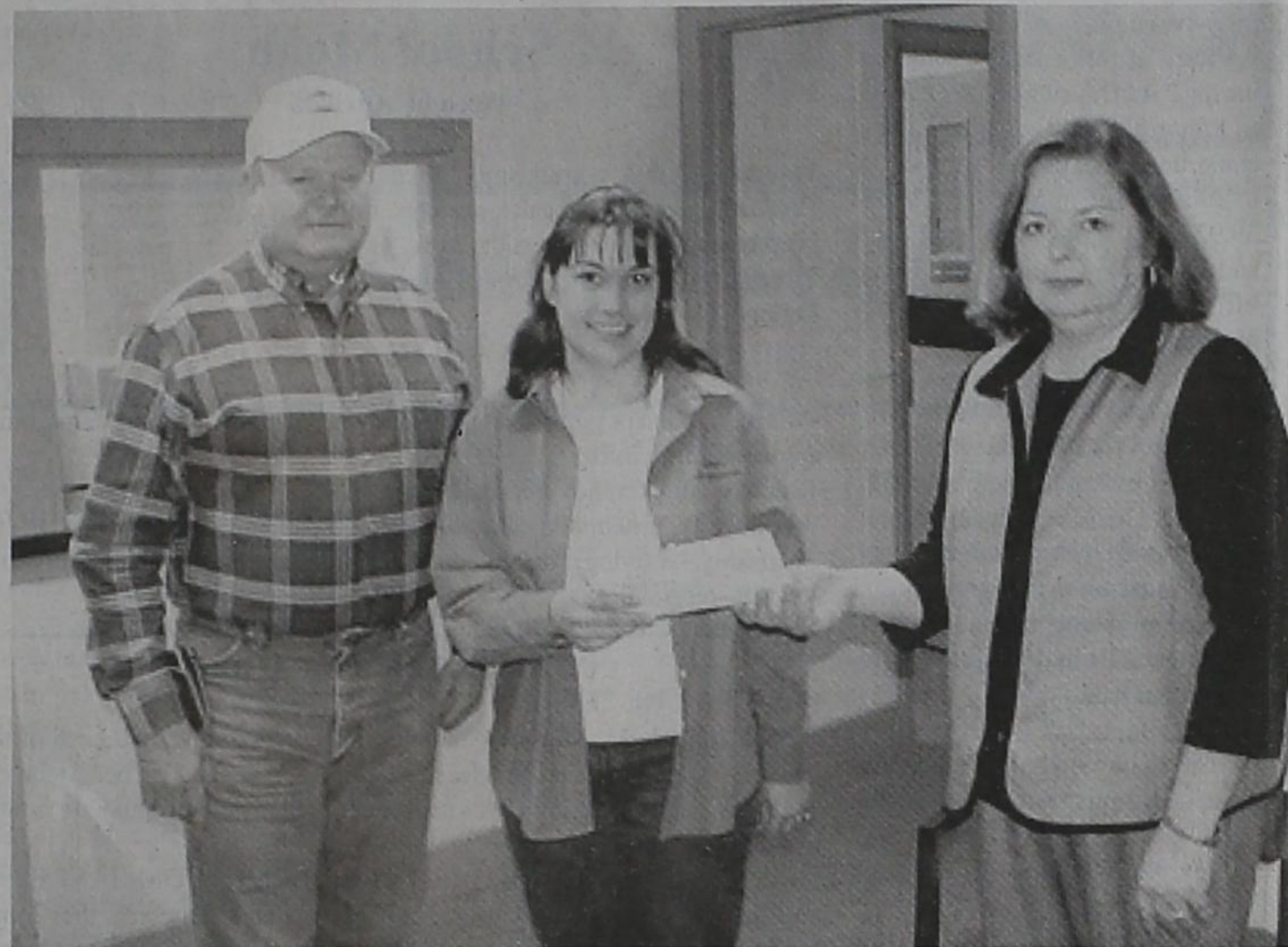

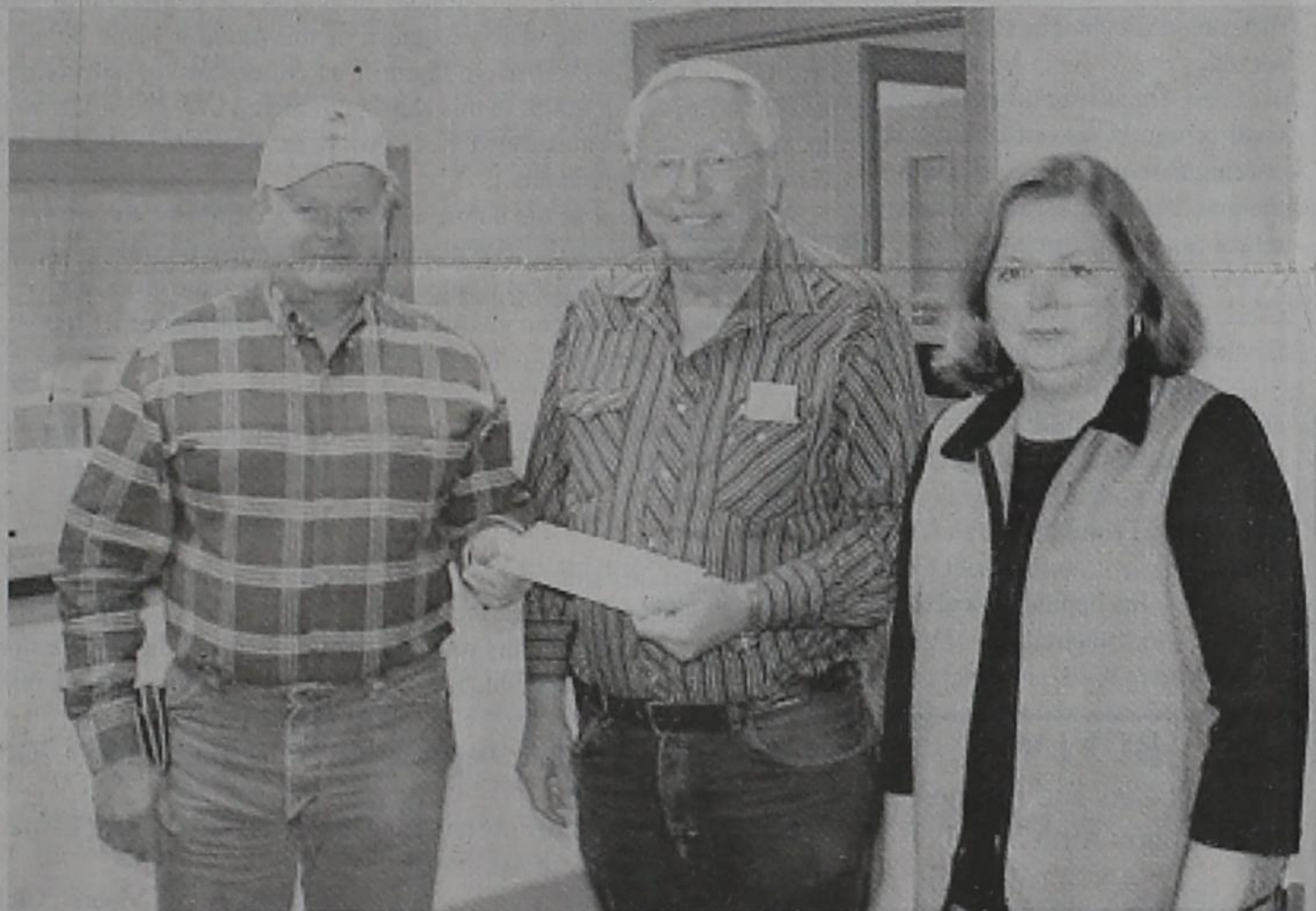
## Birdsong Makes Donations To Gorman Area Organizations

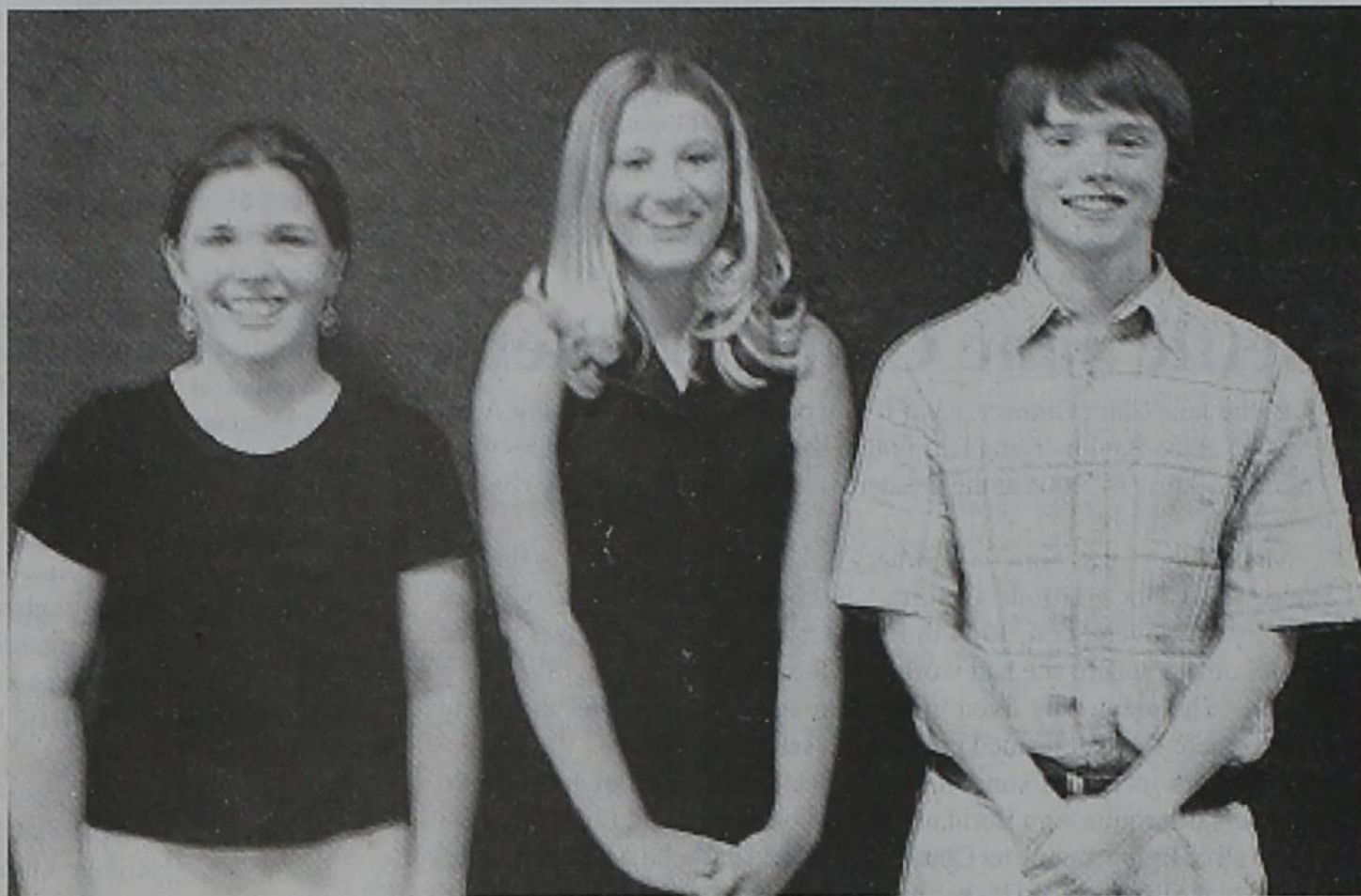

## Comanche Electric Announces 2005 Youth Tour Winners

Two area high school students have been selected to represent Comanche Electric Cooperative in the 2005 Government-In-Action Youth Tour. Ashlee Hornback and Lance Pyburn were chosen by a panel of independent judges in a speech contest held Wednesday, April 13<sup>th</sup> at Comanche High School. This year's topic was: "What America Means To Me." They will join students from across the state of Texas in June for a day to get acquainted before flying off on a 10 day all-expense-paid trip to our nation's Capitol.

The Youth Tour is the second largest "grassroots" event of cooperative members that takes place in Washington, D.C., second only to the NRECA legislative conference held each year in May. For some, the Youth Tour is their first experience away from home. For many, it is their first trip to Washington where they have the opportunity to see our nation's history come alive. For students this year, the trip is more than seeing monuments and going to museums, it is about being a part of history - the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Youth Tour.

This trip is an opportunity for high school students to experience our country's national treasures, see our leaders in action and discuss the issues of the day with their congressmen and senators. Students also learn about the electric utility industry and the impact it has on our country.

## Early Voting Clerk Appointment Clarification

The past few weeks a number of questions have been raised concerning the appointment of election officials for the school board elections to be held in May. The GISD Board of Trustees has appointed G. W. Maxfield as the election judge and Bob Powell as the assistant. The most recent controversy revolves around the appointment of Terry Treadway as the Early Voting Clerk because she was a school employee.

The following information will clarify the District is in compliance with the Texas Election Code. Section 83.006(b)(2) of the code states, "in an election in which an officer of the political subdivision is a candidate, an appointee's status as an employee of the political subdivision does not make the appointee ineligible for appointment as the clerk..."

The Lady Panthers started off like they meant business by scoring two runs in the 1<sup>st</sup> and 1 run in the top of the third to take a 3-0 lead. After retiring six of the first 7 batters, the Lady Panthers struggled in the bottom of the third by giving up 4 Ranger runs. The Lady Panthers answered in the 5<sup>th</sup> inning after both teams were scoreless in the 4<sup>th</sup>. Gorman put up 3 runs in that 5<sup>th</sup> inning, but Ranger answered in the bottom half by scoring 3 of their own. Determined to win the Lady Panthers scored 2 more in the top of the 6<sup>th</sup> and then held Ranger scoreless in the bottom half to bring the score to 8-7 in favor of Gorman going into the 7<sup>th</sup> and final inning.
