Proclamation By The County Judge of Eastland County

TO ALL WHO THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

WHEREAS, a petition has been filed with Eastland County calling for an election to allow the legal sale of all alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption only within the corporate limits of the City of Cisco, Eastland County, Texas;

WHEREAS, after the said petition had been certified, the Commissioners Court of Eastland County, Texas on June 12, 2006 called for an election on November 7, 2006 to determine the issue;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, BRAD STEPHENSON, COUNTY JUDGE OF EASTLAND COUNTY, TEXAS, under the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Statutes of the State of Texas, do hereby order an election to be held in Eastland County on Tuesday, November 7, 2006 for the purpose of determining the issues of whether or not the legal sale of all alcohol beverages for off-premise consumption only (la venta legal de todas bebidas alcoholicas para consumo solamente fuera del establecimiento) within the corporate limits of the City of Cisco, Eastland County, Texas.

Early voting by personal appearance shall begin on October 23, 2006 and end on November 3, 2006 at the Eastland County Courthouse, 100 West Main Street, Eastland, Eastland County, Texas.

Voting on Election Day will be conducted at the American State Bank Community Room, 428 Conrad Hilton, Cisco, Eastland County, Texas.

A copy of this order will be posted on the bulletin board designated by the Commissioners Court of Eastland County for posting public notices and attached to the Official Minutes of said Commissioners Court, and all appropriate writs will be issued and all proper proceedings will be followed to the end that said election may be held to fill the vacancies so noted and its result proclaimed in accordance with law.

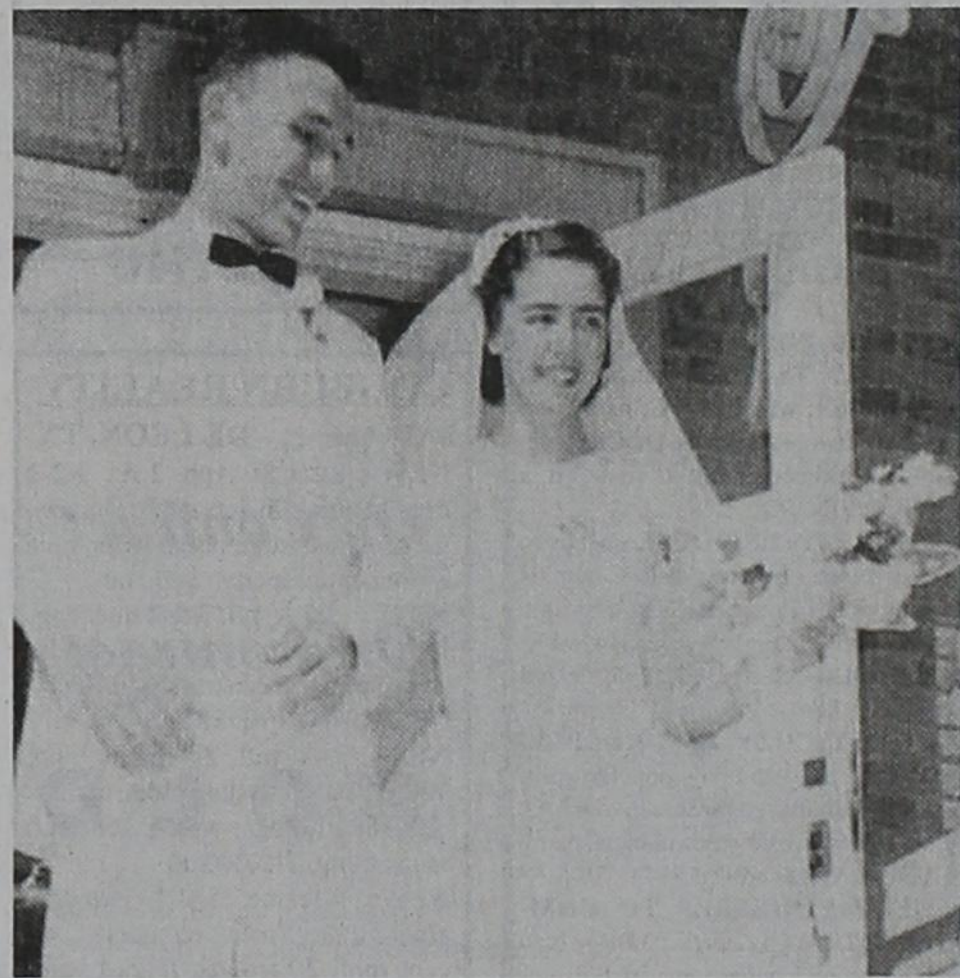

Bobby Dwayne Goodall Get 15 Year Prison For 5 Grams of Meth

Bobby Dwayne Goodall, 41, a former resident of Ft. Worth, was sentenced to (15) fifteen years confinement in the Texas Department of Criminal Justice - Institutional Division by 91st District Court Judge Steven Herod after entering a plea of guilty to the offense of Possession of a Controlled Substance, Methamphetamine, four grams or more but less than two hundred grams. Goodall was stopped on Interstate 20 for speeding when a Texas State Trooper noticed a glass pipe commonly used for smoking methamphetamine laying in the passenger seat. DPS personnel weighed the substance found in the vehicle at approximately 5.4 grams.

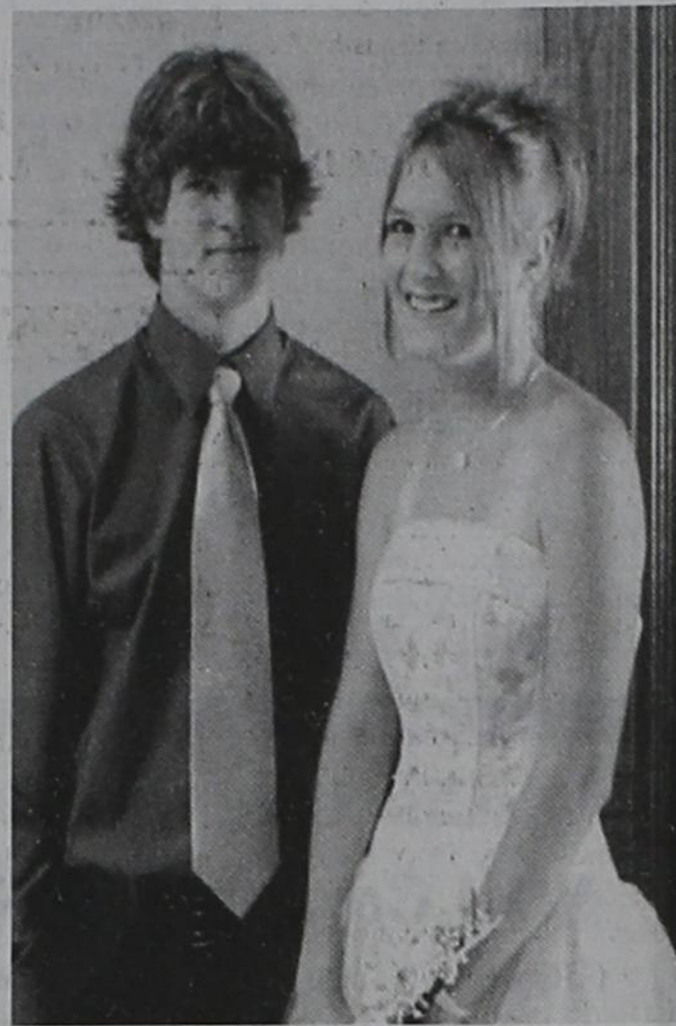

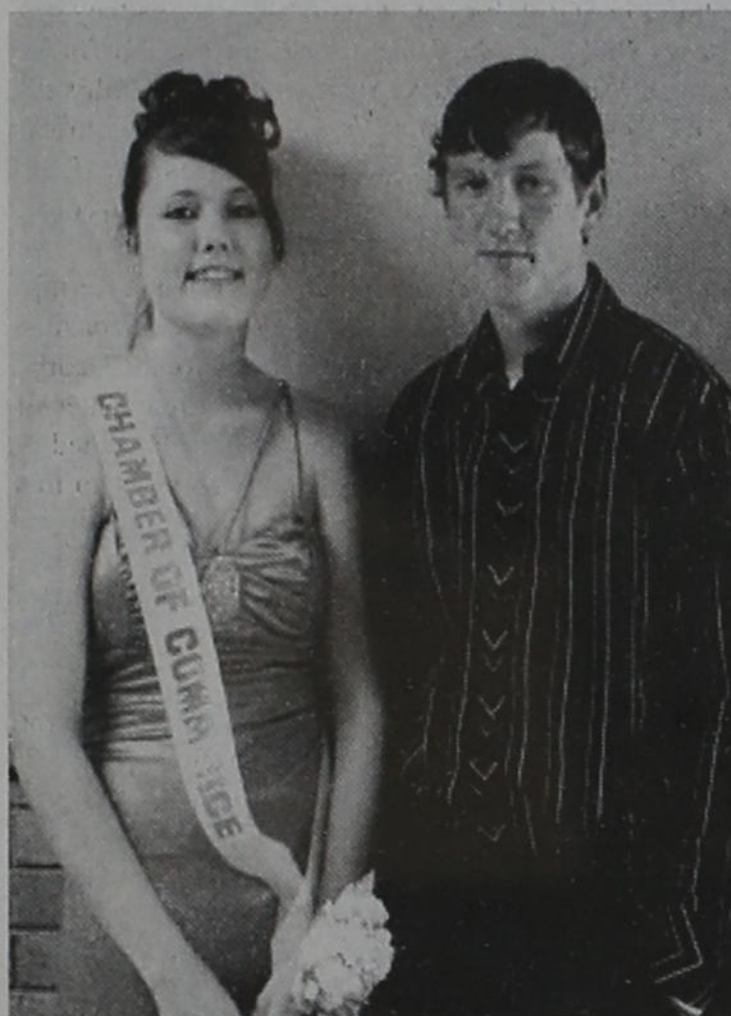

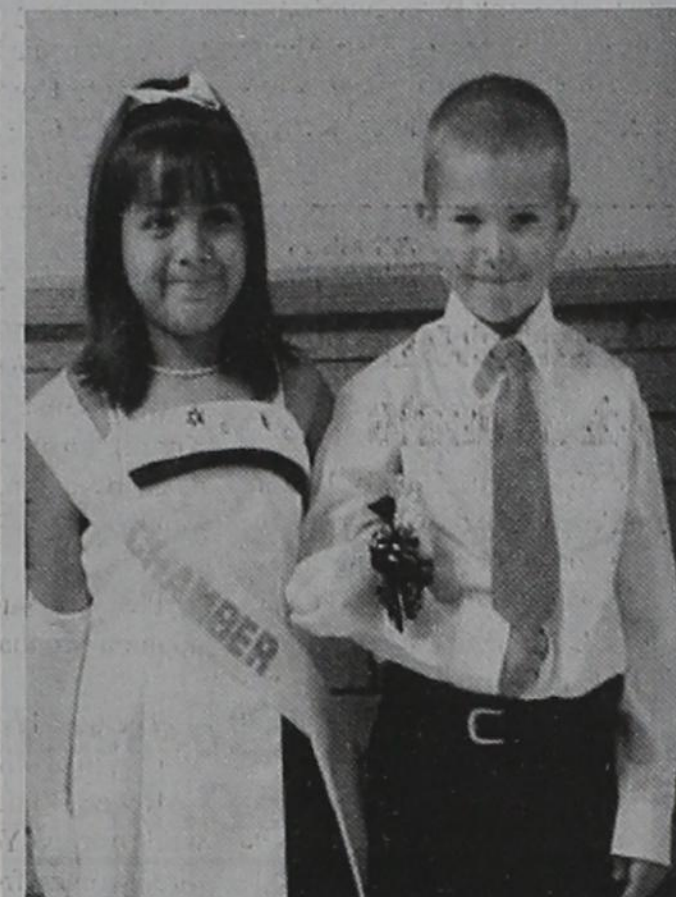

Big Country Dinner Theatre To Present "SMILE"

The Big Country Dinner Theatre at the Hilton in Cisco, Texas will present SMILE, with music by Marvin Hamlisch and book by Howard Ashman, beginning on June 29 through July 22. Dinner on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday begins at 6:00 and the performance begins at 7:00; Sunday matinees are at 2:00 with dessert only. Tickets are \$20.00 for dinner and theatre and \$10.00 for the Sunday matinee performances with dessert.

The Big Country Dinner Theatre is produced by Cisco Junior College in cooperation with the Hilton in Cisco, Texas. Conrad Hilton began his career as "Innkeeper to the World" when he purchased his first hotel, the Mobley, in Cisco, Texas in 1919. Now, completely renovated and adapted for reuse, this memorial park and community center was opened to the public after its dedication in October, 1986. This year marks the 20th anniversary of the renovation. The Hiltons will be in attendance at a performance of SMILE and a special Twentieth Anniversary Celebration will be held in honor of the Hiltons.

According to Billy Smith, the

Teen PSA Contest Aimed At Raising Awareness About Meningococcal

Meningococcal (me-nin-je-kok-ul) disease is a serious illness caused by bacteria that can infect the blood or areas around the brain and spinal cord. Infection can lead to brain damage, disability, and rapid death. Even if treated, 10-14% of people who get meningococcal disease will die from it. Of the survivors, 11-19% lose their arms or legs, become deaf or brain damaged, or suffer other complications.

College students living in dormitories are more likely to get the meningococcal disease than other college and university students as a whole. To educate college freshmen, the California Distance Learning Health Network (CDLHN) is spreading the word about the importance of meningococcal vaccination.

CDLHN is inviting teens between the ages of 15-19 to submit an original Public Service Announcement (PSA) that will encourage "dorm-bound" college freshmen to get their vaccine. We have created a web page highlighting the disease, prevention measures, and details about the Teen PSA contest.


We are encouraging high school seniors and college-aged teens to create their own 30 second PSA on meningococcal disease prevention and submit it to us.
