
NUMBER TWO Farm Service Agency Disaster Program Sign up Begins Jan. 10, 2011

On Wednesday morning, January 5th, Bonnie Floyd, 61, was fishing from a boat at Lake Leon. Bonnie fell from the boat. She hung onto a nearby stump for support while waiting for help to arrive. Eastland County Dispatch was contacted and deployed Eastland Fire Department rescue to the scene.

Texas Highway Patrol Troopers Tim Pitts, John Martinez and Vernon Gaines also repsoned to the call. The troopers found the woman barely holding on. Ms. Floyd told the troopers she was about to loose her grip and could not hold on any longer. She advisted she had been in the cold water for about 30 minutes.

Trooper Tim Pitts swam out to the woman to assist her. Because of Trooper Pitts efforts, Bonnie Floyd was able to hold on until the Eastland Fire Department Rescue Boat arrived. She was transported to Eastland Memorial Hospital and was suffering from Hyperthermia.

Trooper Tim Pitts went home, changed clothes and went back to work.

Donald V. Estes, 95, of Gorman, passed away Saturday, January 8, 2011 in Gorman. Funeral Services will be held at 2 P.M. Wednesday at the First Baptist Church in Eastland with Lyndell Garrett officiating. Burial will follow in the Eastland City Cemetery directed by Edwards Funeral Home of Eastland. The family will receive friends at the funeral home on Tuesday, 6~8 P.M.

Mr. Estes was born on January 15, 1915 in Topeka, Kansas to Cleveland and Estella Estes. He started a career in Auctioneering at age 17. Donald came to Texas in 1939 and worked for Ross Bros. Horse and Mule Co. of Fort Worth.

Salman Taseer, Governor of the Punjab province in Pakistan, was shot to death by Mumtaz Qadri, bodyguard to the Governor. Taseer was a moderate voice in a country boiling with fundamentalist Islamism. He had spoken out against the harsh blasphemy laws in Pakistan. His murderer boasts abbut what he has done, and he is being praised by the radical elements threatening to take over the government. in Pakistan.

The account of this event appeared on page 6A in the Abilene Reporter-News. Americans, more interested in the Rose Bowl football game, have shown little interest in Pakistan except to criticize the Pakistans for not helping us more in our fight in Afghanistan.

Our lack of interest in the Pakistan people has bee made evident in three major events there. A few years ago an earthquake trapped many of these people in the mountains; their children died, freezing, starving, and diseased. We could have sent enough helicopters from Iraq and Afghanistan to rescue them. But we didn't.

Benazir Bhutto, representing a new hope for Pakistan, sought out help in the form of protection, when she returned a year or two ago. We didn't protect her, and she was killed.

Last year the flooding of the Indus River drove more than a million Pakistanis from their home. I urged U.S. help, and my suggestion of diverting our forces in Afghanistan for rescue efforts in the flooded area was ignored.

Now we are giving Pakistan two billion dollars for military aid in helping us fight the Taliban in Afghanistan and using Pakistan as a hiding place. A revolution is taking place in Pakistan. The prese government will fall and the people who hate us will take over. With nuclear weapons.

Three strikes and we are out of luck in the Middle East.





A Little History Lesson On The First Mayor of Gorman

Funeral Services For J. W. Hammett Held At Slaton

John W. Hammett, age 78, died Monday afternoon, October 4, at 6:55 at the home of this son, Grover HAmmett, who lives six miles north of Stephenville and with whom he had made his home for the last seven months. The body was taken in a Higginbotham ambulance to Slaton where funeral services were conducted Wednesday morning at ten o'clock at the Weber Williams Funeral Home with a Baptist minister officiating. Interment was made in the Slaton Cemetery with the Masonic Lodge in charge.

John Wilson Hammett, who had been in ill health since November, 1936, having been bed fast the greater part of that time, was born in Macon County, Alabama, on September 12, 1859. At the age of 11 months he moved with his parents to Gordon County, Georgia, where he lived for a number of years. On February 1, 1880, he was married to Miss Isabell Shown.

They came to Texas, arriving in De Leon on November 19, 1891, where they made their home for nine years. From De Leon, he moved with his family to Gorman, making his home there for seven years. Mr. Hammett was the first Mayor of Gorman and the Past Worshipful Master of the De Leon, Gorman and Desdemona Masonic Lodge.

The Hammett family next went to Lowell in western Erath County, where they lived for thirteen years. They then went to Slaton in 1920, where they resided until the death of MRs. Hammett on March 10, 1925. Since that time, Mr. Hammett had made his home with his children.

John Wilson Hammett became a Mason on October 1, 1881, at Tilton, Georgia, his membership being at Slaton at the time of his death. He also joined the Baptist Church in 1881.

Mr. Hammett was the father of eight children, one of who, Mrs. Maggie Orear, died at Crosbyton, January 16, 16, at the age of 21 years. Beside the seven children, he is survived by a brother in Slaton, one in Austinm two sisters in Gorman, fifteen grandchildren and six great grandchildren.

Surviving children are W. O. Hammett, Long Beach, California; S. G. Hammett, Stephenville; J. E. Hammett, Slaton; Mrs. W. O. Kinnison, Sweetwater; Mrs. T. J. Cox, Carbon; Mrs. Bertha Hastings, Slaton and Mrs. V. S. Ford, Afton. (This article and photos was courtesy of Martha Harrington)




