Acreage Reporting

Acreage reporting time is here. Filing an accurate acreage report for all crops and land uses, including failed acreage and prevented planting acreage, can prevent the loss of benefits for most programs.

Failed acreage must be reported within 15 calendar days of the disaster event and before disposition of the crop. Prevented planting must be reported no later than 15 calendar days after the final planting date.

Acreage reports are required for many Farm Service Agency programs. For crops other than NAP (Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program) crops, acreage reports are to be certified by the May 1 deadline on small grains and July 15 on spring seeded crops.

Farmers can elect and enroll in the Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) program beginning April 27, 2009. ACRE is a provision of the 2008 Farm Bill.

Producers have until Aug.14, 2009, to make their decision for the 2009 crop. USDA will not accept any late-filed applications.

Producers who elect the ACRE program for a farm agree to:


- forgo counter-cyclical payments;

- accept a 20-percent reduction of the direct payments; and
- accept a 30-percent reduction in loan rates for all commodities produced on the farm.

Commodities eligible for ACRE payments are wheat, corn, grain sorghum, barley, oats, upland cotton, long grain rice, medium and short grain rice, peanuts, soybeans, sunflower seed, canola, flaxseed, safflower, mustard seed, rapeseed, sesame seed, crambe, dry peas, lentils, small chickpeas and large chickpeas.

The ACRE program was created in the 2008 Farm Bill to give producers an option in lieu of traditional counter-cyclical payments. Producers may elect and enroll in ACRE for the 2009 crop year even if they have already accepted advance direct payments under the Direct and Countercyclical Program.

To elect ACRE for a farm, producers must complete Form CCC-509 ACRE, which irrevocably elects ACRE for the farm through crop year 2012. Form CCC-509, the contract to participate in ACRE, must then be completed each year the producer intends to participate and receive benefits.

Wildfire Assistance from USDA

Cattle owners that lost livestock in the wildfires may be eligible for a Livestock Indemnity Program (LIP) from the USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA). Proper documentation of deceased animals will be needed to participate in this program.

Producers that have purchased insurance through FSU's Noninsured (rop Disaster Essistance Program (VLP) may be eligible for fire losses on pasture or cropland. You must file a notice of loss within 15 days of the disaster event.

Because of the existing drought situation, producers in affected counties can apply for low interest loans through FS1 farm loan programs that would help with outbuildings, farm structures, farm homes and fences.

Landowners can apply for possible financial assistance from the USD1 Natural Resources Conservation Service (VRCS) for range deferment and cross fencing al assistance. The NRCS can also help provide technical assistance that can reduce post-fire damage and aid in the rehabilitation process.

To find out more about these programs and assistance, landowners and livestock producers are encouraged to contact their MRCS and FS1 representatives at the USDA Service Center in Eastland County: 251-629-1636.

Eastland Co. Judge Reports On Wildfire

Cedar Mountain Fire - What has been named the Cedar Mountain Fire has been stopped. Once again, our Emergency Responders have stepped up and prevented what could have been a tragedy for 65+ homes.

The fire burned from north of Cisco to north of Morton Valley, a distance of about 11 miles west to east and about 4 miles wide. According to the Texas Forest Service, about 18,500 acres burned. With the high winds Thursday afternoon, no air support was available until Friday morning. This fire had to be fought the old way, on the ground with brush trucks, tankers, transport water trucks, graders and dozers. Each piece of apparatus had to be staffed and most of these people are volunteers, giving of their time and own resources to prevent tragedy.

Every fire department in Eastland County was at the scene. Many fire departments from outside our county responded as their own fires allowed them to do so. Food and water were provided for two days by volunteers and the Red Cross. Law enforcement got the word out to residents to evacuate. TV dot kep the highways closed for safety. The Texas Forest Service finally got spotter aircraft and helicopters on the scene early on Friday morning in addition to operating TFS dozers in countless areas for many hours. Hearing that rotor sound and seeing the water drops from the air will always be in my memory.

Other state agencies, local businesses, and just people walking up to the Command Center were working to get us what we needed. The Hobile Command Center was sent to (R 33) and TA Hwy 112 where it became the emergency operations center (EDC) and home of the Responders and volunteers for the next two days. Fueling, water resupply, and food needs were met at the EDC. The EDC was also the forward communication point for radio traffic and fire assignments. Late Friday, the fire was contained and under control enough to demobilize the EOC and send the exhausted Responders home.

Saturday, a DPS aircraft took Eastland Fire (hief Arther into the sky to see if any hotspots were active. I fire was spotted near the canyons noth of (R 133 and fire fighters were able to get estimguished. With the good rain on Easter morning, no active fires were reported.

I talked to Heath Begeman, Texas AgriLife Extension Agent about the agriculture losses. He is working with state agencies on fencing repairs and hay resources to assist the 10+ farms and ranches affected by this fire. Mr. Begeman can be contacted at 251-629-2222 if you have a need or want to help.

It is an enduring testimony to the emergency response groups that a fire of this size was not allowed to destroy even one home or take anyone's life. On firefighter from Rising Star was injured. He is still in the bospital with a hip injury and he will be there for a few more days; please keep him in your pravers.


