

"On The Wilder Side"

On my first day of class in the Harding School of Biblical Studies, a program designed specifically for those who are going back to school to become full time ministers, a teacher said something to us that I will never forget. The teacher was Jimmy Allen who had been teaching Bible at Harding University for over 50 years and baptized literally thousands throughout his preaching career. The class was Acts of the Apostles at 8:00 am. As brother Allen looked through a small classroom filled with nervous, yet eager soon to be preachers he said the following: "If you can drive a city bus or a garbage truck, if you can work at a factory, if you can be a doctor, if you can dig ditches, if you can do anything other than preach, you should leave now."

At that point I was thinking what you're probably thinking: "What kind of welcome speech is this? That's not very encouraging is it?" As a matter of fact, I had quit my job at the factory so I could join that particular training program... and I could dig a ditch pretty well also; so I was starting to get pretty discouraged.

Brother Allen continued, "If you can do anything else, you should leave now... but... If you have a fire in your bones that just can't be put out; if like Isaiah, God's word is on your lips as burning coal and you just have to get it off; if like Paul, you are filled with such inexpressible joy that you've just got to share it with others... Then you are in the right place." Jimmy's point was this: Ministry is the hardest, most taxing, and emotionally draining commitment you will ever make... and he was absolutely right.

I've learned by first hand that it is impossible to encourage others if you yourself are discouraged. I strongly exhort you to encourage the ministers, elders, deacons, and teachers whom you know that serve God well.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GORMAN, TEXAS ("CITY") APPROVING NEW RATES FOR ATMOS ENERGY CORP., MID-TEX DIVISION ("ATMOS MID-TEX" OR "COMPANY") IN RESPONSE TO THE COMPANY'S THIRD RATE REVIEW MECHANISM ("RRM") FILING IN ALL CITIES EXERCISING ORIGINAL JURISDICTION; DECLARING EXISTING RATES TO BE UNREASONABLE; ADOPTING TARIFFS THAT REFLECT JUST AND REASONABLE RATES; EXTENDING THE RRM PROCESS FOR TWO CYCLES AND ADOPTING A NEW RRM TARIFF, INCLUDING COST RECOVERY FOR A STEEL SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENT PROGRAM; ADOPTING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; DETERMINING THAT THIS ORDINANCE WAS PASSED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE TEXAS OPEN MEETINGS ACT; DECLARING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND REQUIRING DELIVERY OF THIS ORDINANCE TO THE COMPANY

SEPTEMBER 2, 2010

The Gorman City Commission met on the above date. Those present were Mayor Robert Ervin, Commissioners Durward Webb, Nathan Files, Joe Casey, and David Stanley. Others present were Chief Barbara Fenley, Glenn Scitem, Hilda Lara, Terry Denson, Jessie Garcia and Robert Reed.

The Pledge of Allegiance the Texas Pledge followed the opening prayer.

Mayor Ervin called the meeting to order @ 5:30 p.m.

David made the motion to approve the minutes of the previous regular meeting. Joe made a second. Motion carried 4-0.

After discussion of the bills, David made the motion to approve for payment with a second from Nathan. Motion carried 4-0.

Hilda Lara was present for Citizens In Put. Hilda felt that she was being harassed by the police department and not being treated fairly by the Judge. Hilda explained some of her concerns to the Commission.

Terry Denson was present to talk with the Commission about the possibility of getting water from Gorman to Desdemona.

On New and Old Business the Golf Cart / ATV issues was tabled again for the next meeting. The Commission decided to place the property on the West edge of town on Highway 6 up for sale. Nathan made a motion to this decision with a second from Joe.

Jessie Garcia and Robert Reed were present on behalf of Atmos Energy. Atmos is requesting Consideration of an ordinance/resolution to approve Atmos Energy Rate Review Mechanism extension, rate increase and recovery of steel service line replacement program costs. Mr. Garcia explained the request to the Commission and answered questions and concerns of the Commission. At this time the 1st reading of this ordinance was held.

Glenn and Barbara were present as department heads for oral reports. The Chief reported hiring Danny Morgan. His first day will be Saturday Sept. 4. Barbara reported the number of citations issued for the month of August. Glenn gave the measurements of the sewer jet hose, and reported the cost of a flow meter is approximately \$800. He is still trying to contact the company that rebuilds fire hydrants. The Judge had submitted a written report.

The 2nd reading of Ordinance #2010-04 Municipal Court Bldg. Security Fund, was read at this time. David made the motion to pass, approve and adopt said ordinance. Nathan made a second to the motion. Motion carried 4-0.

Upon considering the budget amendment from the City audit Durward made the motion to amend the Street personnel budget to the Water and Sewer portion of the System's budget. Joe made a second. Motion carried 4-0.

The 2nd reading of the Ad Valorem Taxes Ordinance was read at this time. David made the motion to pass approve and adopt said ordinance. Nathan made a second. Motion carried 4-0.

There being no further agenda items for consideration, Nathan made the motion to adjourn with a second from David. Motion carried, time was 7:25 p.m.

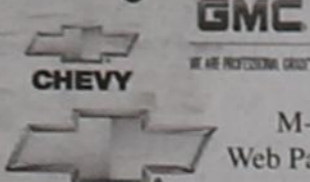

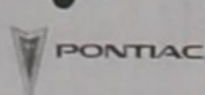
