chip will also discuss the problems growers are having with leafspot and what plans to make for this fall.

Dr. Todd Baughman, State Extension Peanut Agronomist, will address and discuss variety performance and weed control from demonstrations conducted throughout Texas. Dr. Ken Stokes, Extension Economist—Stephenville, will give an update on the economics of growing peanuts and forecast what growers can expect with increased demand for peanut products.

The Gorman City Commission met on the above date. Those present were Mayor Robert Ervin, Mayor Pro-Tem Nathan Files, Commissioners Durward Webb, Joe Casey, and Charlie Torre. Others present: Carey Campbell, Abel Saldana, Lori Dodd, Emmitt Lasater, Tim Dennis, Rob and Carolyn Grogan, Brad Kuykendall (BFI), and Josh Constanancio from Community Sanitation.

Opening prayer was led by Nathan followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and the Texas Pledge. Mayor Ervin called the meeting to order at 5:31 p.m.

Nathan made the motion to approve the minutes as read, Joe made a second. The motion carried 4-0.

Joe made a motion to approve the bills for payment. Durward made a second. Motion carried 4-0.

Under Citizens Input: The Grogans were present to dispute water usage charges due to a faulty water meter.

Reports were provided from all department heads.

Durward made a motion to amend the Water/Sewer Capital Expense budget \$2500 each for the purchase of the backhoe. Charlie

made a second. The motion carried 4-0.

Nathan made a motion to contribute \$50 to the Peanut Festival as was done last year. Joe made a second. The motion carried 4-0. This motion, the same as last year, was for each Commissioner to contribute \$10 out of his own pocket. Emmitt Lasater also put in \$10.

Lori Dodd was present to report that Robert Ervin will resign from the EDC Board at the end of his term, the end of August. Someone from the Commission needs to be on the board. This item is to be put on next agenda.

BFI and Community Sanitation both came a personally presented their bids. This item will also be decided on the next meeting.

Nathan will meet with the City Employees next week to give them an option before the TML Interlocal Agreement/Resolution is passed. This resolution concerns the employee health benefits.

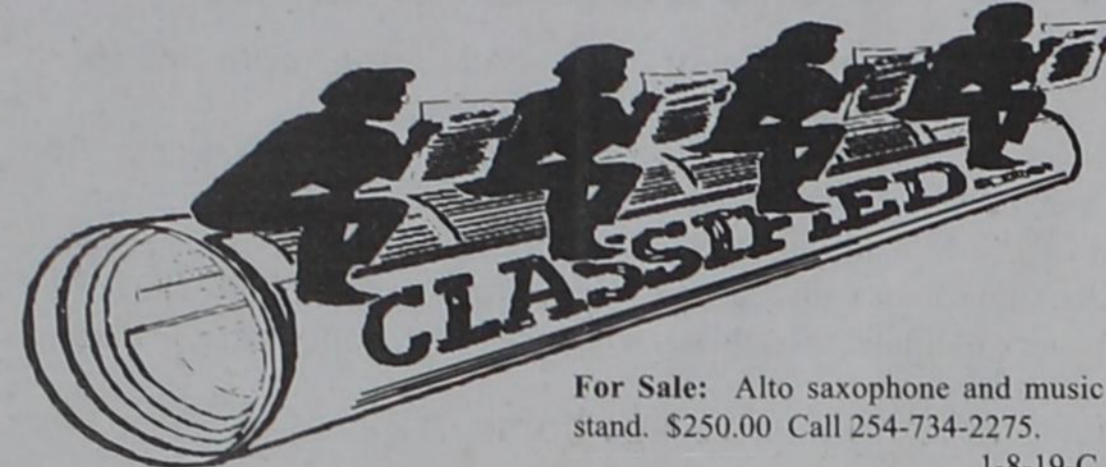
Nathan made a motion to sign and adopt the Resolution: Adoption of the Hazard Mitigation Action Plan. Durward made a second and the motion carried 4-0.

Charlie made a motion to go out of Executive and back into Regular Session at 7:22 p.m. Durward made a second. The motion carried 4-0.

Nathan made the motion to hire a part-time police officer for no more than 16 hrs/wk @\$8/hr. and to begin looking for someone to fill that position. Durward made a second. The motion carried 4-0.

There being no further business for discussion, Charlie made a motion to adjourn. Nathan made a second. The motion carried 4-0. Time was 7:25 p.m.

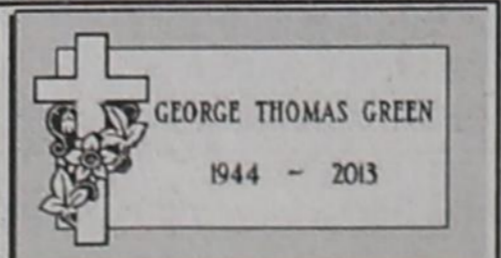

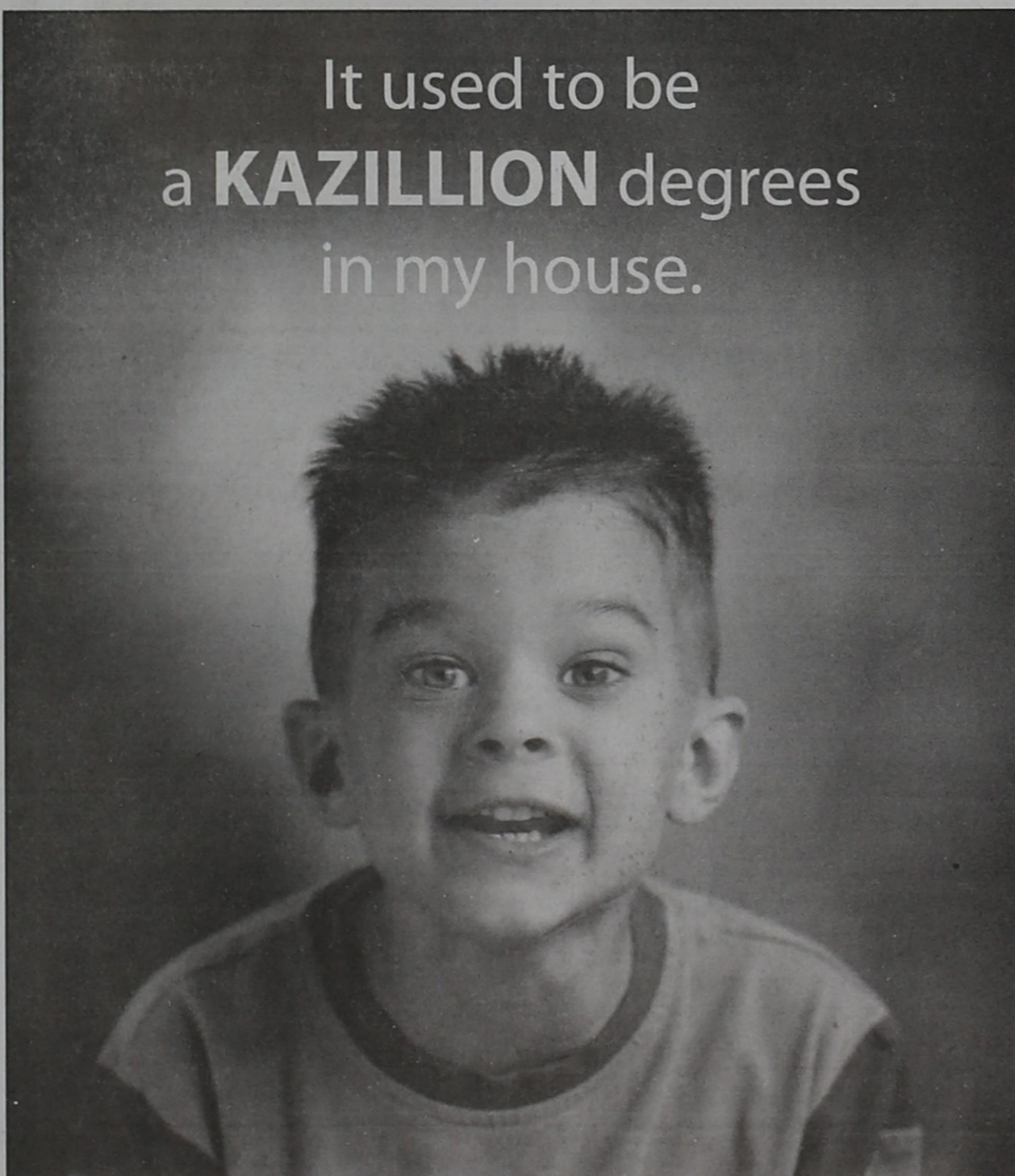
